MATERIALS

- 136-189 [Lion Brand Heartland Yarn: Isle Royale](#) 4 Balls
**Heartland (Article #136). Solids: 100% Acrylic*
Tweeds: 94% Acrylic, 6% Rayon; package size: Solids: 5oz/142g (251yd/230m)
- [Martha Stewart Crafts™ Knit & Weave Loom Kit](#) *Tweeds: 4oz/113g (200yd/183m)*
- Additional Materials
1 button, 1 1/2 in. (4 cm) diameter



GAUGE:

17sts + 27 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) in pattern stitch.

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

NOTES:

1. Follow loom manual instructions for SINGLE KNITTING for how to cast on, knit, purl, and bind off.
2. Wrap and Collar are worked separately, then Collar is sewn to Wrap.
3. The loom is configured into an oval for stability.
4. It's important to keep loops on the pegs loose enough to lift easily over the peg with the knitting tool when making a stitch. Use the knitting tool to tug on each loop after placing it to loosen the loop before working the next peg.

Loom Configuration

Use the following pieces: (2) 36-hole pieces, (4) 12-hole pieces and (2) 28-hole semi-circle pieces.

Connect pieces to form an oval as follows: 36-hole piece > 12-hole piece > 12-hole piece > 28-hole semi-circle piece > 12-hole piece > 12-hole piece > 36-hole piece > 28-hole semi-circle piece.

Lay loom onto a flat surface, with one long side of the oval shape horizontally in front of you. Beginning in the middle of the 28-hole semi-circle piece on the right hand side, insert a small peg into every hole as follows: 5 small gray pegs, followed by 71 small blue pegs, followed by 5 small gray pegs – 81 working pegs placed.

Note: The 5 gray pegs on each end are to remind you that the stitches on those pegs are for the borders. Insert a blue peg to the right of first peg you placed for slip knot.

Insert a gray peg into each connecting hole along the back side of the loom to hold the loom pieces together.

WRAP

Note: On every row, the first peg is skipped to make a smooth edge on the Wrap.

Cast onto the 81 working pegs.

Row 1: Skip the first peg, knit to end of row.

Row 2: Skip the first peg, purl to end of row.

Rows 3-6: Repeat Rows 1 and 2.

Row 7: Repeat Row 1.

Row 8: Skip the first gray peg, purl next 4 gray pegs, knit 1, *purl 1, knit 1; repeat from * across the blue pegs, purl the 5 gray pegs.

Row 9: Skip the first gray peg, knit 4 gray pegs, purl 1, *knit 1, purl 1; repeat from * across the blue pegs, knit the 5 grey pegs.

Repeat Rows 8 and 9 until piece measures about 45 in. (114 cm) from cast on.

Note: Pull piece away from the pegs to measure.

Repeat Rows 1-7.

Bind off.

COLLAR

Move the 5 gray pegs on the left end of loom over to leave 4 empty holes.

Insert 4 blue pegs into the empty holes – 85 working pegs placed.

Cast onto the 85 working pegs.

Work same as Wrap until Collar measures about 5 in. (12.5 cm) from cast on.

Bind off.

FINISHING

Sew Collar centered along one long side of Wrap.

Buttonloop

With crochet hook included with loom, make a chain 1 1/2 in. (4 cm) long.

With yarn needle supplied with loom, sew one end of chain to Wrap at lower right side of Collar.

Sew opposite end of chain to Wrap about 1 in. (2.5 cm) below.

Sew button to Wrap opposite buttonloop.

Thread yarn ends into yarn needle and weave into the fabric of the Wrap.
