#### MATERIALS

- 860-404 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Vanna's Choice Yarn:</u> <u>Dark Grey Heather</u> 4 5, 6 Balls (A)
- 325-189 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Romance Yarn: Merlot</u> 14 16, 18 Balls (B)
- Lion Brand Knitting
  <u>Needles Size 10 [6</u>
  <u>mm]</u>
- Boye Aluminum Circular Knitting Needles 16 inches Size 10
- Lion Brand Split Ring <u>Stitch Markers</u>
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

#### GAUGE:

12 sts + 27 rows = 4 in. (10 cm) in Garter st (k every row) and Stripe Sequence. **Gauge Note:** Piece is very stretchy. Lay piece onto flat surface to measure.

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

#### NOTES:

- 1. Pullover is worked in 4 pieces: Back, Front, and 2 Sleeves.
- 2. Yarn color is changed following Stripe Sequence to make stripes.
- 3. Neck edging is worked in the round from sts picked up around neck.

## STRIPE SEQUENCE

Rows 1-4: With A, knit. Rows 5-6: With B, knit. Rep Rows 1-6 for Stripe Sequence.

## BACK

With straight needles and A, cast on 60 (68, 76) sts. Work in Garter st (k every row) and Stripe Sequence until Back measures about 20 (21, 21 1/2) in (51 (53.5, 54.5) cm) from beg, end with Row 5 of Stripe Sequence as the last row you work.

# **Divide for Neck**

**Next Row (WS):** With B, k24 (27, 30), join a 2nd ball of B and bind off next 12 (14, 16) sts for neck, k to end of row – 24 (27, 30) sts each side of neck.

You will now be working both sides AT THE SAME TIME with separate balls of yarn.

#### Shape Neck and Shoulders

Continue to change yarn color following Stripe Sequence while shaping neck and shoulders as follows:

**Next 5 Rows:** On first side, bind off 6 (7, 8) sts, k to end of side; on second side, bind off 2 sts, k to end of side – 6 (7, 8) sts on one side and 2 sts on the other after all bind offs have been completed.

With separate balls of yarn, bind off rem sts on both sides.

#### FRONT

With straight needles and A, cast on and work same as Back until piece measures about 19 (20, 20 1/2) in (48.5 (51, 52) cm) from beg, end with Row 5 of Stripe Sequence as the last row you work.

#### **Divide for Neck**

**Next Row (WS):** With B, k24 (27, 30), join a 2nd ball of B and bind off next 12 (14, 16) sts for neck, k to end of row - 24 (27, 30) sts each side of neck.

You will now be working both sides AT THE SAME TIME with separate balls of yarn.


#### Shape Neck and Shoulders


Continue to change yarn color following Stripe Sequence while shaping neck and shoulders as follows:


**Next 6 Rows (Neck Shaping):** On first side, knit; on second side, bind off 2 sts, k to end of side – 18 (21, 24) sts each side after all neck bind offs have been completed.

**Next 4 Rows (Shoulder Shaping):** On first side, bind off 6 (7, 8) sts, k to end of side; on second side, knit – 6 (7, 8) sts each side after all shoulder bind offs have been completed.

Next Row: On first side, bind off rem 6 (7, 8) sts; on







#### FINISHING

With A, sew Front to Back at shoulders.

Place markers 8 1/2 (9 1/2, 10) in. (21.5 (24, 25.5) cm) down from shoulder seams on Front and Back for Sleeves.

With A, sew tops of Sleeves between markers.

With A, sew side and Sleeve seams.

#### **Neck Edging**

From RS, with circular needle and B, pick up and k60 (63, 66) sts evenly spaced around neck edge. Place marker for beginning of rnd. Join by working the first st on left hand needle with the working yarn from the right hand needle.

Purl one rnd, then knit one rnd.

Bind off loosely.

Weave in ends.
