Free Knitting Pattern from Lion Brand Yarn Lion Brand® Scarfie Neutral Slant Shawl

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SKILL LEVEL: Easy (Level 2)

SIZE: One Size

About 16 x 60 in. (40.5 x 152.5 cm)

MATERIALS

*<u>Scarfie</u> (Article #826). 78% acrylic, 22% wool; package size: 5.30oz/150.00 gr. (312yds/285m) pull skeins

- 826-201 <u>Lion Brand Scarfie: Cream/Black</u> 2 Balls
- Lion Brand Knitting Needles Size 11 [8 mm]
- <u>Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)</u>



GAUGE:

12 sts = 4 in. (10 cm) over Rows 1-6 of pattern.

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

STITCH EXPLANATION:

kfb (knit into front and back) Knit next st without removing it from left needle, then k through back of same st −1 st increased. **yo (yarn over)**

An increase that also creates a small decorative hole (eyelet) in the fabric, worked as follows:

- 1. Bring yarn to front, between the needles.
- 2. Take yarn to back, over the right needle. This creates the new st. You are now ready to proceed with the next st as instructed.

NOTES:

- 1. Shawl is worked in one piece in an easy pattern that includes increases, decreases and eyelets.
- 2. The first section of the Shawl is shaped with increases and the last section is shaped with decreases.
- 3. The center section of the Shawl increases on every odd-numbered row and decreases on every even-numbered row. Your stitch count will not change when working the center section, the increases and decreases are done to create a diagonal pattern.
- 4. Eyelet rows are created by alternating yo's (yarn overs) with k2tog's (knit 2 stitches together).

SHAWL

Cast on 3 sts.

First Section

Rows 1-5: Kfb, knit to end of row - you will have 8 sts at the end of Row 5.

Row 6: Kfb, *yo, k2tog; rep from * to last st, k1 - 9 sts.

Rep Rows 1-6 until you have 69 sts, then rep Row 1 once more – 70 sts.

Center Section

Note: Your stitch count will not change when working the center section because the increase at the beginning of every odd-numbered row is offset by the decrease at the beginning of every even-numbered row.

Rows 1 and 3: Kfb, knit to end of row.

Rows 2 and 4: K2tog, knit to end of row.

Row 5: Kfb, *yo, k2tog; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 6: K2tog, knit to end of row.

Repeat rows 1-6 until longer side edge measures about 60 in. (152.5 cm), end with a Row 6 as the last row you work.

Last Section

Rows 1-4: K2tog, knit to end of row – you will have 66 sts at the end of Row 4.

Row 5: K2tog, k1, *yo, k2tog; rep from * to last st, k1 - 65 sts.

Row 6: K2tog, knit to end of row – 64 sts.

Rep Rows 1-6 until you have only 4 sts remaining, then rep Row 1 - 3 sts.

Bind off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.
