GAUGE:

1 Square = about 7 x 7 in. (18 x 18 cm).

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

STITCH EXPLANATION:

sc-blo (single crochet in back loop only) Insert hook in back loop only of indicated st and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook.

sc3tog (single crochet 3 sts together) (Insert hook in next st and draw up a loop) 3 times, yarn and draw through all 4 loops on hook – 2 sts decreased.

NOTES:

1. 42 Squares are worked separately, then sewn together following a diagram to make the Afghan.
2. Each Square is worked from one corner diagonally across to opposite corner. The yarn color is changed at the center (widest part) of the Square.
3. To change yarn color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete st. Proceed with new color. Fasten off old color.
4. A border is worked all the way around outside edge of Afghan with 3 strands of yarn held together.

SQUARES (make 42 in colors below)

Make 5 Squares using D for first color and A for 2nd color.

Make 7 Squares using D for first color and B for 2nd color.

Make 4 Squares using D for first color and C for 2nd color.

Make 5 Squares using E for first color and A for 2nd color.

Make 1 Square using E for first color and B for 2nd color.

Make 4 Squares using E for first color and C for 2nd color.

Make 8 Squares using F for first color and A for 2nd color.

Make 4 Squares using F for first color and B for 2nd color.

Make 4 Squares using F for first color and C for 2nd color.

With smaller hook and first color, ch 2.

Row 1 (RS): Work 3 sc in 2nd ch from hook.

Row 2 (Increase Row): Ch 1, turn, 2 sc in first st, sc-blo in next st, 2 sc in last st – you will have 5 sc at the end of this row.

Rows 3-5: Ch 1, turn, (sc, sc-blo) in first st, sc-blo in each st to last st, (sc-blo, sc) in last st – 11 sc at the end of Row 5.

Row 6: Ch 1, turn, sc in first st, sc-blo in each st to last st, sc in last st.

Rows 7-9: Rep Rows 3-5 and change to 2nd color in last st of Row 9 – 17 sc at the end of Row 7.

Row 10: Ch 1, turn, sc in first st, sc-blo in each st to last st, sc in last st.

Rows 11-13 (Decrease Row): Ch 1, turn, sk first st, sc-blo in each st to last 2 sts, sk next st, sc in last st – 11 sc at the end of Row 13.

Row 14: Rep Row 10.

Rows 15-18: Rep Row 11 four times – 3 sc at the end of Row 18.

Row 19: Ch 1, turn, sc3tog.

Fasten off.

FINISHING

Following diagram, sew Squares into 6 strips of 7 Squares each. Sew strips together to make Afghan.

Border

From RS with larger hook, join 1 strand each of C, D, and F held together with a sl st anywhere along outside edge of Afghan. Ch 1, work sc evenly spaced around the outside edge, working 3 sc in each corner. Join with sl st in beg sc. Fasten off.

Weave in ends.
