MATERIALS

- 790-407 Lion Brand Homespun Yarn: Painted Desert
5 Balls
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size K-10.5 (6.5 mm)
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

**Homespun® (Article #790). 98% Acrylic, 2% Polyester; package size: 6.00oz/170.00 gr. (185yds/169m) pull skeins*



GAUGE:

10 hdc + 8 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm).

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

STITCH EXPLANATION:

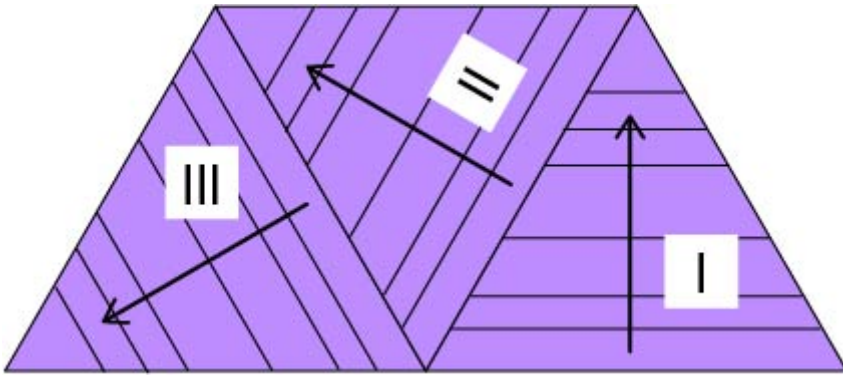
hdc2tog (hdc 2 sts together) (Yarn over, insert hook in next st and draw up a loop) twice, yarn over and draw through all 5 loops on hook – 1 st decreased.

hdc3tog (hdc 3 sts together) (Yarn over, insert hook in next st and draw up a loop) 3 times, yarn over and draw through all 7 loops on hook – 2 sts decreased.

NOTES:

1. Shawl is made from 3 Triangles.
2. Sts are worked across one edge of previous Triangle to begin next Triangle, following Assembly Diagram.

3. A border is worked around outer edge of Shawl.



SHAWL

Triangle I

Ch 84.

Row 1 (RS): Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each sc across – you will have 83 sc.

Row 2: Ch 2 (counts as first hdc in this row and in all following rows), turn, hdc in next st and each st across.

Row 3 (Decrease Row): Ch 2, turn, working through back loops only, hdc2tog, hdc in each st to last 3 sts, hdc2tog, working through both loops, hdc in last st (top of turning ch) – 81 sts.

Row 4 (Decrease Row): Ch 2, turn, working through both loops, hdc2tog, hdc in each st to last 3 sts, hdc2tog, hdc in last st – 79 sts.

Row 5 (Decrease Row): Rep Row 3 – 77 sts.

Row 6: Ch 3 (counts as hdc, ch 1), turn, working through both loops, sk next st, hdc in next st, *ch 1, sk next st, hdc in next st; rep from * across – 39 hdc and 38 ch-1 sps.

Notes: In the next row, work into each hdc and ch-1 sp, working through the back loops only of the hdc sts. Work through the back loops only of hdc sts in all odd-numbered rows.

Row 7 (Decrease Row): Ch 2, turn, hdc2tog, hdc in each ch-1 sp and hdc to last st before turning ch-sp, hdc2tog, hdc in 2nd ch of turning ch – 75 sts.

Rows 8-51: Rep Rows 4-7 eleven times – 9 sts at the end of Row 51.

Rows 52 and 53: Rep Rows 4 and 5 – 5 sts at the end of Row 53.

Row 54: Ch 2, turn, working through both loops, hdc in next st and each st across.

Row 55: Ch 2, turn, hdc3tog, hdc in last st – 3 sts.

Row 56: Ch 1, turn, sk first 2 sts, sc in top of turning ch – 1 st.

Do not fasten off.

Triangle II

Row 1 (RS): Ch 1, turn, work 83 sc as evenly spaced as possible across side edge of Triangle I – 83 sc.

Rows 2-56: Work same as Rows 2-56 of Triangle I.

Do not fasten off.

Triangle III

Row 1 (RS): Ch 1, turn, work 83 sc as evenly spaced as possible across side edge of Triangle II – 83 sc.

Rows 2-56: Work same as Rows 2-56 of Triangle I.

Do not fasten off.

FINISHING**Border**

Rnd 1 (RS): Ch 1, turn, work 82 sc as evenly spaced as possible across side edge(s) of each Triangle, working 2 sc in each join between Triangles and 3 sc in each point; join with sl st in first sc.

Rnd 2: Turn, working through front loops only, sl st in each st around.

Fasten off.

Weave in ends.
