# GAUGE:

10 sts = about 4 in. (10 cm) in Garter stitch (knit one row, purl one row).

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

# Making a Gauge Swatch

#### NOTES:

1. Follow loom manual instructions for SINGLE KNITTING for how to cast on, knit, purl, and bind off.

2. Once you've cast on for the Cowl, begin working back and forth for single knitting. The loom is configured into an oval for stability.

3. Cowl is worked in one piece, then ends are sewn together to make a ring.

Loom Configuration

Use the following pieces: (2) 36-hole pieces, (4) 12-hole pieces and (2) 28-hole semi-circle pieces.

Connect pieces to form an oval as follows: 36-hole piece > 12-hole piece > 12-hole piece > 28-hole semi-circle piece > 12-hole piece > 12-hole piece > 28-hole semi-circle piece.

Lay loom onto a flat surface, with one long side of the oval shape horizontally in front of you. Beginning at the first hole of the 28-hole semi-circle loom piece on your right, insert a large pink peg into every other hole along the semi-circle piece, long front side of the loom, then around the semi-circle piece to your left – 60 working pegs placed.

Insert a gray peg in each connecting hole along the long back side of the loom to hold the loom pieces together.

Skip the hole just before the first pink peg you inserted, then insert a large green peg in the next hole to mark the beginning of the work and to hold the slip knot.

#### COWL

Make a slip knot onto the green peg, then cast onto the 60 working pegs.

Work in Garter stitch (knit one row, purl one row) until piece measures about 12 in. (30.5 cm) from cast on.

Note: Pull piece away from the pegs to measure.

Bind off, leaving a long yarn tail.

#### FINISHING

Thread yarn tail into yarn needle supplied with loom and sew ends of piece together for 6 in. (15 cm). The unsewn portion of the ends creates the split.

Thread yarn ends into yarn needle and weave into the fabric of the Cowl.
