MATERIALS

4 5 Balls (A)

1 1 Ball (B)

GAUGE:

14 sts + 22 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) in St st (k on RS, p on WS).

When you match the [gauge](#) in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

STITCH EXPLANATION:

M1 (make 1) An increase worked by lifting the horizontal strand lying between needles and placing it onto the left needle. Knit this new stitch through the back loop – 1 st increased.

ssk (slip, slip, knit) Slip next 2 sts as if to knit, one at a time, to right needle; insert left needle into fronts of these 2 sts and knit them tog – 1 st decreased.

PATTERN STITCH

K3, p1 Rib (worked over a multiple of 4 sts + 2 additional sts)

Row 1 (RS): K1, *k3, p1; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 2: K the knit sts and p the purl sts.

Rep Row 2 for K3, p1 Rib.

NOTES:

1. Pullover is made from 8 separate pieces: Back Center, Front Center, 2 Left Triangles, 2 Right Triangles, and 2 Sleeves.

2. The Back Center, 1 Left Triangle, and 1 Right Triangle are sewn together following the diagram to make the Back. Front Center and 2 remaining triangles are sewn together to make the Front.
3. The Triangles are stretched slightly when sewn to create the final measurements of the Pullover.
4. Neckband is worked from sts picked up around the neck edge of the Pullover.
5. When you see 'work even' in the instructions, this means to continue on in the pattern st you have established without changing the st count by increasing, decreasing, or binding off.

BACK CENTER

With longer needle and A, cast on 66 (82) sts.

Work in K3, p1 Rib until piece measures about 4 in. (10 cm) from beg, end with a WS row as the last row you work.

Change to B.

Beginning with a RS (knit) row, work in St st (k on RS, p on WS) for 6 rows.

Change to A.

Work in St st for 4 rows.

Change to D.

Decrease Row (RS): K2tog, k to last 2 sts, ssk – you will have 64 (80) sts at the end of this row.

Next Row: Purl.

Rep last 2 rows 30 (35) times until only 4 (10) sts rem, AT THE SAME TIME, changing color as in following color sequence: work 4 more rows with D, (4 rows with A, 4 rows with C) twice, 4 rows with A, (2 rows with D, 2 rows with A) 4 times, 2 rows with D, then work with A until only 4 (10) sts rem.

Continue with A over next 2 rows.

Increase Row (RS): K1, M1, k to last st, M1, k1 – 6 (12) sts.

Next Row: Purl.

Rep last 2 rows 23 (25) more times, AT THE SAME TIME, changing color in the following color sequence: work 10 (14) more rows with A, (2 rows with C, 2 rows with A) 5 times, (4 rows with D, 4 rows with A) twice – 52 (62) sts.

** With C, work even in St st for 6 rows.

Shape Neck

Change to A.

Row 1 (RS): K14 (17), join a 2nd ball of A and bind off center 24 (28) sts, k to end of row – 14 (17) sts remain for each side of neck.

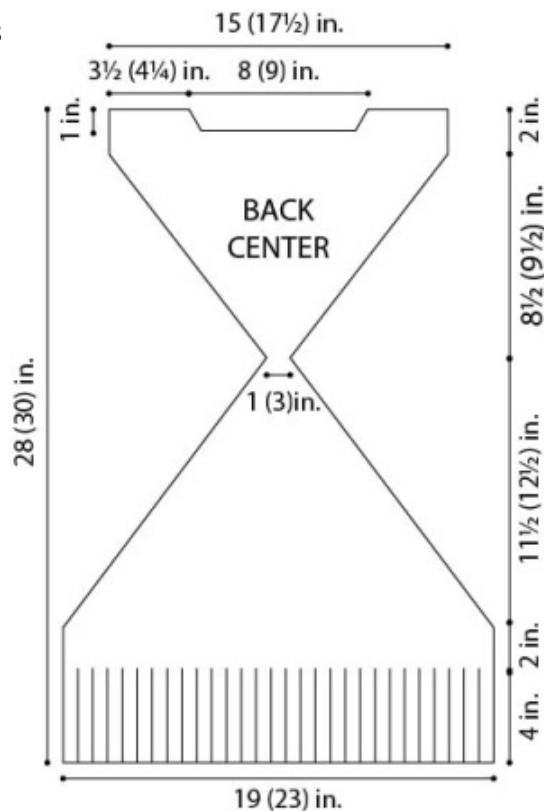
You will now work both sides AT THE SAME TIME using separate balls of yarn.

