MATERIALS

- 136-389 Lion Brand
Heartland Yarn: Isle Royale
Tweed

1 Ball (A)

Heartland (Article #136). **Solids: 100%
Acrylic*

- 136-113 Lion Brand
Heartland Yarn: Redwood

1 Ball (B)

***Tweeds:** 94% Acrylic, 6% Rayon;
package size: **Solids:** 5oz/142g
(251yd/230m)*

- 136-103 Lion Brand
Heartland Yarn: Denali

1 Ball (C)

***Tweeds:** 4oz/113g (200yd/183m)*

- 136-098 Lion Brand
Heartland Yarn: Acadia

1 Ball (D)

GAUGE:

17 sts + 30 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) in Garter stitch (knit 1 row, purl 1 row).

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

NOTES:

1. Follow loom manual instructions for SINGLE KNITTING for how to cast on, knit, purl, and bind off.
2. Two strips are worked separately, then sewn together to make the Scarf.
3. The yarn color is changed to create blocks of color. To change color, work to last stitch, then work last stitch with old and new color yarns held together. Drop the old color and continue on with the new color.
4. The first peg on one edge of each strip is skipped to create a smooth edge on the Scarf.
5. For stability, the loom is configured into a rectangle.

Loom Configuration

Use the following pieces: (2) 36-hole pieces and (2) U-shaped corner pieces.

Connect pieces to form a rectangle as follows: 36-hole piece > U-shaped corner piece > 36-hole piece > U-shaped corner piece.

Insert 26 small blue pegs into every hole along one 36-hole piece. Insert a grey peg in each connecting hole to hold loom together and one grey peg to the right of blue pegs for slip knot – 26 working pegs placed.

SCARF

Strip 1

With A, cast on onto the 26 working pegs.

Row 1: With A, knit.

Row 2: Skip the first peg, purl to end of row.

Rows 3-45: Repeat Rows 1 and 2 for Garter stitch.

Row 46: Purl, changing to B in last stitch.

Rows 47-92: With B, repeat Rows 1-46, changing to C in last st of Row 92.

Rows 93-138: With C, repeat Rows 1-46, changing to D in last st of Row 138.

Rows 139-184: With D, repeat Rows 1-46, changing to A in last st of Row 184.

Repeat Rows 1-184 once, then repeat Rows 1-92.

Bind off.

Strip 2

With B, cast on onto the 26 working pegs.

Row 1: With B, skip the first peg, knit to end of row.

Row 2: Purl.

Rows 3-45: Repeat Rows 1 and 2 for Garter stitch.

Row 46: Skip the first peg, purl to end of row, changing to C in last stitch.

Rows 47-92: With C, repeat Rows 1-46, changing to D in last st of Row 92.

Rows 93-138: With D, repeat Rows 1-46, changing to A in last st of Row 138.

Rows 139-184: With A, repeat Rows 1-46, changing to B in last st of Row 184.

Repeat Rows 1-184 once, then repeat Rows 1-92.

Bind off.

FINISHING

Lay the 2 strips side by side on a flat surface with the skipped peg edges on the outside. Line up the color blocks and with the yarn needle supplied with loom, sew strips together.

Thread yarn ends into yarn needle and weave into the fabric of the Scarf.
