SIZE: One Size

About 15 x 66 in. (38 x 167.5 cm), not including fringe

MATERIALS

• 595-215 <u>Lion Brand Color</u> Waves: Twilight

1 Ball (A)

• 595-222 <u>Lion Brand Color</u> <u>Waves: Playground</u>

1 Ball (B)

• 595-204 <u>Lion Brand Color</u> <u>Waves: Cactus Flower</u>

1 Ball (C)

• 595-211 Lion Brand Color

Waves: Starboard 1 Ball (D)

• <u>Lion Brand Crochet Hook -</u> <u>Size J-10 (6 mm)</u>

• <u>Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt</u> <u>Needles (Set of 6)</u> *<u>Color Waves</u> (Article #595). 80% Acrylic, 20% Wool; package size: 3.50oz/100.00 gr. (306yds/280m) pull skeins



GAUGE:

1 ripple + 10 rows = about 5 in. (12.5 cm).

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

NOTES:

- 1. Scarf is worked in 2 halves in a ripple crochet pattern.
- 2. The Scarf halves are crocheted together.
- 3. The ripple pattern is easy to do, but it's important to remember that you may need to work several rows before the ripple pattern becomes clear.
- 4. To change yarn color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete the stitch. Proceed with new color. Fasten off old color.
- 5. Fringe is attached to the completed Scarf.

SCARF

First Half

With A, ch 54.

Row 1 (RS): Work 2 dc in 4th ch from hook (3 skipped ch count as first dc), 2 dc in each of next 2 ch, (sk next ch, dc in next ch) 5 times, *sk next ch, 2 dc in each of next 6 ch, (sk next ch, dc in next ch) 5 times; rep from * to last 4 ch, 2 dc

in each of next 3 ch, dc in last ch - you will have 53 dc (3 ripples) at the end of this row.

Row 2: Ch 1, turn, sc in each dc across working last sc in top of beg ch - 53 sc.

Row 3: Ch 3 (counts as first dc), turn, 2 dc in each of next 3 sts, (sk next st, dc in next st) 5 times, *sk next st, 2 dc in each of next 6 sts, (sk next st, dc in next st) 5 times; rep from * to last 5 sts, sk next st, 2 dc in each of next 3 sts, dc in last st.

Rows 4-66: Rep Rows 2 and 3, changing yarn color as follows: Work 5 more rows with A, 4 rows with B, 2 rows with A, 4 rows with A, 4 rows with A, 6 rows with B, 6 rows with A, 6 rows w

Row 67 (RS): With A, ch 1, turn, sl st in first 2 sts, (sc in next 3 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, dc in next 2 sts, tr in next 2 sts, dc in next 2 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, sc in next 3 sts, sl st in next st) 3 times, working last sl st in top of beg ch.

Row 68: With A, ch 1, sc in each st across.

Fasten off.

Second Half

Work same as First Half, changing yarn color as follows: Work 8 rows with A, 4 rows with D, 2 rows with A, 4 rows with A, 4 rows with A, 6 rows with B, and 6 rows with A.

Do not fasten off.

Join Halves

Hold Halves with RS together and sts of last rows matching. From WS, working through both thicknesses and in back loops only, sl st in each st across to join halves. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

Fringe

For each fringe, cut 4 strands of A about 10 in. (25.5 cm) long. Hold the strands together and fold in half. Use crochet hook to draw fold through end of Scarf, forming a loop. Pull ends of fringe through this loop. Pull to tighten. Make 24 fringes along each end of Scarf.

Trim fringe evenly.
