# Free Knitting Pattern from Lion Brand Yarn Lion Brand<sup>®</sup> Landscapes<sup>®</sup> Penobscot Shawl

### SKILL LEVEL: Easy (Level 2)

SIZE: One Size

About 52 in. (132 cm) at widest point x 21 in. (53.5 cm) long

#### CORRECTIONS: (applied Nov 4, 2015)

Rows 57-60 64: Rep Rows 53-56 twice more – 159 sts. Change to C. Rows 61-64 65-68: With C, rep Rows 49-52 – 167 sts. Change to B. Rows 65 and 66 69 and 70: With B, rep Rows 49 and 50 – 171 sts. Change to C. Rows 67 and 68 71 and 72: With C, rep Rows 49 and 50 – 175 sts. Rows 69-72 73-76: Rep Rows 65-68 – 183 sts. Change to B. Rows 73-76 77-80: With B, rep Rows 49-52 – 191 sts. Row 77 81: Knit, removing markers as you come to them.

## MATERIALS

- 545-205 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Landscapes: Apple Orchard</u> 1 Ball (A)
- 545-143 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Landscapes: Bordeaux</u> 1 Ball (B)
- 545-113 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Landscapes: Ruby</u>
  1 Ball (C)
- Lion Brand Size 10.5 [6.5 mm] 29-inch [75 cm] Circular Knitting Needles
- Lion Brand Split Ring Stitch Markers
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

#### GAUGE:

11 sts = about 4 in. (10 cm) in Garter st (k every row).

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

## STITCH EXPLANATION:

### kfb (knit into front and then back)

An increase worked as follows:

1. Knit the next st through the front loop, but do not remove the st from your left hand needle.

2. Knit the same st once more, this time inserting your needle through the back loop of the st. You will have created 2 loops (sts) on your right hand needle.

3. Drop the st from your left hand needle – you have increased 1 st.

### yo (yarn over)

An increase that also creates a small decorative hole (eyelet) in the fabric, worked as follows: 1. Bring yarn to front, between the needles.

2. Take yarn to back, over the right needle. This creates the new st. You are now ready to proceed with the next st as instructed.

#### NOTES:

1. Shawl is worked in one piece in an easy eyelet pattern, with Garter st (k every row) edges.

2. The markers placed on Row 5 will help you keep your place. After Row 5, always slip markers as you come to them.

3. Shawl begins at center back neck and is shaped by working yarn over (yo) increases.

4. A yarn over creates a new loop on your needle and is worked by wrapping the yarn around your right hand needle. Do not use an existing st to make a yarn over. The finished yarn over will leave an open space (an eyelet) in your knitting – that is part of this design.

5. A series of yarn overs and k2togs on Row 51 creates the eyelet pattern.

6. A circular needle is used to accommodate the large number of sts. Work back and forth on circular needle as if working on straight needles.

#### SHAWL

With A, cast on 5 sts. **Rows 1 and 2:** Knit. **Row 3:** K1, kfb, k1, kfb, k1 – you will have 7 sts at the end of this row.

# **Increase Overview**

On RS rows after Row 3, increases are worked at the beginning and end of the row and on both sides of the center st.

On WS rows after Row 6 and continuing to Row 36, increases are worked at the beginning and end of the row.

Row 4: Knit.

**Row 5 (RS):** K2, yo, k1, yo, place marker (pm), k1, pm, yo, k1, yo, k2 – 11 sts.

**Row 6 (WS):** K2, yo, slipping markers as you come to them, k to last 2 sts, yo, k2 – 13 sts.

**Row 7:** K2, yo, k to marker, yo, slip marker (sm), k1, sm, yo, k to last 2 sts, yo, k2 – 17 sts.

Rows 8-37: Rep Rows 6 and 7 for 15 more times – you will have 107 sts at the end of Row 37.

Row 38 (WS): Knit, slipping markers as you come to them.

Row 39: Rep Row 7 – 111 sts.

**Rows 40-47:** Rep Rows 38 and 39 for 4 more times – you will have 127 sts at the end of Row 47. **Row 48:** Knit, slipping markers as you come to them.

Change to B.

**Row 49:** With B, rep Row 7 – 131 sts.

Row 50: Knit, slipping markers as you come to them.

Row 51 (Eyelet Row – RS): With B, k2, yo, k1, \*yo, k2tog; rep from \* to marker, yo, sm, k1, sm, yo,

\*\*k2tog, yo; rep from \*\* to last 3 sts, k1, yo, k2 – 135 sts. Row 52: Knit, slipping markers as you come to them. Change to C. Rows 53 and 54: With C, rep Rows 49 and 50 – 139 sts. Change to B. Rows 55 and 56: With B, rep Rows 49 and 50 – 143 sts. Change to C. Rows 57-64: Rep Rows 53-56 twice more – 159 sts. Change to C. Rows 65-68: With C, rep Rows 49-52 – 167 sts. Change to B. Rows 69 and 70: With B, rep Rows 49 and 50 – 171 sts. Change to C. Rows 71 and 72: With C, rep Rows 49 and 50 – 175 sts. Rows 73-76: Rep Rows 65-68 - 183 sts. Change to B. Rows 77-80: With B, rep Rows 49-52 - 191 sts. Row 81: Knit, removing markers as you come to them. Bind off loosely.

### FINISHING

Weave in ends.
