### Glitzy Striped Leg Warmers

Pattern Number: L40700

**SKILL LEVEL:** Easy (Level 2)

**SIZE:** One Size

**Finished Circumference** About 12 in. (30.5 cm), around upper edge

**Finished Length** About 18 in. (46 cm)

#### MATERIALS

- 861-153 Lion Brand Vanna's Glamour Yarn: Onyx  
1 Ball (A)

*\*Vanna's Glamour (Article #861). 96% Acrylic, 4% Metallic Polyester; package size: 1.75oz/49.61 gr. (202yds/185m) pull skeins*



- 860-108 Lion Brand Vanna's Choice Yarn: Dusty Blue  
1 Ball (B)

*\*Vanna's Choice® (Article #860). 100% Premium Acrylic*

- Brittany Birchwood Double Pointed Needles - Size 4
- Brittany Birchwood Double Pointed Needles - Size 5
- Lion Brand Split Ring Stitch Markers
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

*400, 401, 403: 92% Acrylic, 8% Rayon  
402: 96% Acrylic, 4% Rayon; package size: Solids: 3.5 oz (100 g), 170 yards (156 m)  
Prints, Tweeds, & Heathers: 3 ozs (85 g), 145 yards (133 meters)  
Twists: 2.5 oz (70 g), 121 yards (111 meters)*



#### GAUGE:

24 sts + 30 rnds = about 4 in. (10 cm) over St st worked in rnds (k every rnd) with larger needles.

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

#### STITCH EXPLANATION:

**ssk (slip, slip, knit)** Slip next 2 sts as if to knit, one at a time, to right needle; insert left needle into fronts of these 2 sts and knit them tog – 1 st decreased.

## PATTERN STITCH

**K2, p2 Rib worked in rnds (worked over a multiple of 4 sts)**

**Rnd 1:** \*K2, p2; rep from \* to end of rnd.

Rep Rnd 1 for K2, p2 Rib worked in rnds.

## NOTES:

1. Leg Warmers are knit in the rnd on double pointed needles changing yarn color following a stripe sequence.
2. Do not cut yarn between color changes, carry color not in use up WS of work until next needed.

## STRIPE SEQUENCE

**Rnds 1 and 2:** With A, knit.

**Rnd 3:** With B, knit.

Rep Rnds 1-3 for Stripe Sequence.

## LEG WARMERS (make 2)

With smaller needles and A, cast on 72 sts. Divide sts onto 4 needles with 18 sts on each needle. Place marker for beg of rnd and join by working the first st on the left hand needle with the working yarn from the right hand needle, being careful not to twist sts.

Work in K2, p2 Rib worked in rnds until piece measures about 3 in. (8 cm).

Change to larger needles and work in St st worked in rnds (k every rnd) following Stripe Sequence until piece measures 4 1/2 in. (11.5 cm) from beg.

**Dec Rnd:** K2tog, k to last 2 sts, ssk – 70 sts.

**Next 8 Rnds:** Knit, following Stripe Sequence.

Rep last 9 rnds 10 more times – 50 sts when all decreases have been completed.

Continue in Stripe Sequence until piece measures about 16 in. (40.5 cm) from beg.

Change to smaller needles.

Work in K2, p2 Rib worked in rnds for 2 in. (5 cm).

Bind off.

## FINISHING

Weave in ends.
