SKILL LEVEL: Easy (Level 2)

SIZE: 6 mos, 12 mos, 24 months (2 yrs)

Cardi

Finished Chest About 22 (23 1/2, 25 1/2) in. (56 (59.5, 65) cm)

Finished Length About 11 (12, 13) in. (28 (30.5, 33) cm), not including collar

Tam

Finished Circumference About 19 in. (48.5 cm), will stretch to fit a range of sizes

Note: Pattern is written for smallest size with changes for larger sizes in parentheses. When only one number is given, it applies to all sizes. To follow pattern more easily, circle all numbers pertaining to your size before beginning.

MATERIALS

• 923-201 <u>Lion Brand Ice Cream: Cotton</u> <u>Candy</u>

1 1, 2 Ball (A)

923-301 <u>Lion Brand Ice Cream:</u>
 <u>Sprinkles - Berry Burst</u>
 1 1, 2 Ball (B)

*<u>Ice Cream</u> (Article #923). 100% Acrylic; package size: 3.50oz/100.00 gr. (394yds/360m) pull skeins

- Lion Brand Split Ring Stitch Markers
- Lion Brand Stitch Holders
- Pom pom Maker
- <u>Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles</u> (Set of 6)
- Additional Materials
 Circular knitting needle size 5 (3.75 mm), 36 in. (91.5 cm) long
 2 buttons, 5/8 in. (16 mm) in diameter
 Sewing needle and thread



GAUGE:

18 sts + 24 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) in Seed st.

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

STITCH EXPLANATION:

kfb (knit into front and back) Knit next st without removing it from left needle, then k through back of same st -1 st increased.

yo (yarn over)

An increase that also creates a small decorative hole (eyelet) in the fabric, worked as follows:

- 1. Bring yarn to front, between the needles.
- 2. Take yarn to back, over the right needle. This creates the new st. You are now ready to proceed with the next st as instructed.

PATTERN STITCHES

Seed St (worked over an even number of sts)

Row 1 (RS): *K1, p1; rep from * to end of row.

Row 2: K the purl sts and p the knit sts.

Rep Row 2 for Seed st.

Seed St (worked over an odd number of sts)


Row 1 (RS): *K1, p1; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 2: K the purl sts and p the knit sts.

Rep Row 2 for Seed st.

NOTES:

- 1. Body of Cardi is worked in one piece to armholes, then divided and fronts and back are worked separately.
- 2. A circular needle is used to accommodate the large number of stitches. Work back and forth in rows on the circular needle as if working with straight needles.
- 3. The Sleeves are worked separately, then sewn to body. The collar is worked directly onto Cardi.
- 4. Tam is worked in one piece, back and forth in rows on the circular needle.



CARDI BODY

With A, cast on 132 (140, 152) sts.

Work in Seed st until piece measures about 7 (7 1/2, 8) in. (18 (19, 20.5) cm) from beg, end with a WS row as the last row you work.

Decrease Row (RS): *K2tog, k2; rep from * to end of row – you will have 99 (105, 114) sts at the end of this row.

Knit 1 row.

Change to B.

Cut A.

Divide for Fronts and Back

Row 1 (RS): K23 (24, 26) sts and slip these sts onto a holder for right front, bind off next 9 (10, 11) sts for armhole, k until there are 35 (37, 40) sts on right needle and slip these sts onto a holder for back, bind off next 9 (10, 11) sts for armhole, k to end of row - 23 (24, 26) sts rem on needle for left front.

Shape Left Front

Work in Garter st (k every row), over left front sts only, until left front measures about 4 (4 1/2, 5) in. (10 (11.5, 12.5) cm) from dividing row, end with a WS row as the last row you work.

Shape Shoulder

Next Row (RS): Bind off 7 (8, 9) sts, slip rem 16 (16, 17) sts onto a holder for collar.

Shape Back

Return 35 (37, 40) sts for back to needle and join B, so that you are ready to work a WS row.

Work in Garter st over back sts only, until back measures same as left

front to shoulder, end with a WS row as the last row you work.

Shape Shoulders

Next Row (RS): Bind off 7 (8, 9) sts, k to end of row – 28 (29, 31) sts.

Next Row: Bind off 7 (8, 9) sts, k to end of row – 21 (21, 22) sts.

Slip rem 21 (21, 22) sts onto a holder for back collar.

Shape Right Front

Return 23 (24, 26) sts for right front to needle and join B, so that you are ready to work a WS row.

Knit 1 row.

Buttonhole Row (RS): K3, k2tog, yo, k to end of row.

Work in Garter st for 11 (13, 15) rows.

Rep last 12 (14, 16) rows once more.

Work in Garter st until right front measures same as back to shoulders, end with a RS row as the last row you work.

Shape Shoulder

Next Row (WS): Bind off 7 (8, 9) sts, slip rem 16 (16, 17) sts onto a holder for collar.

SLEEVES (make 2)


With B, cast on 30 (30, 34) sts.

Work in Garter st for 5 rows.

Increase Row: K1, kfb, k to last 2 sts, kfb, k1 – 32 (32, 36) sts. Rep last 6 rows 5 (7, 9) times – 42 (46, 54) sts when all increases have been completed.

Work in Garter st until Sleeve measures 5 (7, 8 1/2) in. (12.5 (18, 21.5) cm) from beg.

Bind off.



FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams.

Collar

From RS with A and working across sts on holders, k16 (16, 17) right front collar sts, k21 (21, 22) back collar sts, and k16 (16, 17) left front collar sts – 53 (53, 56) sts.

Work in Seed st for 14 rows.

Bind off.

Sew Sleeve seams, then sew Sleeves into armholes.

With sewing needle and thread, sew buttons to left front opposite buttonholes.

Weave in ends.

TAM

With A, cast on 86 sts.

Work in Seed st until piece measures about 1 in. (2.5 cm) from beg, end with a WS row as the last row you work. Change to B.

Cut A.

Increase Row (RS): K2, *kfb, k2; rep from * to end of row – you will have 114 sts at the end of this row. Work in Garter st for 19 rows.

Next Row (RS): K1, *place marker, k16; rep from * 6 more times, k1.

Next Row: Knit.

Decrease Row: *K to marker, slip marker, k2tog; rep from * 6 more times, k to end of row – 107 sts.

Rep last 2 rows until only 9 sts rem.

Cut yarn, leaving a long yarn tail. Thread tail through remaining sts, then pull to gather top of Tam. Sew seam.

FINISHING

With A and following package directions, make a pom-pom. Tie pom-pom to top of Tam. Weave in ends.
