400, 401, 403: 92% Acrylic, 8% Rayon
402: 96% Acrylic, 4% Rayon; package size: **Solids:** 3.5 oz (100 g), 170 yards (156 m)

Prints, Tweeds, & Heathers: 3 ozs (85 g), 145 yards (133 meters)

Twists: 2.5 oz (70 g), 121 yards (111 meters)



GAUGE:

16 sts = about 4 in. (10 cm) in pattern of 11 sc, 11 hdc, and 11 dc.

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

NOTES:

1. Scarf is worked in striped wedge shaped sections. The wedges are shaped by working sc, hdc, and dc sts. The color is changed on every other row to make stripes.
2. When beg a new wedge, it is important to join yarn to the beg ch-3 of the previous wedge so that every other wedge leans in the opposite direction. A diagram is provided showing where to join.
3. To change yarn color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete the st. Fasten off old color.



SCARF

First Wedge

With A, ch 34.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 10 ch, hdc in next 11 ch, dc in last 11 ch – you will have 33 sts.

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as first dc), turn, dc in next 10 dc, hdc in next 11 hdc, sc in last 11 sc.

Change to B.

Row 3: With B, ch 1, turn, sc in first 11 sc, hdc in next 11 hdc, dc in last 11 dc.

Row 4: With B, ch 3 (counts as first dc), turn, dc in next 10 dc, hdc in next 11 hdc, sc in last 11 sc.

Change to C.

Rows 5-24: With C, rep Rows 3 and 4 ten times, changing color every other row as in the following sequence: Work 2 rows with C, 2 rows with D, (2 rows with A, 2 rows with B, 2 rows with C, 2 rows with D) twice.

Fasten off.

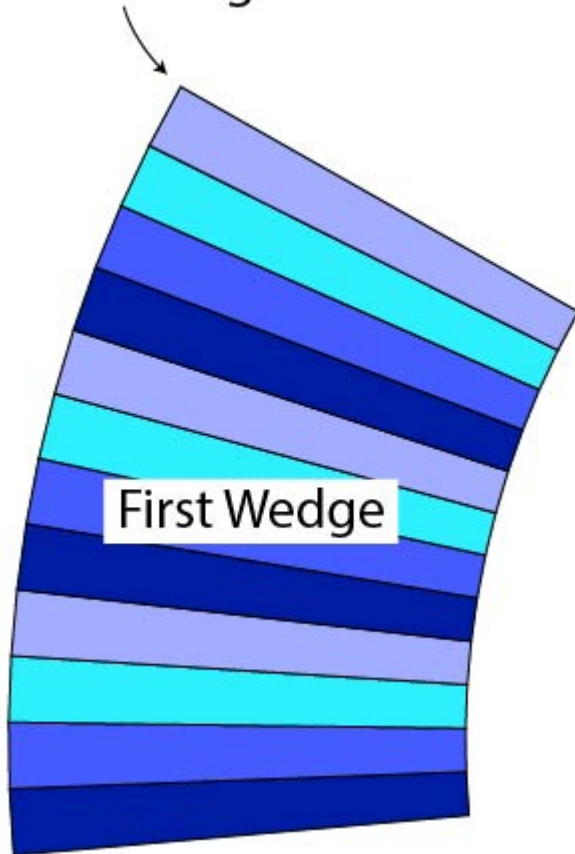
Next 6 Wedges

Row 1: Do not turn piece, join A with sl st in top of beg ch-3 of last row of previous wedge (see diagram), ch 1, sc in same st as joining, sc in next 10 dc, hdc in next 11 hdc, dc in last 11 sc.

Rows 2-24: Rep Rows 2-24 of first wedge.

Fasten off. Rep Rows 1-24 until a total of 7 wedges have been made.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.
