### Vintage Glam Turban

Pattern Number: L40036B

**SKILL LEVEL:** Beginner (Level 1)

**SIZE:** One Size

About 5 x 40 in. (12.5 x 101.5 cm), then wrapped to fit.

#### **MATERIALS**

- 861-146 Lion Brand Vanna's Glamour Yarn: Jewel  
2 Balls
  - Lion Brand Knitting Needles- Size 8 [5 mm]
  - Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)
  - Additional Materials  
Safety pins
- \*Vanna's Glamour (Article #861). 96% Acrylic, 4% Metallic Polyester; package size: 1.75oz/49.61 gr. (202yds/185m) pull skeins*



#### **GAUGE:**

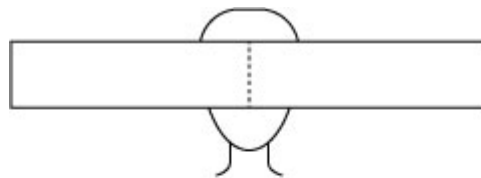
27 stitches + 22 rows = 4 in. (10 cm) in Knit 2, purl 2 rib.

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

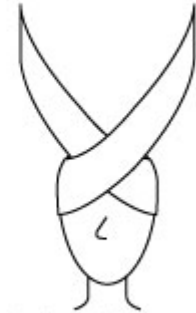
Making a Gauge Swatch

#### **NOTES:**

1. Turban is worked with 2 strands of yarn held together.
2. Piece is worked as a simple rectangle, then sewed to form Turban.



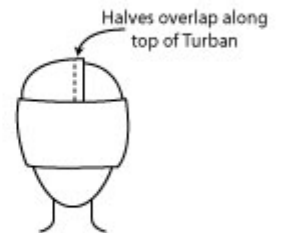
1. Center Turban rectangle at back of head, holding one short end in each hand.



2. Cross ends at front of head.



3. Twist ends together at front, then take to back of Turban, allowing one half to overlap the other along top of Turban. Safety pin edges together along sides and at back.



4. With single strand of yarn, sew side and back seams, leaving overlap along top of Turban unsewn.



5. Sew Turban together just below twist at front.

## TURBAN

With 2 strands of yarn held together, cast on 34 stitches.

**Row 1:** Knit 2, \*purl 2, knit 2; repeat from \* to end of row.

**Row 2:** Purl 2, \*knit 2, purl 2; repeat from \* to end of row.

Repeat Rows 1 and 2 until piece measures about 40 in. (101.5 cm) from beginning.

Bind off.

## FINISHING

Follow Diagram steps 1-5 to shape Turban.

Weave in ends.
