GAUGE:

(32 mm) diameter

10 sts + 14 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) in Cable and Rib pattern.

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

STITCH EXPLANATION:

3/3 RC (3 over 3 right cross) Slip 3 sts to cable needle and hold in back, k3, then k3 from cable needle.

yo (yarn over)

An increase that also creates a small decorative hole (eyelet) in the fabric, worked as follows: 1. Bring yarn to front, between the needles.

2. Take yarn to back, over the right needle. This creates the new st. You are now ready to proceed with the next st as instructed.

PATTERN STITCH Cable and Rib Pattern (over 32 sts) Row 1 (RS): P1, (k2, p2) 3 times, k6, (p2, k2) 3 times, p1. Row 2: Purl. Rows 3 and 4: Rep Rows 1 and 2. Row 5: P1, (k2, p2) 3 times, 3/3 RC, (p2, k2) 3 times, p1. Row 6: Purl. Rows 7 and 8: Rep Rows 1 and 2. Rep Rows 1-8 for Cable and Rib pattern.

NOTES:

1. Scarf is worked in one piece in a Cable and Rib pattern.

2. Buttonholes are worked along one side edge of Scarf. Buttons are sewn to the other end of same edge, following a diagram.



SCARF

Cast on 32 sts. **Row 1 (RS):** P1, *k2, p2; rep from * to last 3 sts, k2, p1. **Row 2:** Purl. **Rows 3-6:** Rep Rows 1 and 2 twice. **Row 7 (Buttonhole Row – RS):** P1, k2, yo, p2tog, (the yo and the p2tog make the buttonhole) *k2, p2; rep from * to last 3 sts, k2, p1.

Row 8: Purl.

Beg Cable and Rib Pattern

Work Rows 1-8 of Cable and Rib pattern.

Buttonhole Row (RS): (Note: On this row, you are working Row 1 of the Cable and Rib pattern and making a buttonhole) P1, k2, yo, p2tog, (k2, p2) twice, k6, (p2, k2) 3 times, p1.

Beg with Row 2 of pattern, continue in Cable and Rib pattern for 9 rows (when you do this rep, Row 2 of the Cable and Rib pattern will be the last row you work).

Rep Buttonhole Row (this row counts as Row 3 of the Cable and Rib pattern).

Beg with Row 4 of pattern, continue in Cable Rib pattern until piece measures about 50 in. (127 cm) from beg, end with a WS row as the last row you work.

Last 8 Rows: Rep Rows 1 and 2 four times.

Bind off in pattern.

FINISHING

Weave in ends. With sewing needle and thread and following diagram, sew buttons to Scarf.
