

SIZE

SCARF

About 6 x 60 in. (15 x 152.5 cm)

HAT

Finished Circumference About 19 in. (48.5 cm), will stretch to fit a range of sizes.

Finished Height About 11 in. (28 cm)

NOTES

- 1. Scarf and Hat are both worked in one easy stitch, changing yarn color to make stripes.
- To change yarn color, work last stitch with old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and finish the stitch. Fasten off old color.

GAUGE


 $9\frac{1}{2}$ half double crochet + $7\frac{1}{2}$ rows = about 4 in. (10 cm).

BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

STEP 1


SCARF

With A, chain 15.



STEP 2


Row 1: Half double crochet in 3rd chain from hook (the first 2 skipped chain count as the first half double crochet) and in each chain across – you will have 14 half double crochet stitches.





STEP 3

Row 2: Chain 2 (these 2 chain count as the first half double crochet), turn, half double crochet in next stitch and in each stitch across.



STEP 4


With A, repeat Row 2 for 14 more times – so that you have a total of 16 rows with A. Change to B in the last stitch of the last row.

Continue in this same way to work 16 rows each with B, C, D, A, B and then C.

Fasten off.


FINISHING

Weave in ends.



STEP 5


HAT




STEP 6

Row 1: Half double crochet in 3rd chain from hook (the first 2 skipped chain count as the first half double crochet) and in each chain across – you will have 44 half double crochet stitches.








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STEP 7

Row 2: Chain 2 (counts as first half double crochet), turn, half double crochet in next stitch and in each stitch across.




44 half double crochet

STEP 8

With D, repeat Row 2 twice, changing to A in the last st of the last row.

Continue in this same way to work 2 rows with A, one row with D, 4 rows with B, 3 rows with C and 6 rows with D.




STEP 9

Next Row: With D, chain 2, turn, yarn over, insert hook in next stitch and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook, *(yarn over, insert hook in next stitch and draw up a loop) twice, yarn over and draw through all 5 loops on hook; repeat from * across row.

Next Row: Chain 2 (counts as first half double crochet), turn, half double crochet in next stitch and in each stitch across.

Fasten off, leaving a long yarn tail.



FINISHING

Thread yarn tail into blunt needle. Weave needle through last row, pull to gather and knot securely. Sew sides to make Hat. Weave in ends.
