- 861-150 [Lion Brand Vanna's Glamour Yarn: Platinum](#)
6 Balls (A)
- 790-600 [Lion Brand Homespun Yarn: Clouds](#)
3 Balls (B)
- [Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size F-5 \(3.75 mm\)](#)
- [Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size H-8 \(5 mm\)](#)
- [Lion Brand Split Ring Stitch Markers](#)

**Vanna's Glamour (Article #861). 96% Acrylic, 4% Metallic Polyester; package size: 1.75oz/49.61 gr. (202yds/185m) pull skeins*

**Homespun® (Article #790). 98% Acrylic, 2% Polyester; package size: 6.00oz/170.00 gr. (185yds/169m) pull skeins*



GAUGE:

12 sc or 24 dc = about 4 in. (10 cm) over Rows 4-7 of Cowl pattern.

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

NOTES:

1. Cowl is worked in one piece and then partly seamed.
2. Yarn A is always used with 2 strands held together.
3. We used smaller crochet hooks than indicated on yarn labels to make a lovely dense texture on the Cowl.

COWL

With smaller hook and 2 strands of A held together, ch 75.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across – 74 sc.

Rows 2 and 3: With smaller hook and 2 strands of A held together, ch 1, turn, sc in each st across. Change to larger hook and 1 strand of B.

Row 4: With larger hook and 1 strand of B, ch 3, turn, work 2 dc in each st across – you will have 148 dc.

Change to smaller hook and 2 strands of A.

Row 5: With smaller hook and 2 strands of A held together, ch 1, turn, *skip next st, sc in next st; rep from * across – you will have 74 sc.

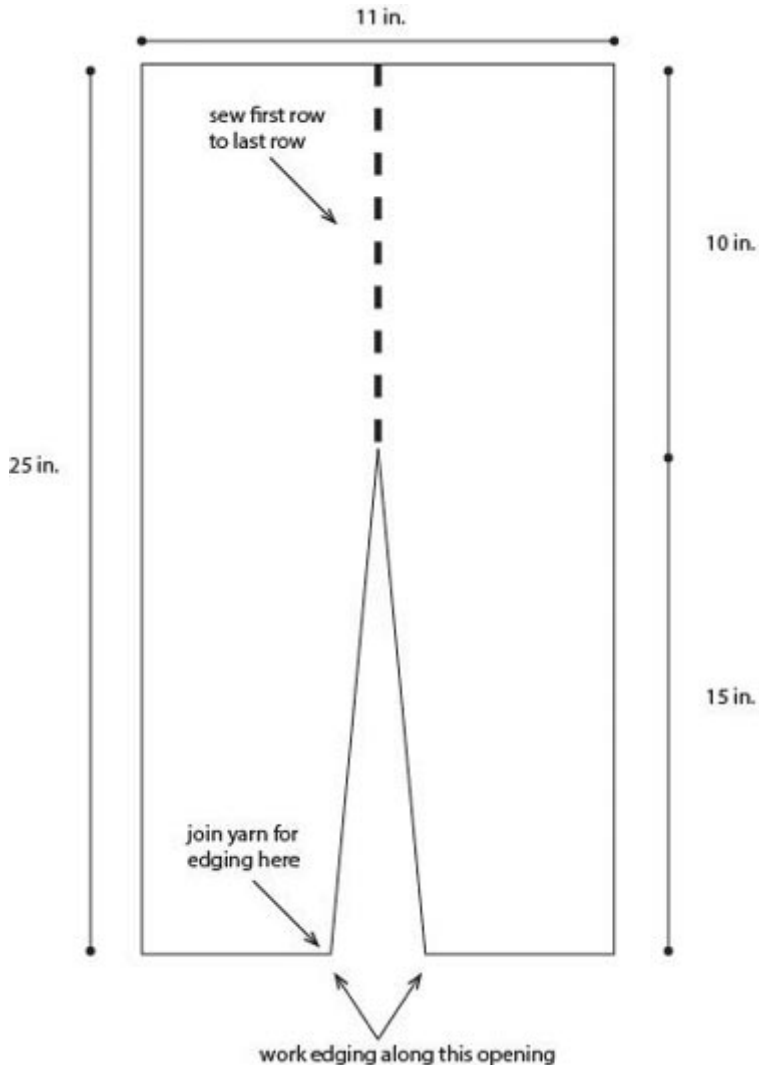
Rows 6 and 7: With smaller hook and 2 strands of A held together, ch 1, turn, sc in each st across.

Rep Rows 4-7 until piece measures about 22 in. (56 cm) from beginning, end with a Row 7 as the last row you work. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Bring first row of piece to meet last row.

With 1 strand of A, and following diagram, sew edges of piece together for 10 in. (25.5 cm).



Edging

Edging is worked along the open edges of the Cowl – refer to diagram for placement.

From RS, with smaller hook and referring to diagram, join 2 strands of A with a slip st at open edge of Cowl.

Row 1: Ch 1, work sc evenly spaced along open edges of Cowl below seam.

Rows 2 and 3: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across.

Place a marker in center st of last row.

The edging continues with rows of sc worked over a portion of the sts of Row 3, leaving remaining sts unworked.

You'll be working edging along one side of the Cowl opening at a time.

First Side of Edging

Row 4: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st along edge, stopping about 3 in. (7.5 cm) before you reach the marker.

Row 5: Ch 1, turn, leaving remaining sts unworked, sl st in each st for about 2 in. (5 cm), ch 1, sc in each st to end.

Row 6: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st, stopping about 4 in. (10 cm) before you reach the marker.

Row 7: Ch 1, turn, leaving remaining sts unworked, sl st in each st for about 1 in. (2.5 cm), ch 1, sc in each st to end.

Row 8: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st, stopping about 8 in. (20.5 cm) before you reach the marker.

Row 9: Rep Row 7.

Row 10: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st, stopping about 9 1/2 in. (24 cm) before you reach the marker.

Row 11: Ch 1, turn, leaving remaining sts unworked, sl st in next st, ch 1, sc in each st to end.

Fasten off.

Second Side of Edging

From WS, join 2 strands of A in corner of opposite open edge and rep Rows 4-11 of First Side of Edging.
At the end of Row 11, do NOT fasten off.

Last Row: Continuing with 2 strands of A held together, sc evenly along entire open edge of Cowl.

Fasten off.

Weave in ends.
