SIZE: One Size

MATERIALS

- 923-201 Lion Brand Ice Cream: Cotton Candy
2 Balls (A) **Ice Cream (Article #923). 100% Acrylic; package size: 3.50oz/100.00 gr. (394yds/360m) pull skeins*
- 923-301 Lion Brand Ice Cream: Sprinkles - Berry Burst
1 Ball (B)
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size G-6 (4 mm)
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)



GAUGE:

1 ripple + 5 1/2 rows = about 3 1/4 in. (8.5 cm) in Deep Chevron ripple pattern.

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

STITCH EXPLANATION:

dc3tog (dc 3 sts together) (Yarn over, insert hook in next st and draw up a loop, yarn over, draw through 2 loops) 3 times, yarn over and draw through all 4 loops on hook – 2 sts decreased.

sc3tog (sc 3 sts together) (Insert hook in next st and draw up a loop) 3 times, yarn and draw through all 4 loops on hook – 2 sts decreased.

NOTES:

1. Afghan is worked in one piece in a Deep Chevron ripple pattern.
2. When working ripple crochet, your piece may not lay flat until you've worked a few rows (how many rows depends on your yarn and gauge).
3. The deep ripple pattern in this design is created by working (dc3tog) twice to form 'valleys' and working 3 dc in each of 2 sts to form 'peaks'. In each row, take care that valleys are centered over valleys and peaks are centered over peaks of previous row.
4. A border is worked around the entire outside edge of the Afghan.
5. To change yarn color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete st. Proceed with new color. Cut old color, leaving a long tail to weave in later.



AFGHAN

With A, ch 129.

Row 1: Work 2 dc in 4th ch from hook (3 skipped ch count as first dc), dc in next 3 ch, (dc3tog) twice, dc in next 3 ch, *3 dc in each of next 2 ch, dc in next 3 ch, (dc3tog) twice, dc in next 3 ch; rep from * to last ch, 3 dc in last ch – you will have 9 ripples at the end of this row.

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as first dc), turn, 2 dc in first st, dc in next 3 sts, (dc3tog) twice, dc in next 3 sts, *3 dc in each of next 2 sts, dc in next 3 sts, (dc3tog) twice, dc in next 3 sts; rep from * to beg ch, 3 dc in top of beg ch.

Rows 3-60: Rep Row 2 and change color as in following Stripe Sequence: Work 4 more rows with A, 4 rows with B, 14 rows with A, 12 rows with B, 14 rows with A, 4 rows with B, and 6 rows with A.

Change to B in last st of last row.

Do not fasten off.

Border

Rnd 1: With B, ch 1, turn, (3 sc in next st, sc in next 5 sts, sc3tog, sc in next 5 sts) 8 times, 3 sc in next st, sc in next 5 sts, sc3tog, sc in next 4 sts, 3 sc in top of beg ch; working in ends of rows, sc as evenly spaced as possible along side edge; working across opposite side of foundation ch, sc in first 6 ch, 3 sc in next ch, (sc in next 5 ch, sc3tog, sc in next 5 ch, 3 sc in next ch) 8 times, sc in each ch to end of foundation; working in ends of rows, sc as evenly spaced as possible along side edge; join with sl st in first sc.

Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.
