MATERIALS

- 828-207 [Lion Brand Shawl in a Ball: Feng Shui Grey](#)
1 Ball
- [Lion Brand Knitting Needles - Size 10.5 \[6.5 mm\]](#)
- [Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles \(Set of 6\)](#)

**Shawl in a Ball (Article #828). 58% cotton, 39% acrylic, 3% other; package size: 5.30oz/150.00 gr. (518yds/473m) pull skeins*



GAUGE:

17 sts = about 4 in. (10 cm) over Stockinette st (k on RS, p on WS).

When you match the [gauge](#) in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

NOTES:

Shawl is worked back and forth in one piece at a loose gauge to create an airy drape.

SHAWL

Loosely cast on 80 sts.

Work in Stockinette st (k on RS, p on WS) until only about 30 in. (76 cm) of yarn remains.

Bind off loosely.

FINISHING

Blocking

Dampen Shawl thoroughly. Spread a towel onto a flat surface, then lay Shawl onto towel and smooth into shape. Gently shape Shawl to match finished measurements. Use blocking wires if desired to further shape Shawl. Allow to air dry. Weave in ends.
