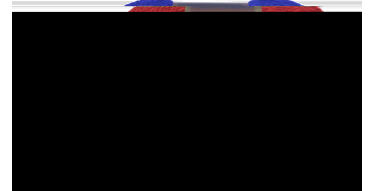
Finished Circumference About 18 in. (45.5 cm), Hat will stretch to fit a range of sizes.

MATERIALS

- 137-113 [Lion Brand Heartland Thick & Quick Yarn: Redwood](#)
1 Ball
- [Lion Brand Knitting Needles Size 11 \[8 mm\]](#)
- [Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles \(Set of 6\)](#)

**Heartland Thick & Quick (Article #137). 100% acrylic; package size: 5.00oz / 141.75 gr. (125 ds/114m) per 11 skeins*



GAUGE:

11 sts = about 4 in. (10 cm) over Rows 1 and 2.

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

NOTES:

Hat is worked in one piece, then seamed.

HAT

Cast on 50 sts.

Row 1: *K2, p2; rep from * across to last 2 sts, k last 2 sts.

Row 2: *P2, k2; rep from * across to last 2 sts, p last 2 sts.

Rep Rows 1 and 2 until piece measures about 2 in. (5 cm) from beginning.

In the next section, you'll be knitting one row and then purling one row to make Stockinette stitch.

Next Row: Knit.

Next Row: Purl.

Rep last 2 rows until piece measures about 9 in. (23 cm) from beginning.

Cut yarn, leaving a long yarn tail. Thread yarn tail into blunt needle. Beginning with last st on (knitting) needle, draw blunt needle through remaining sts. Pull to gather sts together and fasten off.

Do not cut yarn tail.

FINISHING

With yarn tail, sew sides of Hat together.

Weave in ends.
