MATERIALS

- 860-110 Lion Brand Vanna's Choice

Yarn: Navy

5 Balls (A)

- 860-109 Lion Brand Vanna's Choice

Yarn: Colonial Blue

5 Balls (B)

- 860-102 Lion Brand Vanna's Choice

Yarn: Aqua

5 Balls (C)

- 860-105 Lion Brand Vanna's Choice

Yarn: Silver Blue

5 Balls (D)

- Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size H-

8 (5 mm)

- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt

Needles (Set of 6)

GAUGE:

16 sts = about 4 in. (10 cm) over Rows 1-4.

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

NOTES:

1. Blanket is made from 5 Strips sewn tog following diagram.
2. Each Strip is worked in wedge shaped sections. The wedges are shaped with sc, hdc, and dc sts.
3. Yarn color is changed on every other row to create stripes. To change yarn color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete st. Fasten off old color.



STRIP I (make 3)

First Wedge

With A, ch 34.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 10 ch, hdc in next 11 ch, dc in last 11 ch – you will have 33 sts.

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as first dc), turn, dc in next 10 dc, hdc in next 11 hdc, sc in last 11 sc.

Change to B.

Row 3: With B, ch 1, turn, sc in first 11 sc, hdc in next 11 hdc, dc in last 11 dc.

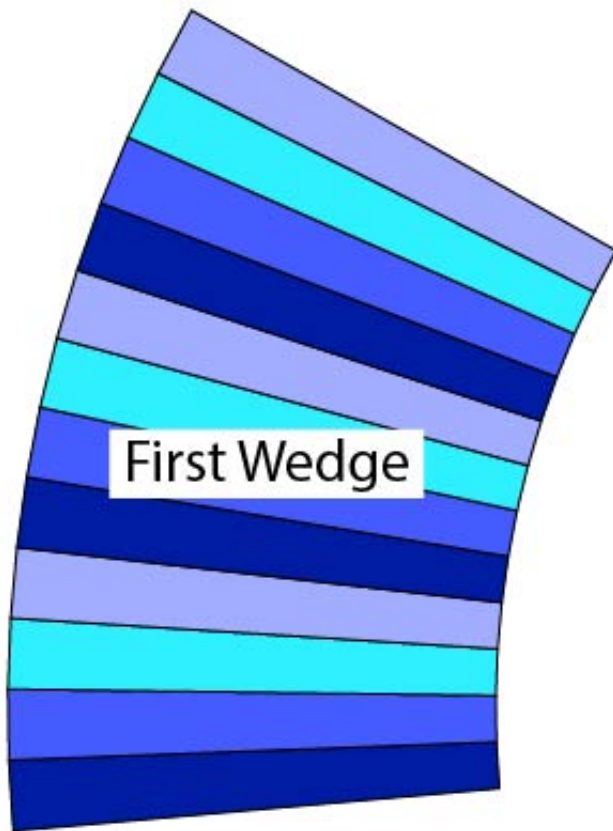
Row 4: With B, ch 3 (counts as first dc), turn, dc in next 10 dc, hdc in next 11 hdc, sc in last 11 sc.

Change to C.

Rows 5-24: Rows 3 and 4 ten times, changing color every other row as follows: work 2 rows with C, 2 rows with D, *2 rows with A, 2 rows with B, 2 rows with C and 2 rows with D; rep from * once more.

Fasten off.

Second Wedge

Row 1: Do not turn piece, join A with sl st in top of first dc (beg ch-3) on last row of previous wedge, ch 1, sc in same st as joining, sc in next 10 dc, hdc in next 11 hdc, dc in last 11 sc.

Rows 2-24: Rep Rows 2-24 of first wedge.

Fasten off.

Next 6 Wedges

Row 1: Do not turn piece, join A with sl st in top of first dc (beg ch-3) on last row of previous wedge (see diagram), ch 1, sc in same st as joining, sc in next 10 dc, hdc in next 11 hdc, dc in last 11 sc.

Rows 2-24: Rep Rows 2-24 of first wedge.

