SKILL LEVEL: Easy (Level 2)

SIZE: One Size

Finished Width About 38 in. (96.5 cm)

Finished Length About 22 1/2 in. (57 cm)

CORRECTIONS: (applied Feb 15, 2016)

Row 29: With E, ch 1, turn, sc in first st, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp, ~~sc in next sc~~, *6 sc in next ch-6 sp, sc in next sc; rep from * to turning ch-sp, 2 sc in turning ch-sp, sc in 3rd ch of turning ch and change to A - 195 sc.

- 761-149 Lion Brand 24/7 Cotton: Silver
2 Balls (D)
- 761-110 Lion Brand 24/7 Cotton: Navy
1 Ball (E)
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size G-6 (4 mm)
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

*24/7 Cotton (Article #761). 100% Mercerized Cotton; package size: 3.50oz/100.00 gr. (186yds/170m) pull skeins



GAUGE:

17 1/2 sts + 8 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) in Mesh pattern.

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

STITCH EXPLANATION:

PATTERN STITCHES

Mesh Pattern

Row 1 (RS): Ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, sk first st, *dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, sk next st; rep from * to turning ch-sp, dc in turning ch-sp, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch.

Row 2: Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), turn, sk first 2 sts, dc in next ch-1 sp, *ch 1, sk next st, dc in next ch-1

sp; rep from * to last 2 sts, ch 1, sk next st, dc in top of turning ch.
Rep Rows 1 and 2 for Mesh pattern.

Fan Lace Pattern

Row 1 (RS): Ch 1, turn, sc in first dc, sk next ch-3 sp, 4 dc in next sc, *ch 3, sc in next ch-7 sp, 4 dc in next sc; rep from * to turning ch, sc in 3rd ch of turning ch.

Row 2: Ch 6 (counts as dc, ch 3), turn, sc in first dc of first 4-dc group, *ch 7, sk rem 3 dc of same 4-dc group, sk next sc, sk next ch-3 sp, sc in first dc of next 4-dc group; rep from * across working last sc in first dc of last 4-dc group, ch 3, sk rem 3 dc of last 4-dc group, dc in last sc.

Rep Rows 1 and 2 for Fan Lace pattern.

NOTES:

1. Two Rectangles are made separately, then sewn together following diagrams to make the Poncho.
2. Yarn colors and pattern stitches are changed to create stripes and textures.
3. To change yarn color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete st. Proceed with new color. Fasten off old color.

RECTANGLES (make 2)

With E, ch 196.

Row 1 (RS): With E, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across -195 sc.

Mesh Section

Row 2: With A, ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), turn, sk first 2 sts, dc in next st, *ch 1, sk next st, dc in next st; rep from * to end of row - 98 dc and 97 ch-1 sps.

Rows 3-5: Beg with Row 1 of pattern, work in Mesh pattern with A, changing to B in last st of Row 5.

Rows 6-11: With B, continue in Mesh pattern as established - you will have 99 dc and 96 ch-1 sps on RS rows, and 98 dc and 97 ch-1 sps on WS rows.

Change to C in last st of Row 11.

Fan Lace Section

Row 12: With C, ch 6 (counts as dc, ch 3), turn, sk first 2 dc, sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 7, (sk next dc, sk next ch-1 sp) 3 times, sc in next dc, *ch 7, (sk next ch-1 sp, sk next dc) 3 times, sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 7, (sk next dc, sk next ch-1 sp) 3 times, sc in next dc; rep from * to last ch-1 sp, ch 3, sk last ch-1 sp, sk next dc, dc in top of turning ch - 2 dc, 28 sc, 27 ch-7 sps, and 2 ch-3 sps.

Rows 13-15: Beg with Row 1 of pattern, work in Fan Lace pattern with C, changing to E in last st of Row 15.

Row 16: With E, work next row of Fan Lace pattern, changing to D in last st.

Rows 17-27: With D, continue in Fan Lace pattern as established - 29 sc, twenty-eight 4-dc groups, and 27 ch-3 sps on RS rows, and 2 dc, 28 sc, 27 ch-7 sps, and 2 ch-3 sps on WS rows.

Change to E in last st of Row 27.

Row 28: With E, ch 5 (counts as dc, ch 2), turn, sc in first dc of first 4-dc group, *ch 6, sk rem 3 dc of same 4-dc group, sk next sc, sk next ch-3 sp, sc in first dc of next 4-dc group; rep from * across working last sc in first dc of last 4-dc group, ch 2, sk rem 3 dc of last 4-dc group, dc in last sc - 2 dc, 28 sc, 27 ch-6 sps, and 2 ch-2 sps.

Row 29: With E, ch 1, turn, sc in first st, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp, *6 sc in next ch-6 sp, sc in next sc; rep from * to turning ch-sp, 2 sc in turning ch-sp, sc in 3rd ch of turning ch and change to A - 195 sc.

Mesh Section

Row 30: With A, rep Row 2.

Rows 31-33: With A, beg with Row 1 of pattern, work in Mesh pattern for 3 rows.

Change to D in last st of Row 33.

Fan Lace Section

Row 34: With D, rep Row 12.

Row 35: With D, work Row 1 of Fan Lace pattern, changing to C in last st.

Row 36: With C, work Row 2 of Fan Lace pattern.

Row 37: With C, work Row 1 of Fan Lace pattern, changing to B in last st.

Rows 38 and 39: With B, rep Rows 28 and 29.

Mesh Section

Row 40: With B, rep Row 2.

Row 41: With B, work Row 1 of Mesh pattern, changing to A in last st.

Row 42: With A, ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, sk first st, dc in each dc and ch-1 sp to turning ch-sp, dc in turning ch-sp, dc

in 3rd ch of turning ch, change to E in last st – 195 dc.

Row 43: With E, ch 1, turn, sc in each st across.


Row 44: With E, ch 1, turn, sl st in each st across.

Fasten off.

FINISHING

Step 1: Following diagram, sew Rectangles tog along one long side, leaving about 12 in. (30.5 cm) unsewn for neck.

STEP 1




Step 2: Following diagram, fold piece in half to measure about 38 x 22 1/2 in. (96.5 x 57 cm). Measure 8 in. (20.5 cm) up from lower edge, then sew sides tog for about 1 in. (2.5 cm).

Unsewn edges below 1 in. (2.5 cm) seam are for side slits, unsewn edges above seam are for armholes.

Weave in ends.
