- 640-303 <u>Lion Brand Wool-Ease</u> <u>Thick & Quick Yarn: Constellation</u> 1 Ball
- <u>Brittany Birchwood Double</u> <u>Pointed Needles - Size 13</u>
- Lion Brand Split Ring Stitch Markers
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)
- Additional Materials
  4 sew-on rhinestone beads
  Sewing needle and thread
- Heathers, Twists, Prints, Stripes: 80% Acrylic, 20% Wool; Wheat & Wood: 86% Acrylic; 10% Wool; 4% Rayon; Oatmeal & Barley & Grey Marble: 82% Acrylic; 10% Wool; 8% Rayon; Metallics: 79% Acrylic, 20% Wool, 1% Metallic Poly; package size: Solids, Heathers, Twists, Tweeds: 6 oz./170g (106 yd/97 m)

Prints, Stripes: 5 oz./140g (87 yd/80 m)

Metallics: 5 oz./140g (92 yd/84 m)

### GAUGE:

9 sts = about 4 in. (10cm) in St st worked in rnds (k every rnd).

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

### STITCH EXPLANATION:

#### Lazy Daisy Stitch

Bring threaded blunt needle through from WS to RS of Beanie. This point is the base of the petal. \*Insert needle as closely as possible to base of petal, then bring needle back up at tip of petal, looping yarn under needle. Pull needle away from you. Insert needle into Beanie just over the looped yarn. Take needle to the WS to anchor the stitch; repeat from \* for each petal. Make as many petals as desired.

#### NOTES:

- 1. Beanie is worked in one piece in the round on double pointed needles.
- 2. Flowers are embroidered onto the Beanie, then a bead is sewn to the center of each flower.

#### BEANIE

With A, cast on 44 sts. Divide sts onto 4 needles, with 11 sts on each needle. Place marker for beginning of rnd.

Join by working the first st on the left hand needle with the working yarn from the right hand needle and being careful not to twist sts.

Work in St st worked in rnds (k every rnd) until piece measures about 11 in. (28 cm) from beginning.

## Shape Crown (top of Beanie)

Decrease Rnd 1: Knit 2 sts together around – you will have 22 sts at the end of this rnd.

Decrease Rnd 2: Repeat Rnd 1.

Cut yarn, leaving a long yarn tail. Thread yarn tail through remaining 11 sts and pull to gather. Knot yarn.

## FINISHING

Embroider 4 Lazy Daisy flowers onto Beanie. With sewing needle and thread, sew a bead to the center of each flower.

Weave in ends.