Row 2: Using separate balls of yarn, purl all sts of both sides.

Row 3 Decrease Row: On first side, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1; on 2nd side, k1, ssk, k to end of side – 13 (16) sts on each side.

Rows 4 and 5: Rep Rows 2 and 3 – 12 (15) sts on each side.

Using separate balls of yarn, bind off all sts of both sides.



FRONT CENTER

Cast on and work same as Back Center to **. Note that you will omit working 6 rows of St st with C.

Shape Neck

Continue with A.

Row 1 (RS): K16 (19), join a 2nd ball of A and bind off center 20 (24) sts, k to end of row – 16 (19) sts remain for each side of neck.

You will now work both sides AT THE SAME TIME using separate balls of yarn.

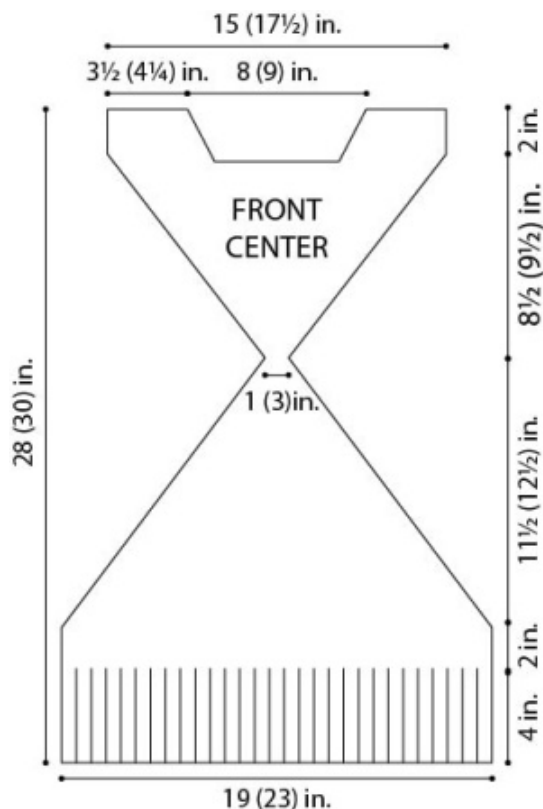
Row 2: Using separate balls of yarn, purl all sts of both sides.

Row 3 Decrease Row: On first side, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1; on 2nd side, k1, ssk, k to end of side – 15 (18) sts on each side.

Row 4: Using separate balls of yarn, purl all sts of both sides.

Rows 5-10: Rep Rows 3 and 4 for 3 more times – 12 (15) sts on each side when all decreases are completed.

Using separate balls of yarn, bind off all sts of both sides.



LEFT TRIANGLES (make 2)

With longer needle and A, cast on 3 sts.

Next Row (WS): Purl.

Increase Row (RS): K1, M1, k to last st, M1, k1 – 5 sts.

Next Row: Purl.

Rep last 2 rows 25 (27) times, AT THE SAME TIME, changing color in the following color sequence: Work 12 more rows with A, (2 rows with B, 2 rows with A) 5 times, 4 rows with C, 4 rows with A, 4 rows with C, then work with A until you have 55 (59) sts, end with a RS row as the last row you work.

Shape Armhole

Row 1 (WS): With A, bind off 22 (26) sts, p to end of row – 33 sts. Change to C.

Increase Row (RS): K1, M1, k to end of row – 34 sts.

Next Row: Purl.

Rep last 2 rows 2 (4) times – 36 (38) sts.

Bind off.

RIGHT TRIANGLES (make 2)

Cast on and work same as Left Triangle to Shape Armhole, end with a WS row as the last row you work.

Shape Armhole

Row 1 (RS): With A, bind off 22 (26) sts, k to end of row – 33 sts.

Next Row: Purl.

Change to C.

