4 Balls (A)

 931-203 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Textures Yarn: Arctic</u> <u>Sky</u>

2 Balls (B)

- <u>Lion Brand Crochet</u> <u>Hook - Size I-9</u>
- <u>Lion Brand Split Ring</u>
   <u>Stitch Markers</u>
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

\*<u>Textures</u> (Article #931). 90% Acrylic, 10% Nylon; package size: 3.00oz/85.05 gr. (149yds/136m) pull skeins



### **GAUGE:**

1 ripple = about 4 1/4 in. (11 cm) measured from peak to peak; 5 rows = 4 in. (10 cm) in Ripple pattern.

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

#### STITCH EXPLANATION:

**dc3tog (dc 3 sts together)** (Yarn over, insert hook in next st and draw up a loop, yarn over, draw through 2 loops) 3 times, yarn over and draw through all 4 loops on hook – 2 sts decreased.

# NOTES:

1. The Poncho is made from a simple rectangle that is folded and seamed.

- 2. The rectangle is worked in a ripple crochet pattern. The ripple pattern is easy to do, but it's important to remember that you may need to work several rows before the ripple pattern becomes clear.
- 3. The ripple pattern consists of alternating peaks and valleys. Take care to keep the peaks and valleys of each row aligned. 3 dc are worked into the center 2 dc of peaks and two dc3tog are worked centered over valleys.
- 4. Yarn color is changed to make stripes. To change yarn color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops to complete st. Proceed with new color. Fasten off old color.
- 5. Collar is worked onto the Poncho.

## **PONCHO**

With A, ch 71.

Base Row: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across – you will have 70 sc at the end of this row.

# **Ripple Pattern**

Rows 1-12: Ch 3 (counts as first dc), turn, 2 dc in first st, dc in back loops of next 3 sts, dc3tog twice, dc in back loops of next 3 sts, \*3 dc in each of next 2 sts, dc in back loops of next 3 sts, dc3tog twice, dc in back loops of next 3 sts; rep from \* to turning ch, 3 dc in top of turning ch – 5 ripples.

Change to B.

Rows 13-18: With B, rep Row 1 six times.

Change to A.

Rows 19-24: With A, rep Row 1 six times.

Change to B.

Rows 25-60: Rep Rows 13-24 three times, do not change to B at the end of Row 60.


Rows 61-66: With A, rep Row 1 six times.

Last Row: Ch 2 (counts as first hdc), turn, hdc in each st across - 70 hdc.

Fasten off.

# **FINISHING**

Fold piece in half, bringing first and last row together, to measure 21 x 26 in.  $(53.5 \times 66 \text{ cm})$ . Place a marker on one of the 26 in.  $(53.5 \times 60 \times 10^{-2})$  sides, 10 1/2 in.  $(26.5 \times 60 \times 10^{-2})$  below fold for neck opening. Seam edge from marker to lower corner.



#### Collar

From RS, join A with sl st at neck edge seam.

Rnd 1 (RS): Ch 1, work 70 sc as evenly spaced as possible around neck edge; join with sl st in first sc. Rnds 2-8: Ch 3 (counts as first dc), turn, 2 dc in next st, dc in back loops of next 3 sts, dc3tog twice, dc in back loops of next 3 sts, \*3 dc in each of next 2 sts, dc in back loops of next 3 sts, dc3tog twice, dc in back loops of next 3 sts; rep from \* to last st, 3 dc in last st; join with sl st in top of turning ch – 5 ripples.

**Rnd 9:** Ch 1, turn, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc - 70 sc.

Fasten off.

Weave in ends.
