SKILL LEVEL: Intermediate (Level 3)

SIZE: One Size

About 31 x 37 in. (78.5 x 94 cm)

CORRECTIONS: (applied Jun 2, 2016)

SQUARES (make 30 – 8 each with A and B, 7 each with C and D)

...

Rnd 2: Ch 2, sk same st as joining, dc4tog, (~~eh-4~~ ch 5, sl st in next ch-3 sp, ~~eh-4~~ ch 5, dc5tog) 3 times, ~~eh-4~~ ch 5, sl st in next ch-3 sp, ~~eh-4~~ ch 5; join with sl st in top of beg dc4tog – 4 dctog and 8 ~~eh-4~~ ch-5 sps.

MATERIALS

- 923-207 Lion Brand Ice Cream: Strawberry
1 Ball (A)
- 923-307 Lion Brand Ice Cream: Sprinkles - Bubble Gum
1 Ball (B)
- 923-205 Lion Brand Ice Cream: Spumoni
1 Ball (C)
- 923-305 Lion Brand Ice Cream: Sprinkles - Creamsicle
2 Balls (D)
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size G-6 (4 mm)
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

**Ice Cream (Article #923). 100% Acrylic;
package size: 3.50oz/100.00 gr.
(394yds/360m) pull skeins*



GAUGE:

1 Square = about 6 x 6 in. (15 x 15 cm).

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

STITCH EXPLANATION:

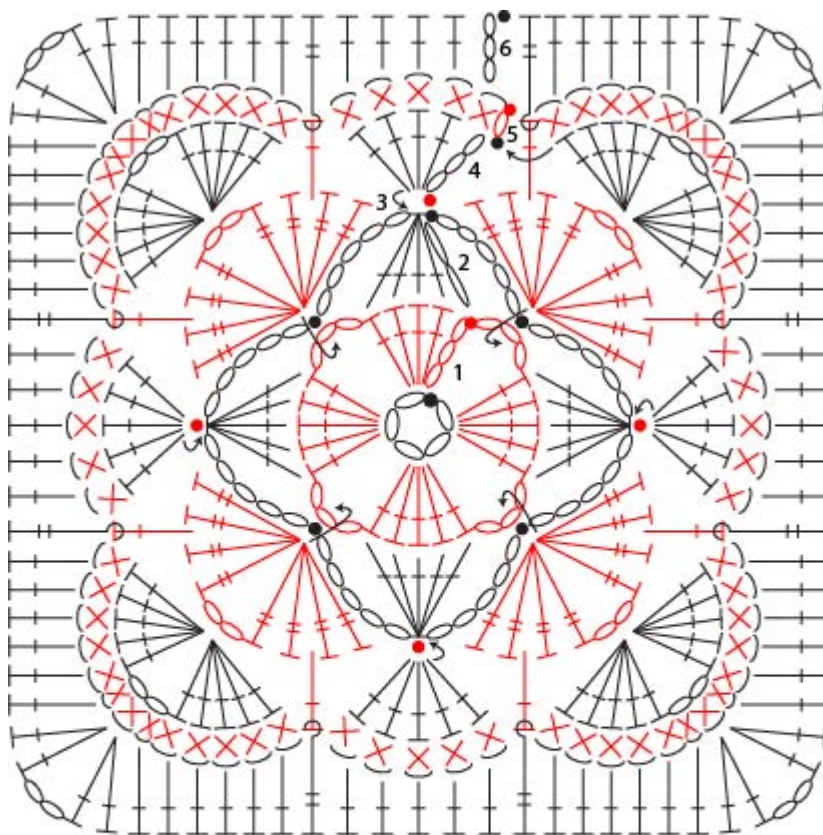
dc4tog (dc 4 sts together) (Yarn over, insert hook in next st and draw up a loop, yarn over, draw through 2 loops) 4 times, yarn over and draw through all 5 loops on hook – 3 sts decreased.

dc5tog (dc 5 sts together) (Yarn over, insert hook in next st and draw up a loop, yarn over, draw through 2 loops) 5 times, yarn over and draw through all 6 loops on hook – 4 sts decreased.

FPTR (front post treble crochet) Yarn over twice, insert hook from front to back then to front, going around post of indicated st, draw up a loop, (yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook) 3 times. Skip st behind the FPTR.

NOTES:

1. Afghan is made from 30 Squares sewn together following a diagram.
2. Each Square is worked in joined rnds with RS always facing.
3. You can follow the written instructions or the Square chart to make Squares.



KEY	
●	= slip stitch (sl st)
○	= chain (ch)
X	= single crochet (sc)
┆	= double crochet (dc)
┆	= treble crochet (tr)
┆	= front post treble crochet (FPTR)
┆	= work in back loop only

SQUARES (make 30 – 8 each with A and B, 7 each with C and D)

Ch 5; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

Rnd 1: Ch 3 (counts as dc), 4 dc in ring, (ch 3, 5 dc in ring) 3 times, ch 3; join with sl st in top of beg ch –

you will have four 3-dc groups and 4 ch-3 sps at the end of this rnd.

Rnd 2: Ch 2, sk same st as joining, dc4tog, (ch 5, sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 5, dc5tog) 3 times, ch 5, sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 5; join with sl st in top of beg dc4tog – 4 dctog and 8 ch-5 sps.

Rnd 3: *Working over next sl st, work (4 tr, ch 2, 4 tr) in next ch-3 sp of Rnd 1, sl st in top of next dctog; rep from * 3 more times – eight 4-tr groups and 4 ch-2 sps.

Rnd 4: Ch 3 (counts as dc), 4 dc in same st as joining, *(5 dc, ch 2, 5 dc) in next ch-2 sp; working over next sl st, 5 dc in next dctog of Rnd 2; rep from * 2 more times, (5 dc, ch 2, 5 dc) in next ch-2 sp; join with sl st in top of beg ch – twelve 5-dc groups and 4 ch-2 sps.

Rnd 5: Ch 1, sc in same st as joining, sc in next 4 dc, *dc in sp between 2nd and 3rd tr of next 4-tr group of Rnd 3, sc in next 5 dc, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next 5 dc, dc in sp between 2nd and 3rd tr of next 4-tr group of Rnd 3, sc in next 5 dc; rep from * 2 more times, dc in sp between 2nd and 3rd tr of next 4-tr group of Rnd 3, sc in next 5 dc, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next 5 dc, dc in sp between 2nd and 3rd tr of next 4-tr group of Rnd 3; join with sl st in back loop only of first sc – 72 sc and 8 dc.

Rnd 6: Ch 3 (counts as dc), working in back loops only, dc in next 4 sts, *FPTR around next dc, dc in next 6 sts, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in next st, dc in next 6 sts, FPTR around next dc, dc in next 5 sts; rep from * 2 more times, FPTR around next dc, dc in next 6 sts, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in next st, dc in next 6 sts, FPTR around next dc; join with sl st in top of beg ch – 84 dc and 8 FPTR.

Fasten off.

FINISHING

Following diagram and holding Squares with RS together, whipstitch Squares together to make 6 strips of 5 Squares each. Whipstitch strips together to make Afghan.

Border

Rnd 1: From RS, join D with a sl st in any corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, 3 sc in same ch-2 sp, sc in each st around working 3 sc in each corner ch-2 sp; join with sl st in first sc.

Rnd 2: Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, *sk next 2 sts, (sl st, ch 3, dc) in next sc; rep from * around; join with sl st in same st as joining.

Fasten off.

Weave in ends.
