SKILL LEVEL: Easy (Level 2)

SIZE: Small, Medium, Large

Finished Width About 30 (32, 34) in. (76 (81.5, 86.5) cm)

Finished Length About 25 1/2 (27, 28 1/2) in. (65 (68.5, 72.5) cm)

Note: Pattern is written for smallest size with changes for larger sizes in parentheses. When only one number is given, it applies to all sizes. To follow pattern more easily, circle all numbers pertaining to your size before beginning.

MATERIALS

- 790-302 Lion Brand Homespun Yarn: Colonial
5, 6, 7 Balls

**Homespun® (Article #790). 98% Acrylic, 2% Polyester;
package size: 6.00oz/170.00 gr. (185yds/169m) pull
skeins*

- Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size K-10.5 (6.5 mm)
- Lion Brand Split Ring Stitch Markers
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)



GAUGE:


10 dc + 6 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm).

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

NOTES:

1. Tunic is made in 4 pieces: Back, Front and 2 Ties.
2. Back and Front are worked horizontally – from one side across to opposite side.
3. Back and Front are seamed, leaving openings for armholes, then Ties are sewn to Front.



BACK

Ch 66 (70, 73).

Row 1: Dc in 4th ch from hook (3 skipped ch count as first dc) and in each ch across – you will have 64 (68, 71) dc.

Rows 2 and 3: Ch 3 (counts as first dc), turn, dc in each st across.

Row 4: Ch 3 (counts as first dc), turn, working in both loops, dc in next 4 sts; working in back loops only, dc in each st to last 5 sts; working in both loops, dc in last 5 sts.

Rep Row 4 until piece measures about 28 (30, 32) in. (71 (76, 81.5) cm) from beg.

Next 3 Rows: Ch 3 (counts as first dc), turn, working in both loops, dc in each st across.

Fasten off.

FRONT

Make same as Back.

TIES (make 2)

Ch 8.

Row 1: Dc in 4th ch from hook (3 skipped ch count as first dc) and in each ch across – you will have 6 dc.

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as first dc), turn, dc in each st across.

Rep Row 2 until piece measures about 15 in. (38 cm) from beg.

Fasten off.

FINISHING

Note: Either side of the Tunic can be the right side, just choose which you like best! Following diagram, sew shoulders, leaving center 10 in. (25.5 cm) unsewn for neck. Following diagram, place markers 13 (13 1/2, 14) in. (33 (34.5, 35.5) cm) straight down from each end of neck opening on Front.

Sew a Tie at each of the markers.

Following diagram, place markers 10 (10 1/2, 11) in. (25.5 (26.5, 28) cm) down from shoulders on Back and Front for armholes. Sew sides from markers to 6 in. (15 cm) above lower edge.

Weave in ends.
