Free Crochet Pattern from Lion Brand Yarn

Lion Brand® Homespun® Hooded Cowl

Pattern Number: L30122

SKILL LEVEL: Easy (Level 2)

SIZE: One Size

Finished Cowl Circumference About 22 in. (56 cm)

Finished Height About 15 1/2 in. (39.5 cm) from lower edge of Cowl to top of Hood

MATERIALS

- 790-404 [Lion Brand Homespun Yarn: Lagoon](#)
1 Ball
- [Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size K-10.5 \(6.5 mm\)](#)
- [Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles \(Set of 6\)](#)

**Homespun® (Article #790). 98% Acrylic, 2% Polyester; package size: 6.00oz/170.00 gr. (185yds/169m) pull skeins*



GAUGE:

9 hdc + 7 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm).

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

STITCH EXPLANATION:

hdc3tog (hdc 3 sts together) (Yarn over, insert hook in next st and draw up a loop) 3 times, yarn over and draw through all 7 loops on hook – 2 sts decreased.

NOTES:

1. Cowl is worked in joined rnds with RS facing at all times.
2. Hood is worked back and forth in rows over a portion of the sts in the last rnd of Cowl. Last row of Hood is folded and slip stitched to make the top seam.
3. Edging is worked around the entire front opening edge.

HOODED COWL

Cowl

Ch 50; taking care not to twist the ch; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

Rnd 1 (RS): Ch 2 (does not count as a st on this rnd or on any of the following rnds), hdc in same ch as joining and in each ch around; join with sl st in top of beg ch – 50 sts.

Rnd 2: Ch 2, hdc in same st and in each st around; join with sl st in top of beg ch. Repeat Rnd 2 until piece measures about 6 in. (15 cm) from beg.

Hood

Row 1 (RS): Ch 2, do not turn, hdc in first 33 sts; leave rem sts unworked.

Row 2: Ch 2, turn, hdc in first 4 sts, 2 hdc in next st, (hdc in next 2 sts, 2 hdc in next st) 3 times, hdc in next 5 sts, 2 hdc in next st, (hdc in next 2 sts, 2 hdc in next st) 3 times, hdc in next 4 sts – 41 sts at the end of this row.

Rows 3-14: Ch 2, turn, hdc in each st across.

Shape Hood

Row 15: Ch 2, turn, hdc in next 19 sts, hdc3tog, hdc in next 19 sts – 39 sts.

Row 16: Ch 2, turn, hdc in next 18 sts, hdc3tog, hdc in next 18 sts – 37 sts.

Row 17: Ch 2, turn, hdc in next 17 sts, hdc3tog, hdc in next 17 sts – 35 sts.

Top Seam: Fold Hood in half, bringing RS together.

From WS and working through both thicknesses, sl st in each st across. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Front Edging

Note: Before working edging, try piece on and decide whether you'd like to change the size of the face opening. To reduce the size of the face opening, work fewer sc sts in Rnd 1. To enlarge the size of the face opening, work more sc sts in Rnd 1.

Rnd 1: From RS, join yarn with sl st anywhere in edge of face opening, sc evenly around entire edge of opening; join with sl st in first sc.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

Weave in ends.
