- 640-302 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Wool-Ease Thick & Quick</u> <u>Yarn: Cabernet</u> 1 Ball (A)
- 640-305 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Wool-Ease Thick & Quick</u> <u>Yarn: Galaxy</u> 1 Ball (B)
- <u>Brittany Birchwood</u>
   <u>Double Pointed Needles</u>
   Size 11
- Lion Brand Split Ring <u>Stitch Markers</u>
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)
- Additional Materials Craft store feather cluster and jewel brooch as desired Sewing needle and thread

\*<u>Wool-Ease Thick & Quick (</u>Article #640). Solids, Heathers, Twists, Prints, Stripes: 80% Acrylic, 20% Wool; Wheat & Wood: 86% Acrylic; 10% Wool; 4% Rayon; Oatmeal & Barley & Grey Marble: 82% Acrylic; 10% Wool; 8% Rayon; Metallics: 79% Acrylic, 20% Wool, 1% Metallic Poly; package size: Solids, Heathers, Twists, Tweeds: 6 oz./170g (106 yd/97 m) Prints, Stripes: 5 oz./140g (87 yd/80 m) Metallics: 5 oz./140g (92 yd/84 m)



### GAUGE:

9 sts = about 4 in. (10cm) in Slip Stitch pattern

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

#### Making a Gauge Swatch

### STITCH EXPLANATION:

PATTERN STITCHES Slip Stitch pattern (worked in the rnd over a multiple of 3 sts) Rnd 1: With B \*k1, sl 1, k1; rep from \* around.
Rnd 2: With B, knit.
Rnd 3: With A, \*sl 1, k2; rep from \* around.
Rnd 4: With A, knit.
Rep Rnds 1-4 for Slip Stitch pattern.

## NOTES:

- 1. Hat is worked in one piece in the round on double pointed needles.
- 2. Slip all sl sts as if to purl.

### HAT

With A, cast on 45 sts.> Divide sts onto 4 needles, with 12 sts on each of 3 needles and 9 sts on the 4th needle. Place marker for beg of rnd. Join by working the first st on the left hand needle with the working yarn from the right hand needle and being careful not to twist sts.

Purl 2 rnds, knit 2 rnds.

Beg with Rnd 1, work in Slip Stitch pattern until piece measures about 8 1/2 in. (21.5 cm) from beg, end with a Rnd 4 as the last rnd you work.

#### Shape Crown (top of Hat)

Rnds 1 and 2: With A, purl.

Cut A and continue with B only.

Rnd 3: With B, k2tog, knit to end of rnd.

Rnds 4 and 5: Knit.

Rnd 6 (Decrease Rnd): K2tog around – you will have 22 sts at the end of this rnd.

Rnds 7 and 8: Knit.

Rnd 9 (Decrease Rnd): Rep Rnd 6 – 11 sts.

Rnd 10 (Decrease Rnd): K2tog around to last st, k1.

Cut yarn, leaving a long yarn tail. Thread yarn tail through remaining 6 sts and pull to gather. Knot securely.

### FINISHING

With sewing needle and thread, sew feather cluster to Hat. Pin brooch to Hat at base of feathers. Weave in ends.