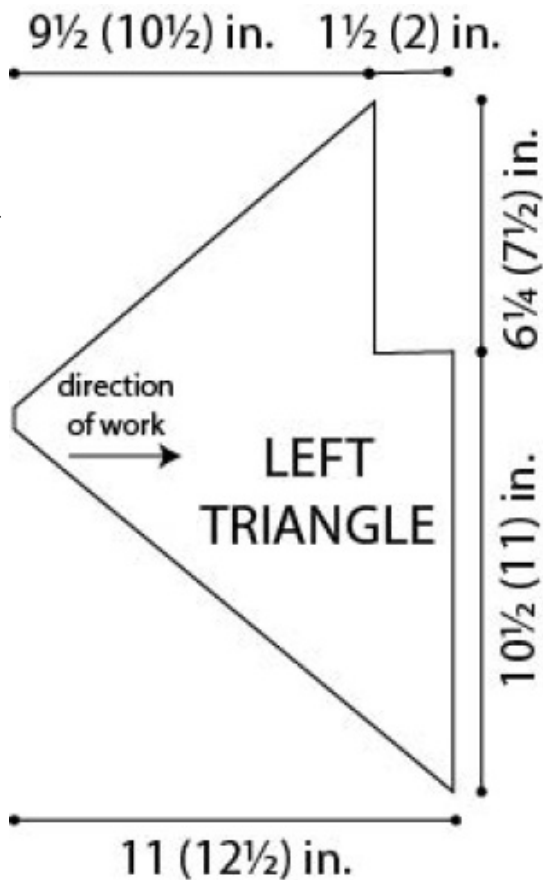
Increase Row (RS): K to last st, M1, k1 – 34 sts.

Next Row: Purl.

Rep Increase Row – 35 sts.

Rep last 2 rows 1 (3) more times – 36 (38) sts.

Bind off.



SLEEVES (make 2)

With longer needle and A, cast on 38 (42) sts.

Work in K3, p1 Rib until piece measures about 4 in. (10 cm) from beg.
Change to D.

Beg with a RS row, work in St st for 6 rows with D, then work (4 rows with A, 4 rows with C) 3 times – total of 30 rows worked, and you have ended with a WS row as the last row worked.

Begin Shaping

Note: When working the following portion of the Sleeve, change color as follows: Work 8 rows with A, (2 rows with B, 2 rows with A) 5 times, 2 rows with B, 6 rows with A, 6 rows with D, and 2 rows with A.

Increase Row (RS): K2, M1, k to last 2 sts, M1, k2 – 40 (44) sts.

Work even in St st for 11 (5) rows.

Rep Increase Row – 42 (46) sts.

Rep last 12 (6) rows 1 (4) more times – 44 (54) sts.

Work even in St st until color sequence is complete, end with a WS row as the last row you work.

Shape Sleeve Cap (top of Sleeve)

Work with A only for remainder of Sleeve.

Row 1 (RS): Bind off 2 sts, k to end of row – 42 (52) sts.

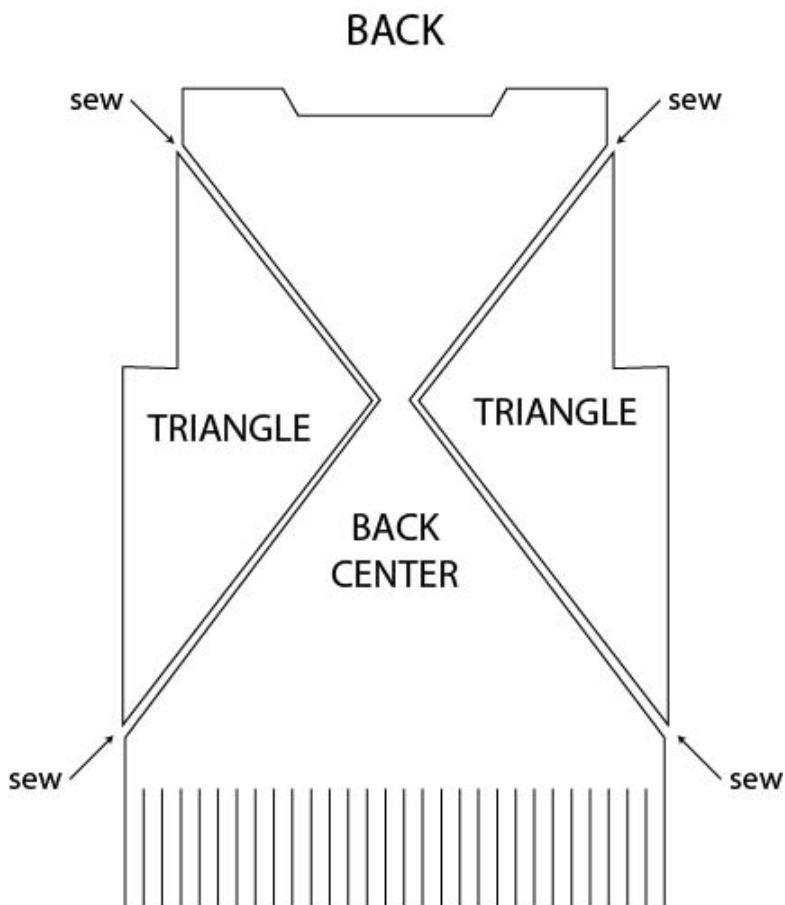
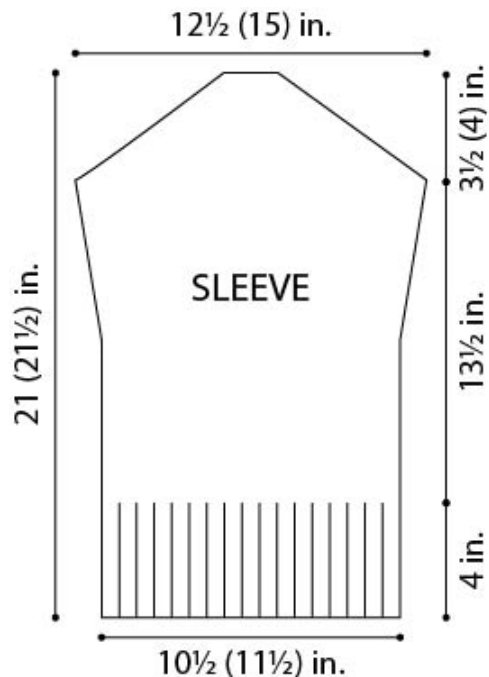
Row 2: Bind off 2 sts p to end of row – 40 (50) sts.

