MATERIALS

- 860-153 Lion Brand Vanna's Choice Yarn: Black
3 Balls (A)
- 860-100 Lion Brand Vanna's Choice Yarn: White
3 Balls (B)
- Lion Brand Knitting Needles- Size 9 [5.5 mm]
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size H-8 (5 mm)
- Lion Brand Split Ring Stitch Markers
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

**Vanna's Choice® (Article #860). 100% Premium Acrylic*

400, 401, 403: 92% Acrylic, 8% Rayon

402: 96% Acrylic, 4% Rayon; package size: **Solids:** 3.5 oz (100 g), 170 yards (156 m)

Prints, Tweeds, & Heathers: 3 ozs (85 g) , 145 yards (133 meters)

Twists: 2.5 oz (70 g), 121 yards (111 meters)



GAUGE:

16 sts + 28 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) over Patterns #1 and #2.

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

STITCH EXPLANATION:

PATTERN STITCHES

Note: Sl sts should always be slipped as if to purl.

Pattern #1 (worked over any number of sts)

Row 1 (RS): With B, knit.

Row 2: Rep Row 1.

Rows 3 and 4: With A, knit.

Rep Rows 1-4 for Pattern #1.

Pattern #2 (worked over any number of sts)

Row 1 (RS): With A, knit.

Row 2: Rep Row 1.

Rows 3 and 4: With B, knit.

Rep Rows 1-4 for Pattern #2.

Pattern #3 (worked over an even number of sts)

Row 1 (RS): With B, knit.

Row 2: With B, purl.

Row 3: With A, *k1, sl 1 wyib; rep from * across.

Row 4: With A, *sl 1 wyif, p1; rep from * across.

Rep Rows 1-4 for Pattern #3.

Pattern #4 (worked over an even number of sts)

Row 1 (RS): With A, knit.

Row 2: With A, purl.

Row 3: With B, *k1, sl 1 wyib; rep from * across.

Row 4: With B, *sl 1 wyif, p1; rep from * across.

Rep Rows 1-4 for Pattern #4.

Pattern #5 (worked over a multiple of 8 sts)

Row 1 (RS): With B, knit.

Row 2: With B, purl.

Row 3: With A, *k4, sl 4 wyib; rep from * across.

Row 4: With A, *sl 4 wyif, k4; rep from * across.

Rows 5 and 6: Rep Rows 1 and 2.

Row 7: With A, *sl 4 wyib, k4; rep from * across.

Row 8: With A, *k4, sl 4 wyif; rep from * across.

Rep Rows 1-8 for Pattern #5.

Pattern #6 (worked over a multiple of 8 sts)

Row 1 (RS): With A, knit.

Row 2: With A, purl.

Row 3: With B, *k4, sl 4 wyib; rep from * across.

Row 4: With B, *sl 4 wyif, k4; rep from * across.

Rows 5 and 6: Rep Rows 1 and 2.

Row 7: With B, sl 4 wyib, k4; rep from * across.

Row 8: With B, *k4, sl 4 wyif; rep from * across.

Rep Rows 1-8 for Pattern #6.

Pattern #7 (worked over a multiple of 4 sts)

Row 1 (RS): With B, knit.

Row 2: With B, purl.

Row 3: With A, *k3, sl 1 wyib; rep from * across.

Row 4: With A, *sl 1 wyif, k3; rep from * across.

Row 5: With B, *k1, sl 1 wyib, k2; rep from * across.

Row 6: With B, *p2, sl 1 wyif, p1; rep from * across.

Rep Rows 3-6 for Pattern #7.

Pattern #8 (worked over a multiple of 4 sts)

Row 1 (RS): With A, knit.

Row 2: With A, purl.

Row 3: With B, *k3, sl 1 wyib; rep from * across.

Row 4: With B, *sl 1 wyif, k3; rep from * across.

Row 5: With A, *k1, sl 1 wyib, k2; rep from * across.

Row 6: With A, *p2, sl 1 wyif, p1; rep from * across.

Rep Rows 3-6 for Pattern #8.

Pattern #9 (worked over a multiple of 4 sts)

Row 1 (RS): With B, knit.

Row 2: With B, purl.

Row 3: With A, *k3, sl 1 wyib; rep from * across.

Row 4: With A, *sl 1 wyif, p3; rep from * across.

Row 5: With B, *k2, sl 1 wyib, k1; rep from * across.

Row 6: With B, *p1, sl 1 wyif, p2; rep from * across.

Row 7: With A, *sl 1 wyib, k3; rep from * across.

Row 8: With A, *p3, sl 1 wyif; rep from * across.

Row 9: With B, *k1, sl 1 wyib, k2; rep from * across.

Row 10: With B, *p2, sl 1 wyif, p1; rep from * across.

Rep Rows 3-10 for Pattern #9.

Pattern #10 (worked over a multiple of 4 sts)

Row 1 (RS): With A, knit.

Row 2: With A, purl.

Row 3: With B, *k3, sl 1 wyib; rep from * across.

Row 4: With B, *sl 1 wyif, p3; rep from * across.

Row 5: With A, *k2, sl 1 wyib, k1; rep from * across.

Row 6: With A, *p1, sl 1 wyif, p2; rep from * across.

Row 7: With B, *sl 1 wyib, k3; rep from * across.

Row 8: With B, *p3, sl 1 wyif; rep from * across.

Row 9: With A, *k1, sl 1 wyib, k2; rep from * across.

