MATERIALS

- 492-204 Lion Brand LB Collection Silk Yarn: Pluto
3 Balls
- Lion Brand Knitting Needles- Size 5 [3.75 mm]
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

**LB Collection Silk (Article #492). 100% Silk; package size: 1.75oz/50.00 gr. (163yds/150m) pull skeins*



GAUGE:

23 sts = about 4 in. (10 cm) in Stockinette st (knit on RS, purl on WS).

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

NOTES:

Scarf is worked in one piece, then sewn together.

SCARF

Cast on 70 sts.

Row 1 (WS): Purl.

Row 2 (RS): Knit.

Rep Rows 1 and 2 for Stockinette st (knit on RS, purl on WS) until piece measures about 48 in. (122 cm).

Bind off loosely.

FINISHING

Sew short ends of piece together to make Scarf.

Weave in ends.
