### Left Bank Scarf

**SIZE:** One Size

#### GAUGE:

17 sts + 24 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) over Rows 1-78 of pattern.

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

#### STITCH EXPLANATION:

#### TECHNIQUE EXPLANATION

**w&t (wrap and turn):**

Wrap & turn is a technique used to prevent a small hole from forming at the end of a short row.

1. Slip next st as if to purl.
2. Bring yarn between needles to front. Take care not to wrap the yarn over a needle, this would create a new st.
3. Slip same st back to left needle.
4. Turn work and bring yarn in position for next st. This will place a wrap around the st.
5. The next time you knit a wrapped st, pick up the wrap and knit it tog with the st.

## NOTES:

1. Scarf is worked in one piece.
2. Short rows are used when changing yarn color – the short rows create triangles of color. Short rows are rows that are worked over a portion of the sts in a row. You will turn to work back in the opposite direction even though there are still some sts rem on the left needle.
3. To work short rows, the pattern instructions will tell you to wrap and turn (w&t) before you reach the end of a row. See the Technique Explanation for how to work a w&t.
4. When working short rows, the wrap is most often worked together with the wrapped st. In this design, this technique isn't necessary. Both the Garter stitch (knit every row) and the texture of the yarn will hide the wraps!
5. The Scarf is worked in Garter stitch (knit every row). Garter stitch looks the same on both the right and the wrong sides, so the Scarf is reversible.

## SCARF

### Triangle 1

With A, cast on 40 sts.

**Row 1 and all odd-numbered rows through Row 39:** Knit to end of row.

**Row 2:** K38, w&t – 2 sts rem on left needle.

**Row 4:** K36, w&t – 4 sts rem on left needle.

**Row 6:** K34, w&t – 6 sts rem on left needle.

**Row 8:** K32, w&t – 8 sts rem on left needle.

**Row 10:** K30, w&t – 10 sts rem on left needle.

**Row 12:** K28, w&t – 12 sts rem on left needle.

**Row 14:** K26, w&t – 14 sts rem on left needle.

**Row 16:** K24, w&t – 16 sts rem on left needle.

**Row 18:** K22, w&t – 18 sts rem on left needle.

**Row 20:** K20, w&t – 20 sts rem on left needle.

**Row 22:** K18, w&t – 22 sts rem on left needle.

**Row 24:** K16, w&t – 24 sts rem on left needle.

**Row 26:** K14, w&t – 26 sts rem on left needle.

**Row 28:** K12, w&t – 28 sts rem on left needle.

**Row 30:** K10, w&t – 30 sts rem on left needle.

**Row 32:** K8, w&t – 32 sts rem on left needle.

**Row 34:** K6, w&t – 34 sts rem on left needle.

**Row 36:** K4, w&t – 36 sts rem on left needle.

**Row 38:** K2, w&t – 38 sts rem on left needle.

**Row 39:** Knit to end of row.

### Triangle 2

Change to D.

**Row 40 and all even numbered rows through Row 78:** Knit to end of row.

**Row 41:** K2, w&t – 38 sts rem on left needle.

**Row 43:** K4, w&t – 36 sts rem on left needle.

**Row 45:** K6, w&t – 34 sts rem on left needle.

**Row 47:** K8, w&t – 32 sts rem on left needle.  
**Row 49:** K10, w&t – 30 sts rem on left needle.  
**Row 51:** K12, w&t – 28 sts rem on left needle.  
**Row 53:** K14, w&t – 26 sts rem on left needle.  
**Row 55:** K16, w&t – 24 sts rem on left needle.  
**Row 57:** K18, w&t – 22 sts rem on left needle.  
**Row 59:** K20, w&t – 20 sts rem on left needle.  
**Row 61:** K22, w&t – 18 sts rem on left needle.  
**Row 63:** K24, w&t – 16 sts rem on left needle.  
**Row 65:** K26, w&t – 14 sts rem on left needle.  
**Row 67:** K28, w&t – 12 sts rem on left needle.  
**Row 69:** K30, w&t – 10 sts rem on left needle.  
**Row 71:** K32, w&t – 8 sts rem on left needle.  
**Row 73:** K34, w&t – 6 sts rem on left needle.  
**Row 75:** K36, w&t – 4 sts rem on left needle.  
**Row 77:** K38, w&t – 2 sts rem on left needle.  
**Row 78:** Knit to end of row.

### **Triangle 3**

Change to B.  
With B, rep Rows 1-39.

### **Triangle 4**

Change to C.  
With C, rep Rows 40-78.

### **Triangle 5**

Change to D.  
With D, rep Rows 1-39.

### **Triangle 6**

Change to C.  
With C, rep Rows 40-78.

### **Triangle 7**

Change to A.  
With A, rep Rows 1-39.

### **Triangle 8**

Change to B.  
With B, rep Rows 40-78.

### **Triangles 9-20**

Rep Triangles 5-8.

### **Triangle 21**

Change to C.  
With C, rep Rows 1-39.

### **Triangle 22**

Change to A.  
With A, rep Rows 40-78.

### **Triangle 23**

Change to D.  
With D, rep Rows 1-39.

## Triangle 24

Change to B.

With B, rep Rows 40-78.

Bind off.

## FINISHING

Weave in ends.
