## Lion Brand® LB Collection® Silk

### Bacall Mesh Stitch Wrap

Pattern Number: L60117

**SKILL LEVEL:** Easy + (Level 3)

**SIZE:** One Size

About 18 x 60 in. (45.5 x 152.5 cm), including edging.

#### **MATERIALS**

- 492-204 Lion Brand LB Collection Silk Yarn: Pluto  
6 Balls
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size G-6  
(4 mm)
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles  
(Set of 6)

*\*LB Collection Silk (Article #492). 100% Silk; package size: 1.75oz/50.00 gr. (163yds/150m) pull skeins*



#### **GAUGE:**

22 sts = about 4 in. (10 cm) over Rows 1-3.

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

#### **STITCH EXPLANATION:**

**Picot-shell** (3 dc, ch 3, sl st in 3rd ch from hook, 3 dc) in indicated space.

#### **NOTES:**

1. Wrap is worked in one piece.
2. A picot edging is worked around the outside edge of completed Wrap.

#### **WRAP**

Ch 90.

**Row 1:** Dc in 6th ch from hook (beg ch counts as 1 base ch, dc, ch 1), \*ch 1, sk next ch, dc in next ch; rep from \* across – 44 dc and 43 ch-1 sps.

**Row 2:** Ch 4 (counts as first dc, ch 1 in this row and in all following rows), turn, sk first ch-1 sp, dc in next dc, \*ch 1 sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc; rep from \* to turning ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 4th ch of beg ch.

**Rows 3-167:** Ch 4, turn, sk first ch-1 sp, dc in next dc, \*ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc; rep from \* to turning ch-sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of beg ch.

Do not fasten off.

#### **Picot Edging**

Working in ends of rows across long edge of Wrap, ch 3, do not turn, work 2 dc in end of first row (corner), sc in end of next row, \*sk next row, picot-shell in end of next row, sk next row, sc in end of next row; rep from \* 40 more times, picot-shell in end of last row (corner made); do NOT turn.

Working in ch-sp across opposite side of foundation ch, sk first ch-sp (same sp as corner just made), sc in next ch-sp, \*sk next ch-sp, picot-shell in next ch-sp, sk next ch-sp, sc in next ch-sp; rep from \* 9 more times, picot in next ch-sp (corner); do NOT turn.

Working in ends of rows across next long edge of Wrap, sk end of first row (same sp as corner just made), sc in end of next row, \*sk next row, picot-shell in end of next row, sk next row, sc in end of next row; rep from \* 40 more times, picot-shell in end of last row (corner made); do NOT turn.

Working in sts of Row 167, sk first ch-sp (same sp as corner just made), sc in next ch-sp, \*sk next ch-sp, picot-shell in next ch-sp, sk next ch-sp, sc in next ch-sp; rep from \* 9 more times, 2 dc in next ch-sp (same sp as beg corner), ch 3, sl st in 3rd ch from hook; join with sl st in top of beg ch – 106 picot-shells.  
Fasten off.

## FINISHING

Weave in ends.
