Free Knitting Pattern from Lion Brand Yarn Lion Brand® Color Clouds Cobble Hill Cowl

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*Color Clouds (Article #546). 100% Acrylic; package size:

3.50oz/100.00 gr. (55yds/50m) pull skeins

SKILL LEVEL: Beginner (Level 1)

SIZE: One Size

Finished circumference About 22 in. (56 cm)

Finished height About 8 in. (20 cm)

MATERIALS

• 546-202 <u>Lion Brand Color</u> <u>Clouds: Rainforest</u> 1 Ball

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- <u>Lion Brand Knitting Needles -</u> Size 17 [13 mm]
- <u>Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt</u> <u>Needles (Set of 6)</u>



GAUGE:

 $6 \frac{1}{2} \text{ sts} + 8 \text{ rows} = \text{about 4 in. (10 cm) over Section I.}$

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

NOTES:

- 1. Cowl is worked in one piece as a rectangle and then seamed.
- 2. Cowl is worked in 5 sections with 3 different (and super easy) stitch patterns.
- 3. After you've tried the different stitch patterns, make another Cowl using just the stitch pattern you like best!

COWL

Cast on 13 stitches.

Section I

Knit 10 rows.

Section II

Row 1 (wrong side): Knit 2, purl 9, knit 2.

Row 2 (right side): Knit.

Rows 3-12: Repeat Rows 1 and 2.

Section III

Rows 1-10: Knit 1, *purl 1, knit 1; repeat from * across to end of row.

Section IV

Repeat Section II.

Section V

Repeat Section I.

Bind off and cut yarn, leaving a long yarn tail.

FINISHING

Thread yarn tail into blunt needle, then sew ends of piece together to make a ring for Cowl. Weave in ends.
