# Free Crochet Pattern from Lion Brand Yarn

### Diagonal Stripes Scarf

Pattern Number: L50011

**SKILL LEVEL:** Easy (Level 2)

**SIZE:** One Size

About 6 1/2 x 68 in. (16.5 x 172.5 cm), not including fringe

#### **MATERIALS**

- 545-202 Lion Brand Landscapes: Mountain Range

1 Ball (A)

- 545-135 Lion Brand Landscapes: Rust

1 Ball (B)

- 545-124 Lion Brand Landscapes: Ochre

1 Ball (C)

- Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size K-10.5 (6.5 mm)

- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

*\*Landscapes (Article #545). 100% acrylic; package size: 3.50oz/100.00 gr. (147yds/134m) pull skeins*



#### **GAUGE:**

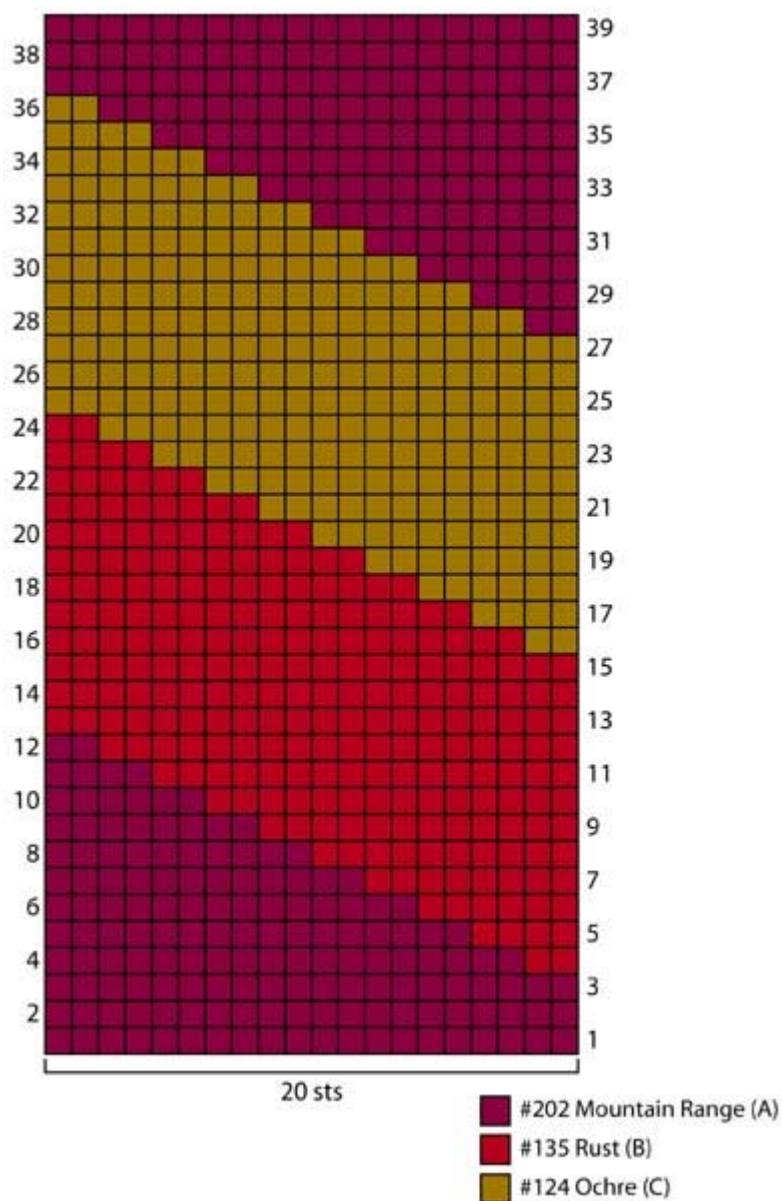
12 dc + 6 1/2 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm).

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

#### **NOTES:**

1. Scarf is worked in one piece in intarsia colorwork. Use a separate strand for each color and do not carry unused color(s) across the wrong side of work.
2. The colorwork can be worked following a chart or the written instructions. When working from a chart, read RS rows from right to left and WS rows from left to right.
3. To change yarn color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops to complete st. Proceed with new color. Do not fasten off old color until instructed.



## SCARF

With A, ch 22.

**Row 1 (RS):** Dc in 4th ch from hook (3 skipped ch count as first dc) and in each ch across – you will have 20 dc at the end of this row.

**Rows 2 and 3:** Ch 3 (always counts as first dc), turn, sk first st, dc in next st and in each st across, working last dc in top of turning ch.

**Row 4:** With A, ch 3, turn, sk first st, dc in next 17 sts; with B, dc in each st to end of row, working last dc in top of turning ch.

**Row 5:** With B, ch 3, turn, sk first st, dc in next 3 sts; with A, dc in each st to end of row, working last dc in top of turning ch.

**Row 6:** With A, ch 3, turn, sk first st, dc in next 13 sts; with B, dc in each st to end of row, working last dc in top of turning ch.

**Row 7:** With B, ch 3, turn, sk first st, dc in next 7 sts; with A, dc in each st to end of row, working last dc in top of turning ch.

**Row 8:** With A, ch 3, turn, sk first st, dc in next 9 sts; with B, dc in each st to end of row, working last dc in top of turning ch.

**Row 9:** With B, ch 3, turn, sk first st, dc in next 11 sts; with A, dc in each st to end of row, working last dc in top of turning ch.

**Row 10:** With A, ch 3, turn, sk first st, dc in next 5 sts; with B, dc in each st to end of row, working last dc in top of turning ch.

**Row 11:** With B, ch 3, turn, sk first st, dc in next 15 sts; with A, dc in each st to end of row, working last dc in top of turning ch.

**Row 12:** With A, ch 3, turn, sk first st, dc in next st; with B, dc in each st to end of row, working last dc in top of turning ch.

Fasten off A.

**Rows 13-15:** With B, ch 3, turn, sk first st, dc in next st and in each st across, working last dc in top of turning ch.

**Rows 16-27:** Rep Rows 4-15, using B instead of A and C instead of B.

Fasten off B.

**Rows 28-39:** Rep Rows 4-15, using C instead of A and A instead of B.

Fasten off C.

**Rows 40-111:** Rep Rows 4-39 twice.

Fasten off.

## FINISHING

### Fringe

Cut one 16 in. (40.5 cm) long strand each of A, B, and C. Hold strands together and fold in half. With crochet hook, draw fold through edge of Scarf, forming a loop. Pull ends of fringe through this loop.

Pull to tighten.

Make 10 fringes across each short end of Scarf.

Trim fringe ends.

Weave in ends.
