Hometown USA (Article #135). **Solids, Multis, Neons and Twists: 100% Acrylic, **Tweeds:** 94% Acrylic, 6% Rayon; package size: **Solids:** 5 oz. (142 g), 81 yd. (74 m) **Multis, Tweeds, Neons, and Twists:** 4 oz. (113 g), 64 yd. (59 m)*

GAUGE:

Three 3-dc groups = about 5 1/2 in. (14 cm).

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

NOTES:

1. A Granny Square is made first for corner of Afghan. Work then proceeds back and forth in rows across only 2 sides of the Square.
2. To change color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete st. Proceed with new color. Cut old color.



AFGHAN

Granny Square

With A, ch 5; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

Rnd 1 (RS): Ch 3 (counts as dc here and throughout), 2 dc in ring, (ch 2, 3 dc in ring) 3 times, ch 2; join with sl st in top of beg ch – you will have four 3-dc groups and 4 ch-2 sps at the end of Rnd 1.

Rnd 2: Sl st in next 2 dc, (sl st, ch 3, 2 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in next ch-2 sp (corner made), *ch 1, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in next ch-2 sp (corner made); rep from * 2 more times, ch 1; join with sl st in top of beg ch – Eight 3-dc groups, 4 corner ch-2 sps, and 4 ch-1 sps.

Rnd 3: Sl st in next 2 dc, (sl st, ch 3, 2 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in next ch-2 sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, *ch 1, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in next ch-2 sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp; rep from * 2 more times, ch 1; join with sl st in top of beg ch – Twelve 3-dc groups, 4 corner ch-2 sps, and 8 ch-1 sps.

Rnd 4: Sl st in next 2 dc, (sl st, ch 3, 2 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in next ch-2 sp, (ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp) twice, *ch 1, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in next ch-2 sp, (ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp) twice; rep from * 2 more times, ch 1; join with sl st in top of beg ch – Sixteen 3-dc groups, 4 corner ch-2 sps, and 12 ch-1 sps.

Fasten off A.

Band I

Row 1 (RS): From RS, join B with sl st in any corner ch-2 sp, ch 3, dc in same corner ch-2 sp, (ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp) to next corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in corner ch-2 sp, (ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp) to next corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, 2 dc in corner ch-2 sp; leave other 2 sides of Center Square unworked – Eight 3-dc groups, two 2-dc groups, 1 corner ch-2 sp, and 8 ch-1 sps.

Row 2: Ch 3, turn, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, (ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp) to corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in corner ch-2 sp, (ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp) to end of side, dc in top of beg ch – Ten 3-dc groups, 2 dc, 1 corner ch-2 sp, and 8 ch-1 sps.

Row 3: Ch 3, turn, dc in first dc, (ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp) to corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in ch-2 sp, (ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp) to end of side, ch 1, 2 dc in top of beg ch – Ten 3-dc groups, two 2-dc groups, 1 corner ch-2 sp, and 10 ch-1 sps.

Rows 4 and 5: Rep Rows 2 and 3 – at the end of Row 5 you will have twelve 3-dc groups.

Row 6: Rep Row 2 and change to C in last st – Fourteen 3-dc groups.

Band II

Row 7: With C, rep Row 3 – Fourteen 3-dc groups.

Rows 8-13: With C, rep Rows 2 and 3 three times – Twenty 3-dc groups in Row 12.

Row 14: With C, rep Row 2 and change to D in last st – Twenty-two 3-dc groups.

Band III

Row 15: With D, rep Row 3 – Twenty-two 3-dc groups.

Rows 16-23: With D, rep Rows 2 and 3 four times and change to E in last st of Row 23 – Thirty 3-dc groups in Row 22.

Band IV

Rows 24-33: With E, rep Rows 2 and 3 five times and change to F in last st of row 33 – Forty 3-dc groups in Row 32.

Band V

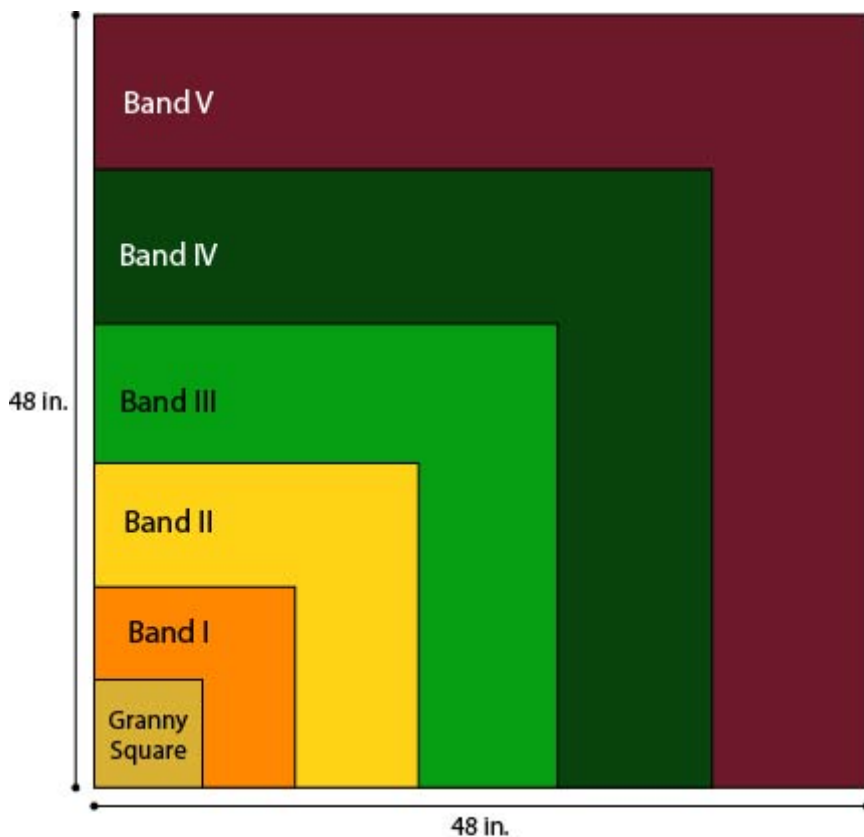
Rows 34-43: With F, rep Rows 2 and 3 five times – Fifty 3-dc groups in Row 42.

Row 44: With F, rep Row 2 – Fifty-two 3-dc groups.

Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.
