

 136-098 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Heartland Yarn: Acadia</u> 2 Balls

 Lion Brand Knitting <u>Needles- Size 9 [5.5</u> <u>mm]</u>

- Lion Brand Cable
  Needles (Set of 2)
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

\*<u>Heartland</u> (Article #136). **Solids:** 100% Acrylic **Tweeds:** 94% Acrylic, 6% Rayon; package size: **Solids:** 5oz/142g (251yd/230m)

Tweeds: 4oz/113g (200yd/183m)



## GAUGE:

16 sts + 22 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) in Lace and Cable pattern.

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

## STITCH EXPLANATION:

**2/2 RC (2 over 2 right cross)** Slip 2 sts to cable needle and hold in back, k2, then k2 from cable needle.

## sl2kp (slip 2-k1-pass slipped sts over)

A double decrease worked as follows:

1. Insert right needle into next 2 sts as if to knit them tog, and slip them from the left needle to the right needle.

2. Knit the next st.

3. With tip of left needle, lift the 2 slipped sts (the 2nd and 3rd sts on the right needle) up and over the knit st (first st on right needle) and off the needle - you have decreased 2 sts. **ssk (slip, slip, knit)** Slip next 2 sts as if to knit, one at a time, to right needle; insert left needle into fronts of these 2 sts and knit them tog - 1 st decreased. **yo (yarn over)** 

An increase that also creates a small decorative hole (eyelet) in the fabric, worked as follows:


1. Bring yarn to front, between the needles.

2. Take yarn to back, over the right needle. This creates the new st. You are now ready to proceed with the next st as instructed.

## NOTES:

1. Scarfie is worked in one piece in a Lace and Cable Pattern with a Garter st (k every row) border.

2. The Lace and Cable pattern can be worked by following the written instructions or reading the Chart. Read RS rows of Chart from right to left and WS rows from left to right.



## SCARFIE

Cast on 29 sts.

Knit 5 rows for Garter st (k every row) border.

## Lace and Cable Pattern

**Row 1 (RS):** K3, \*yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, 2/2 RC; rep from \* once more, yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k3 – you will have 29 sts at the end of this row.

Row 2: K3, purl to last 3 sts, k3.

Row 3: K3, \*k1, yo, sl2kp, yo, k5; rep from \* once more, k1, yo, sl2kp, yo, k4.

Row 4: Rep Row 2.

Rep Rows 1-4 for Lace and Cable pattern until piece measures about 59 in. (150 cm) from beg, end with a Row 4 as the last row you work.

Last Row of Lace and Cable Pattern (RS): K3, \*k5, 2/2 RC; rep from \* once more, k8.

Knit 5 rows for Garter st border. Bind off as if to knit.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.
