**SIZE:** One Size

### COWL

**Finished Circumference** About 35 1/2 in. (90 cm)

**Finished Height** About 9 in. (23 cm)

### WRISTERS

**Finished Circumference** About 8 1/2 in. (21.5 cm)

**Finished Length** About 10 in. (25.5 cm)

Circular knitting needle  
size 13 (9 mm), 24 in. (61 cm) long

*\*Wool-Ease Thick & Quick (Article #640).  
Solids, Heathers, Twists, Prints, Stripes: 80%  
Acrylic, 20% Wool  
Wheat & Wood: 86% Acrylic; 10% Wool; 4%  
Rayon  
Oatmeal & Barley & Grey Marble: 82%  
Acrylic; 10% Wool; 8% Rayon  
Metallics: 79% Acrylic, 20% Wool, 1%  
Metallic Poly; package size: Solids, Heathers,  
Twists, Tweeds: 6 oz./170g (106 yd/97 m)  
Prints, Stripes: 5 oz./140g (87 yd/80 m)  
Metallics: 5 oz./140g (92 yd/84 m)*



### GAUGE:

10 1/2 sts = about 4 in. (10 cm) in St st worked in rnds (k every rnd).

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from

person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

### Making a Gauge Swatch

#### **NOTES:**

1. Cowl is worked on a circular needle in St st worked in rnds (k every rnd) and reverse St st worked in rnds (p every rnd), with 3 colors of yarn.
2. Decreases are worked to shape the Cowl.
3. Wristers are worked in the rnd on double pointed needles with 3 colors of yarn.
4. You don't have to cut the yarn between color changes – just carry the color(s) you're not using on the WS of your piece, twisting the carried yarn around the working yarn every 2-3 rnds.

#### **COWL**

With circular needle and A, cast on 84 sts. Place marker for beginning of rnd and join by working the first st on the left hand needle with the working yarn from the right hand needle and being careful not to twist sts.

**Rnd 1:** With A, knit.

**Rnd 2:** With B, knit.

**Rnds 3-5:** With B, purl.

**Rnds 6-9:** With A, knit.

**Rnd 10:** With C, knit.

**Rnds 11-13:** With C, purl.

**Rnds 14-17:** With A, knit.

**Rnds 18-33:** Rep Rnds 2-17.

**Rnds 34-40:** Rep Rnds 2-8.

#### **Shaping**

**Rnd 41:** With A, \*k12, k2tog; rep from \* 5 more times – you will have 78 sts at the end of Rnd 41.

**Rnds 42-46:** Rep Rnds 10-14.

**Rnd 47:** With A, \*k11, k2tog; rep from \* 5 more times – 72 sts.

**Rnd 48:** With A, knit.

**Rnd 49:** With A, \*k10, k2tog; rep from \* 5 more times – 66 sts.

**Rnds 50-54:** Rep Rnds 2-6.

Bind off.

#### **FINISHING**

Weave in ends.

#### **WRISTERS (make 2)**

##### **Cuff**

With double pointed needles and A, cast on 22 sts. Divide sts onto 4 needles with 5 sts on each of 2 needles and 6 sts on each of 2 needles. Place marker for beginning of rnd and join by working the first st on the left hand needle with the working yarn from the right hand needle and being careful not to twist sts.

**Rnd 1:** With A, knit.

**Rnd 2:** With B, knit.

**Rnds 3 and 4:** With B, purl.

**Rnds 5 and 6:** With A, knit.

**Rnd 7:** With C, knit.

**Rnds 8 and 9:** With C, purl.

**Rnds 10 and 11:** With A, knit.

**Rnd 12:** With B, knit.

**Rnds 13 and 14:** With B, purl.

Cut yarns B and C.

With A, work in St st worked in rnds (k every rnd) for 22 rnds.

### Shape Thumb

**Rnd 1:** K to last 6 sts, slip last 6 sts to a st holder – 16 sts remain on needles.

Continue in St st worked in rnds with A for 5 rnds.

**Rnd 2:** With B, knit.

**Rnds 3 and 4:** With B, purl.

Cut yarn B.

**Rnd 5:** With A, knit.

Bind off loosely.

### Thumb

**Note:** Thumb is worked on 4 double pointed needles.

Sl sts from holder onto 2 double pointed needles (3 sts on each needle). With a 3rd double pointed needle and B, pick up and knit 2 sts across opening for thumb.

Place marker for beginning of rnd and join by working the first st on the left hand needle with the working yarn from the right hand needle.

**Rnd 1:** With B, knit.

**Rnds 2 and 3:** With B, purl.

**Rnd 4:** With A, knit.

Bind off.

## FINISHING

Weave in ends.
