 860-100 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Vanna's Choice Yarn:</u> White

1 Ball (A)

• 860-174 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Vanna's Choice Yarn:</u> Olive

1 Ball (B)

<u>Lion Brand Crochet Hook</u>
 Size G-6 (4 mm)

• <u>Lion Brand Large-Eye</u> Blunt Needles (Set of 6) \*<u>Vanna's Choice</u>® (Article #860). 100% Premium Acrylic

**400**, **401**, **403**: 92% Acrylic, 8% Rayon **402**: 96% Acrylic, 4% Rayon; package size: **Solids**: 3.5 oz (100 g), 170 yards (156 m)

## **GAUGE:**

15 hdc = about 4 in. (10 cm)

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

#### STITCH EXPLANATION:

hdc2tog (hdc 2 sts together) (Yarn over, insert hook in next st and draw up a loop) twice, yarn over and draw through all 5 loops on hook – 1 st decreased.

#### NOTES:

- 1. Booties are worked in the rnd.
- 2. Shamrocks are worked separately, then sewn to Booties.

### **BOOTIES** (make 2)

With A, ch 11.

**Rnd 1:** Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each of next 8 ch, 5 sc in last ch. Working along opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each of next 8 ch, 2 sc in last ch; join with a sl st in first sc – you will have 24 sts at the end of this rnd.

Rnd 2: Ch 2 (counts as first hdc in this rnd and in all following rnds), hdc in same sp as joining, hdc in next 8 sts, 2 hdc in each of last 2 sts; join with a sl st in top of beg ch - 32 sts.

Rnd 3: Ch 2, hdc in same sp as joining, hdc in next 12 sts, 2 hdc in each of next 2 sts, hdc in next 14 sts, 2 hdc in each of next 2 sts; join with a sl st in top of beg ch – 36 sts.

**Rnd 4:** Ch 2, working through back loops only, hdc in each st around; join with a sl st in top of beg ch – 36 sts.

Rnd 5: Ch 2, working through both loops, hdc in each st around; join with a sl st in top of beg ch.

**Rnd 6:** Ch 2, hdc in next 10 sts, (hdc2tog) 6 times, hdc in each st to end of rnd; join with a sl st in top of beg ch - 30 sts.

Rnd 7: Ch 2, hdc in next 9 sts, (hdc2tog) 4 times, hdc in each st to end of rnd; join with a sl st in beg ch – 26 sts.

**Rnd 8:** Ch 1, sc in next 9 sts, (hdc2tog) twice, sc to end of rnd; join with a sl st in first sc – 24 sts.

Rnd 9: Ch 1, sc in next 5 sts, ch4, sk next 8 sts, sc in each st to end of rnd; join with a sl st in first sc.

#### Shamrocks (make 2)

With B, ch 3, 2 dc in first ch, ch 2, sl st in same ch (first petal made), \*(ch 2, 2 dc, ch 2, sl st) in same ch; rep from \* twice more (four petals made), ch 6, sc in 3rd ch from hook, sl st in each of rem 3 ch, sl st in same ch as petals.

Fasten off and cut yarn, leaving a long yarn tail.

#### **FINISHING**

With yarn tail, sew one shamrock to each Bootie. Weave in ends.