Row 10: With A, *p2, sl 1 wyif, p1; rep from * across.

Rep Rows 3-10 for Pattern #10.

NOTES:

1. Shawl is worked in one piece in 10 panels of 2 stitch patterns each.
2. When you see 'as established' in the instructions, this means to continue in the current pattern st, lining up sts as in previous rows.
3. With yarn in front (wyif) refers to the side of the work facing you as you work the row; with yarn in back (wyib) refers to the side of the work that is away from you as you work the row. To move yarn from front to back or back to front, bring yarn between needles. Take care not to wrap yarn over a needle, as this could create an additional st.

SHAWL

Note: On rows that begin with a sl st, always slip as if to purl.

With A, cast on 64 sts.

First Panel

Row 1 (RS): With A, k1, work Row 1 of Pattern #8 across 40 sts, place marker (pm), work Row 1 of Pattern #2 to last st, k1.

Row 2: Sl 1, work next row of Pattern #2 to marker, sl marker (sm), work next row of Pattern #8 to last st, k1.

Row 3: Sl 1, work next row of Pattern #8 to marker, sm, work next row of Pattern #2 to last st.

Rep Rows 2 and 3 until piece measures about 9 in. (23 cm) from beg, ending with a WS row as the last row you work and removing marker when working last row.

Second Panel

Row 1 (RS): Sl 1, work Row 1 of Pattern #1 over 24 sts, pm, work Row 1 of Pattern #3 to last st, k1.

Row 2: Sl 1, work next row of Pattern #3 to marker, sm, work next row of Pattern #1 to last st, k1.

Continue as established, always slipping the first st as if to purl and knitting the last st, working patterns as established until second panel measures about 7 in. (18 cm), ending with a WS row as the last row you work and removing marker when working last row.

Third Panel

Row 1 (RS): Sl 1, work Row 1 of Pattern #6 over 48 sts, pm, work Row 1 of Pattern #2 to last st, k1.

Row 2: Sl 1, work next row of Pattern #2 to marker, work next row of Pattern #6 to last st, k1.

Continue as established, always slipping the first st as if to purl and knitting the last st, working patterns as established until third panel measures about 4 in. (10 cm), ending with a WS row as the last row you work and removing marker when working last row.

Fourth Panel

Row 1 (RS): Sl 1 (for edge st), work Row 1 of Pattern #1 over 22 sts; work Row 1 of Pattern #9 to last st, k1 (for edge st).

Row 2: Sl 1 (for edge st), work next row of Pattern #9 over 40 sts; work next row of Pattern #1 to last st, k1 (for edge st).

Continue as established, always slipping the first st as if to purl and knitting the last st, working patterns as established until fourth panel measures about 9 in. (23 cm), ending with a WS row as the last row you work and removing marker when working last row.

Fifth Panel

Row 1 (RS): Sl 1, work Row 1 of Pattern #4 over 34 sts, pm, work Row 1 of Pattern #2 to last st, k1.

Row 2: Sl 1, work next row of Pattern #2 over 28 sts, sm, work next row of Pattern #4 to last st, k1. Continue as established, always slipping the first st as if to purl and knitting the last st, working patterns as established until fifth panel measures about 7 in. (18 cm), ending with a WS row as the last row you work and removing marker when working last row.

Sixth Panel

Row 1 (RS): Sl 1, work Row 1 of Pattern #1 over 14 sts, pm, work Row 1 of Pattern #5 to last st, k1.

Row 2: Sl 1, work next row of Pattern #5 over 48 sts, sm, work next row of Pattern #1 to last st, k1.

Continue as established, always slipping the first st as if to purl and knitting the last st, working patterns as established until sixth panel measures about 4 in. (10 cm), ending with a WS row as the last row you work and removing marker when working last row.

Seventh Panel

Row 1 (RS): Sl 1, work Row 1 of Pattern #10 over 44 sts, pm, work Row 1 of Pattern #2 to last st, k1.

Row 2: Sl 1, work next row of Pattern #2 over 18 sts, sm, work next row of Pattern #10 to last st, k1.

Continue as established, always slipping the first st as if to purl and knitting the last st, working patterns as established until seventh panel measures about 7 in. (18 cm), ending with a WS row as the last row you work and removing marker when working last row.

Eighth Panel

Row 1 (RS): Sl 1, work Row 1 of Pattern #1 over 14 sts, pm, work Row 1 of Pattern #7 to last st, k1.

Row 2: Sl 1, work next row of Pattern #7 over 48 sts, sm, work next row of Pattern #1 to last st, k1.

Continue as established, always slipping the first st as if to purl and knitting the last st, working patterns as established until eighth panel measures about 4 in. (10 cm), ending with a WS row as the last row you work and removing marker when working last row.

Ninth Panel

Work same as first panel.

Tenth Panel

Work same as second panel.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

Fringe

For each fringe, cut 4 strands of yarn, each about 11 in. (28 cm) long. Hold strands together and fold in half. With crochet hook, draw fold through edge of Afghan, forming a loop. Pull ends of fringe through this loop and tighten.

On first panel, attach 19 fringes of A across cast on edge of Pattern #8. Across cast on edge of Pattern #2, attach 7 fringes of A alternated with 6 fringes of B.

On tenth panel, attach 12 fringes of B along bound-off edge of Pattern #1. Across bound-off edge of Pattern #3, attach 20 fringes, each made with 2 strands of A and 2 strands of B.

Trim fringe ends evenly.
