- 640-138 <u>Lion Brand Wool-Ease</u> <u>Thick & Quick Yarn: Cranberry</u> 3 Balls (A)
- 640-122 <u>Lion Brand Wool-Ease</u>
   <u>Thick & Quick Yarn: Taupe</u>
   2 Balls (B)
- 640-153 <u>Lion Brand Wool-Ease</u>
   <u>Thick & Quick Yarn: Black</u>
   3 Balls (C)

\*Wool-Ease Thick & Quick (Article #640). Solids, Heathers, Twists, Prints, Stripes: 80% Acrylic, 20% Wool;

Wheat & Wood: 86% Acrylic; 10% Wool; 4% Rayon; Oatmeal & Barley & Grey Marble: 82% Acrylic; 10% Wool; 8% Rayon;

Metallics: 79% Acrylic, 20% Wool, 1% Metallic Poly; package size: Solids, Heathers, Twists, Tweeds: 6 oz./170q (106 yd/97 m)

Prints, Stripes: 5 oz./140g (87 yd/80 m) Metallics: 5 oz./140g (92 yd/84 m)



### **GAUGE:**

9 sts + 14 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) in Seed stitch.

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

#### STITCH EXPLANATION:

#### **PATTERN STITCH**


Seed Stitch (worked over an even number of sts)

**Row 1:** \*K1, p1; rep from \* to end of row. **Row 2:** P the knit sts, and k the purl sts.

#### **NOTES:**

- 1. The Poncho is worked in intarsia colorwork following a chart for color changes.
- 2. When working in intarsia, do not carry yarns across the WS of work, use a separate ball or bobbin for each section of color. Twist yarns on WS to prevent holes. Before you begin the Back of the Poncho, wind E and G into 2 separate balls each.
- 3. When following charts, work in Seed st and read RS rows from right to left and WS rows from left to right.
- 4. The fronts are worked from lower edge up, then joined to work the back.
- 5. A circular needle is used to accommodate the large number of sts. Work back and forth in rows on the circular needle, just as if working with straight needles.

#### **PONCHO**

## Right Front

With A, cast on 54 sts.

**Row 1 (RS):** With A, work in Seed st to end of row.

Continue in Seed st, changing color following chart until all 112 rows of Right Front have been completed. Place sts on a st holder.

#### **Left Front**

With A, cast on 5 sts; with D, cast on 5 sts; with second ball of A, cast on 44 sts – you will have a total of 54 sts. **Row 1 (RS):** Work in Seed st, changing color as follows: with A, work to last 10 sts, with D, work over next 5 sts, with A, work to end of row.

Continue in Seed st, changing color following chart until all 112 rows of Left Front have been completed.

#### Back

**Row 1 (RS):** From RS, work in Seed st changing color as follows: with E, work over first 36 sts of Left Front; with D, work over last 18 sts of Left Front; with D, work over first 18 sts of Right Front from holder; with a separate ball of E, work over next 26 sts; with C, work over last 10 sts – you will have 108 sts at the end of this row. Continue in Seed st, changing color following chart until all 98 rows of Back have been completed. Bind off, binding off each section with matching color.

#### **FINISHING**

Weave in ends.
