Yarn: Glacier	Acrylic, 20% Wool
3 Balls (A)	Wheat & Wood: 86% Acrylic; 10% Wool; 4%
• 640-099 Lion Brand	Rayon
Wool-Ease Thick & Quick	Oatmeal & Barley & Grey Marble: 82%
Yarn: Fisherman	Acrylic; 10% Wool; 8% Rayon
1 Ball (B)	Metallics: 79% Acrylic, 20% Wool, 1%
	Metallic Poly; package size: Solids, Heathers,
Lion Brand Crochet Hook	Twists, Tweeds: 6 oz./170g (106 yd/97 m)
<u>- Size N-13 (9 mm)</u>	Prints, Stripes: 5 oz./140g (87 yd/80 m)

#### GAUGE:

8 hdc + 6 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm).

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

#### Making a Gauge Swatch

#### NOTES:

1. Scarf and 2 Pockets are worked separately, then Pockets are crocheted onto the Scarf.

2. When working Pockets, the yarn color is changed on every other row to make stripes.

3. To change yarn color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete st. Proceed with new color. Do not fasten off old color until instructed. Carry the color not in use along side edge of piece until next needed.

**SCARF** With A, ch 17. **Row 1 (RS):** Hdc in 3rd ch from hook (2 skipped ch count as first hdc) and in each ch across – 16 hdc. **Row 2:** Ch 2 (counts as first hdc), turn, sk first st, hdc in each st to end of row, working last hdc in top of turning ch.

Rep Row 2 until piece measures about 70 in. (188 cm) from beginning. Fasten off.

#### POCKETS (make 2)

With B, ch 17.

**Row 1 (RS):** Hdc in 3rd ch from hook (2 skipped ch count as first hdc) and in each ch across – 16 hdc. **Row 2:** Ch 2 (counts as first hdc), turn, sk first st, hdc in each st to end of row, working last hdc in top of turning ch.

Change to A.

Rows 3 and 4: With A, ch 1, turn, sc in each st to end of row.

Change to B.

Row 5: With B, ch 2 (counts as first hdc), turn, sk first st, hdc in each st to end of row.

**Row 6:** With B, ch 2 (counts as first hdc), turn, sk first st, hdc in each st to end of row, working last hdc in top of turning ch.

Rows 7-22: Rep Rows 3-6 four more times.

Fasten off.

#### FINISHING

#### Join Pockets

From RS, place a Pocket onto one end of Scarf, matching the Pocket edges to the edges of the Scarf. Working through both thicknesses, join A with sc in top corner of Pocket, then join Pocket to Scarf by working sc evenly spaced along side edge to lower corner, across lower edge and up opposite side edge to top corner of Pocket.

Fasten off.

Repeat to join the second Pocket to the opposite end of the Scarf. Weave in ends.