Rep last 2 rows 8 (10) more times – 8 (10) sts.

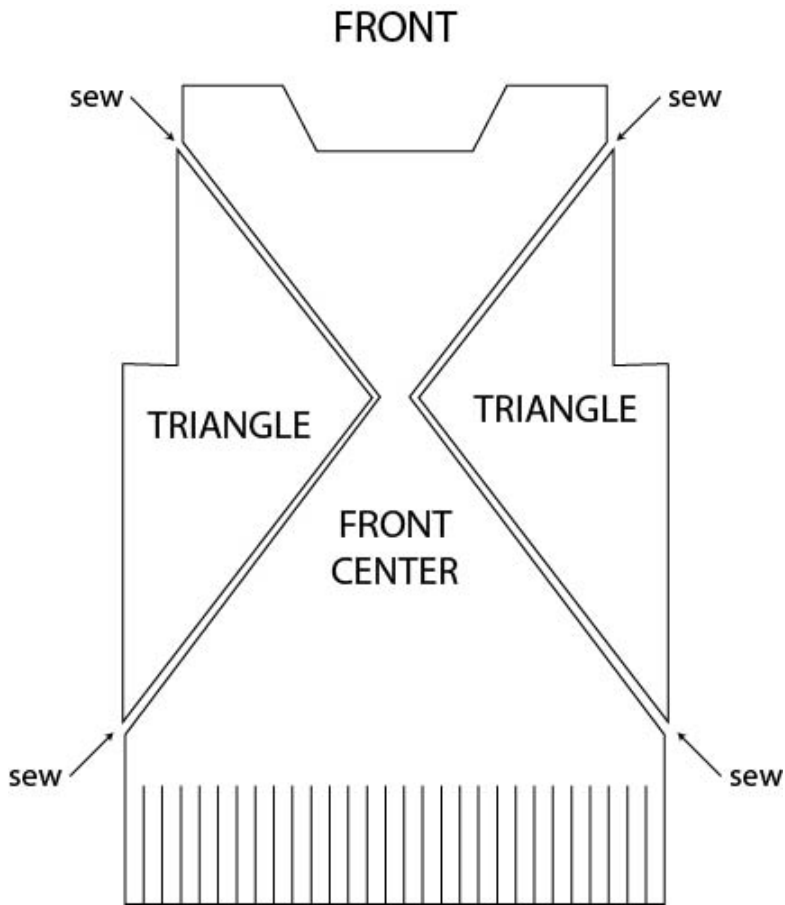
Bind off.

FINISHING

Following diagram, sew Back Center, Left Triangle, and Right Triangle tog to make Back.



Following diagram, sew Front Center and remaining 2 Triangles together to make Front. Sew shoulder seams.



Neckband

With shorter needle and A, pick up and k76 (80) sts evenly spaced around neck edge. Place marker for beg of rnd. Join by working the first st on the left hand needle with the working yarn from the right hand needle.

Rnds 1-3: *K3, p1; rep from * around.

Rnds 4-7: Knit.

Bind off.

Sew in Sleeves. Sew side and Sleeve seams.

Weave in ends.
