SKILL LEVEL: Easy (Level 2)

SIZE: One Size

MATERIALS

- 640-530 Lion Brand Wool-Ease Thick & Quick Yarn: Acai
2 Balls
 - Lion Brand Knitting Needles- Size 13 [9 mm]
 - Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)
 - Additional Materials
2 double pointed knitting needles size 13 (9 mm) for 3-needle bind off
- *Wool-Ease Thick & Quick (Article #640). Solids, Heathers, Twists, Prints, Stripes: 80% Acrylic, 20% Wool;
Wheat & Wood: 86% Acrylic; 10% Wool; 4% Rayon;
Oatmeal & Barley & Grey Marble: 82% Acrylic; 10% Wool; 8% Rayon;
Metallics: 79% Acrylic, 20% Wool, 1% Metallic Poly;
package size: Solids, Heathers, Twists, Tweeds: 6 oz./170g (106 yd/97 m)
Prints, Stripes: 5 oz./140g (87 yd/80 m)
Metallics: 5 oz./140g (92 yd/84 m)*



GAUGE:

16 sts = about 4 in. (10 cm) over Row 2 of Scarf pattern.

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

NOTES:

1. Beginning end of Scarf is worked first in 2 separate strips.
2. Strips are joined, then work continues over all sts.
3. As you near the end of the Scarf, sts are divided and again worked in 2 separate groups to create a slit.
4. Stitches are then bound off using a 3-needle bind off.
5. Scarf is reversible and can be worn multiple ways. Experiment in front of a mirror to find your favorite way to wrap and tie it.



SCARF

Note: You will be casting on 2 groups of 10 sts. Each group of 10 sts will be connected to its own ball of yarn, and you will work on the sts in each group separately, making 2 separate strips.

With one ball of yarn, cast on 10 sts. With a second ball of yarn, cast on 10 sts. You have cast on both sets of sts onto the same needle.

Row 1: K2, *p2, k2; rep from * across first 10 sts using attached ball of yarn; with second ball of yarn, p2, **k2, p2; rep from ** across second group of 10 sts.

Row 2: Knit the knit sts and purl the purl sts across first 10 sts on needle with attached ball of yarn: rep with second ball of yarn across second group of 10 sts.

Rep Row 2 until pieces measure about 12 in. (30.5 cm) from beginning.

Joining Row: With first ball of yarn, rep Row 2 across first 10 sts on needle. Leaving a long yarn tail, cut second ball of yarn and rep Row 2 across second group of 10 sts with first ball of yarn. Using just one ball of yarn joins the 2 strips.

Next Row: Knit the knit sts and purl the purl sts across all 20 sts.

Rep last row until piece measures about 18 in. (45.5 cm) from Joining Row.

Shape slit

Dividing Row: With attached ball of yarn, rep Row 2 across first 10 sts on needle; join second ball of yarn and rep Row 2 across second group of 10 sts.

Working on each group of 10 sts with separate balls of yarn, rep Row 2 until piece measures about 3 in. (7.5 cm) from Dividing Row.

Note: As you bind off, you'll create a folded end on the Scarf – an element of this interesting design.

3-Needle Bind off: Slip first 10 sts on needle onto one double-pointed needle (dpn); slip last 10 sts on needle onto a second dpn. Fold Scarf so that you can hold both dpn in your left hand, with one dpn in front of the other. One ball of yarn will be attached at the front end of the dpn and one at the back end of the dpn. Leaving a long yarn tail, cut the second ball of yarn. With a straight needle in your right hand, k2tog (the first st on the front dpn together with the first st on the back dpn), then *k2tog (the next st on the front dpn and the next st on the back dpn). Pass first st on right hand needle over st just worked to bind off one st. Rep from * until all sts are bound off.

FINISHING

Weave in yarn ends.