Fasten off.

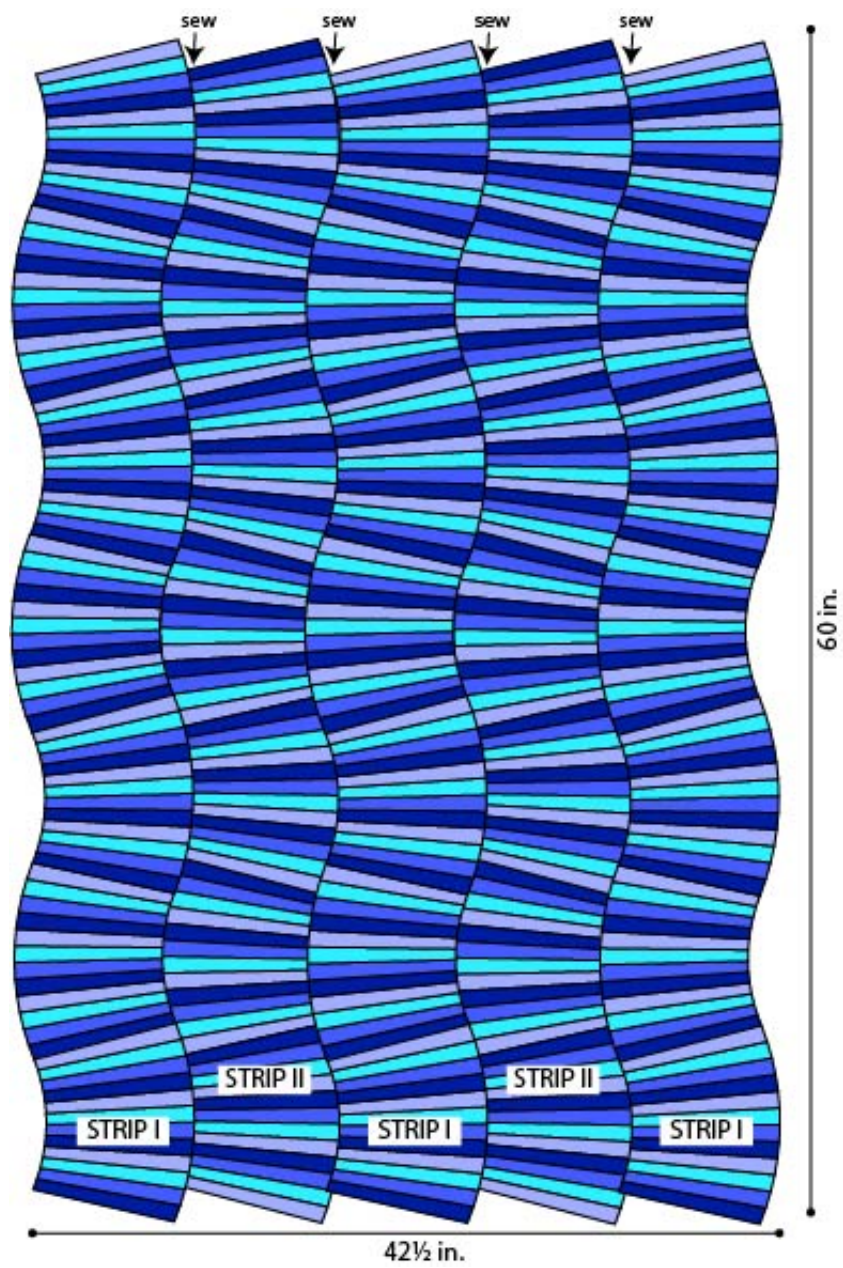
Rep Rows 1-24 until a total of 7 wedges have been made.

STRIP II (make 2)

Work same as Strip I, changing color as follows: *Work 2 rows with D, 2 rows with C, 2 rows with B, 2 rows with A; rep from * twice more.

FINISHING

Sew long, curved edges of Strips tog following Assembly Diagram. **Note:** The upper and lower edges will be uneven. Weave in ends.
