- 860-405 [Lion Brand Vanna's Choice Yarn: Silver Heather](#)
1 Ball (A)
- 865-205 [Lion Brand Vanna's Palettes: Essential](#)
1 Ball (B)
- [Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size J-10 \(6 mm\)](#)
- [Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles \(Set of 6\)](#)

**Vanna's Choice® (Article #860). 100% Premium Acrylic*

400, 401, 403: 92% Acrylic, 8% Rayon
402: 96% Acrylic, 4% Rayon; package size: **Solids:** 3.5 oz (100 g), 170 yards (156 m)

Prints, Tweeds, & Heathers: 3 ozs (85 g), 145 yards (133 meters)

Twists: 2.5 oz (70 g), 121 yards (111 meters)

**Vanna's Palettes (Article #865). 100% Acrylic; package size: 0.35oz/10.00 gr. (17yds/16m) pull skeins*



GAUGE:

1 Square = about 3 x 3 in. (7.5 x 7.5 cm).

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

STITCH EXPLANATION:

3-dc Cl (3 double crochet cluster) Yarn over, insert hook in indicated stitch, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook (2 loops remain on hook) *yarn over, insert hook in the *same* stitch, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook* 2 times, yarn over, draw through all 4 loops on your hook.

NOTES:

1. 9 Squares are made for each Glove.
2. All B yarns are used in colors as desired. You can't make a wrong choice! All colors in the package work beautifully tog.
3. Squares are worked in joined rnds, with RS always facing.
4. Edging is worked around edges of each Glove.

SQUARES (make 18)

With B (color of your choice), ch 2.

Rnd 1 (RS): Work 8 sc in first ch; join with sl st in first sc.

Rnd 2: Ch 3, (yarn over, insert hook in same sc, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops) twice, yarn over, draw through all 3 loops on hook (tog with ch 3 counts as first 3-dc Cl), ch 2, *3-dc Cl in the next sc, ch 2; rep * 6 more times; join with sl st in top of beg ch – you will have eight 3-dc Cl and 8 ch-2 sps at the end of Rnd 1.

Fasten off.

Rnd 2: From RS, join new B (color of your choice) with a sl st in any ch-2 sp.

Ch 1, (3 sc, ch 2, 3 sc) in same ch-2 sp (corner made), 3 sc in next ch-2 sp, *(3 sc, ch 2, 3 sc) in next ch-2 sp (corner made), 3 sc in next ch-2 sp; rep from * 2 more times; join with sl st in top of first sc.

Fasten off.

Rnd 3: From RS, join A with a sl st in any ch-2 sp, 3 sc in same ch-2 sp, sc in each sc to next ch 2-sp, *3 sc in next ch-2 sp, sc in each sc to next ch 2-sp; rep from * 2 more times; join with sl st in top of first sc.

Fasten off.

FINISHING

Sew Squares tog into 6 strips of 3 Squares each. Sew 3 strips tog to make a large square. Sew remaining sides of large square tog, leaving about 1 1/2 in. (4 cm) open for thumb.

Rep with remaining squares to make 2nd Glove.

Thumb edging

From RS, join A with a sl st in any sc of thumb opening.

Rnd 1: Work 10 sc spaced evenly around thumb opening; join with sl st in first sc.

Rnds 2 and 3: Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc.

Fasten off.

Top edging

From RS, join A with a sl st in any sc at top edge of Glove (near the thumb opening).

Rnd 1: Ch 2 (does not count as a st), hdc in each st around; join with sl st in top of beg ch.

Fasten off.

Wrist edging

Work same as top edging around wrist edge of Glove.

Weave in ends.
