#### **GAUGE:**

10 1/2 dc + 5 1/2 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm).


When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

## NOTES:

- 1. Shawl is worked in one piece beg with Center Triangle.
- 2. Center Triangle is worked in joined rnds with RS always facing.
- 3. Left and Right Side Panels are worked across sides of Center Triangle.
- 4. Side Panels are worked back and forth in rows.
- 5. A picot edging is worked around the entire outside edge of Shawl.





#### **SHAWL**

## **Center Triangle**

**Note:** We've included a stitch diagram to help you make the Center Triangle.

With A, ch 6.

Join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

Rnd 1 (RS): Ch 3 (always counts as first dc), 4 dc in ring, (ch 5, 5 dc in ring) twice, ch 5; join with sl st in top of beg ch – you will have 3 ch-5 sps and 15 dc (5 dc across each of 3 sides between ch-5 sps) at the end of this rnd.

Rnd 2: Ch 3, \*dc in each dc to next ch-5 sp, (3 dc, ch 5, 3 dc) in next ch-5 sp; rep from \* 2 more times; join with sl st in top of beg ch.

Rnds 3-9: Ch 3, \*dc in each dc to next ch-5 sp, (3 dc, ch 5, 3 dc) in next ch-5 sp; rep from \* 2 more times, dc in each dc to end of rnd; join with sl st in top of beg ch – you will have 3 ch-5 sps and 159 dc (53 dc across each of 3 sides) at the end of Rnd 9.

Fasten off.

Place a marker in any ch-5 sp on last rnd of Center Triangle. Place another marker in the 27th dc (center dc) of the side of the Center Triangle that is directly opposite from the marked ch-5 sp.


## **Left Side Panel**

Row 1 (RS): From RS, join B with a sl st in marked ch-5 sp, ch 3, 2 dc in same ch-5 sp, dc in next 27 dc, leave rem sts unworked – you will have 30 dc at the end of this row.

Row 2: Ch 3, turn, sk first 2 sts, dc in next 27 sts, 2 dc in top of beg ch.

**Row 3:** Ch 3, turn, dc in first st, dc in next 27 sts, sk next st, dc in top of beg ch.

Rows 4-29: Rep Rows 2 and 3 thirteen times.



Row 30: Rep Row 2.

Fasten off.

## Right Side Panel

**Row 1 (RS):** From RS, join C with a sl st in the marked 27th dc, ch 3, dc in next 26 dc, 3 dc in next ch-5 sp – you will have 30 dc at the end of this row.

**Row 2:** Ch 3, turn, dc in first st, dc in next 27 sts, sk next st, dc in top of beg ch.

Row 3: Ch 3, turn, sk first 2 sts, dc in next 27 sts, 2 dc in top of beg ch.

Rows 4-29: Rep Rows 2 and 3 thirteen times.

Row 30: Rep Row 2.

Fasten off.

#### **FINISHING**

## **Picot Edging**

**Note:** To change yarn color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete st. Proceed with new color. Fasten off old color.

From RS, join B with a sl st in marked ch-5 sp (where First Side Panel beg).

Rnd 1 (RS): Ch 1, sc in same ch-5 sp, working in ends of rows and sts on outer edge, \*ch 1, sk next st, sc in next st, ch 1, sk next st, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next st; rep from \* all the way around outer edge of Shawl changing color to match Side Panels and Center Triangle; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

Weave in ends.
