SKILL LEVEL: Beginner (Level 1)

SIZE: One Size

About 3-4 in. (7.5-10 cm) squares

MATERIALS

- 865-205 Lion Brand Vanna's Palettes: Essential
1 Ball
- Lion Brand Knitting Needles- Size 8 [5 mm]
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

**Vanna's Palettes (Article #865). 100% Acrylic; package size: 0.35oz/10.00 gr. (17yds/16m) pull skeins*



GAUGE:

Exact gauge is not essential to this project.

NOTES:

Shawls are made with simple repetitive stitches, allowing the knitter to focus on positive thoughts or meditate while knitting. Use whichever color you like for each Shawl – the yarn package will make 8 Shawls.

Garter st Shawl

Note: Garter st is worked by knitting every st on every row.

Cast on 16 sts.

Knit 30 rows or until your piece is a square.

Bind off loosely.

Weave in ends.

Seed st Shawl

Note: When working Seed st, you alternate the knits and purls to create a lovely texture.

Cast on 15 stitches.

Row 1: K1, *p1, k1, rep from * to end of row.

Rep Row 1 about 25 more times or until your piece is a square.

Bind off.

Weave in ends.

Stockinette st Shawl with Garter borders

Note: For Stockinette st, the right side rows are knit and the wrong side rows are purled.

Cast on 16 stitches.

Knit 4 rows.

Row 1: K3, p10, k3.

Row 2: Knit.

Rep Rows 1 and 2 six more times.

Knit 4 rows.

Bind off.

Weave in ends.

Garter st Shawl with Yarnovers

Yarnover

An increase that also creates a small decorative hole (eyelet) in the knitting, worked as follows:

1. Bring yarn to front, between the needles.
2. Take yarn to back, over the right hand needle. This creates the new st. You are now ready to proceed with the next st as instructed.

Cast on 15 sts.

Rows 1-4: Knit.

Row 5: K1, *yarn over, k1, rep from * to end of row.

Row 6: K1, *drop the yarn over, k1; rep from * to end of row.

Rep Rows 1 - 6 twice more.

Knit 3 rows.

Bind off.

Weave in ends.

Diagonal Garter st Shawl

Note: This Shawl is knit from corner to corner – increasing the sts on the first half, then decreasing the sts on the second half.

Cast on 1 st.

Increase Half Row 1: Knit into front and back of the stitch – you will now have 2 sts.

Row 2: K1, knit in front and back of st – 3 sts.

Row 3: Knit to last st, knit into front and back of last st.

Repeat Row 3 until you have 20 stitches.

Decrease Half Next Row: Knit to the last 2 sts, knit 2 sts together.

Rep last row until you have just 1 st left.

Fasten off last stitch.

Weave in ends.

Fisherman's Rib Shawl

Note: Fisherman's Rib is based on a simple k1, p1 rib – but you'll work the knit sts in the row below.

Cast on 12 sts.

Purl 1 row.

Row 1: *P1, knit next st in the row below; repeat from * across to last 2 sts, p2.

Rep Row 1 until your piece is a square.

Bind off.

Weave in ends.

Small Checks Shawl

Note: The checks are made by alternating groups of knit and purl sts.

Cast on 15 sts.

Row 1: K3, *p3, k3; rep from * to end of row.

Row 2: P3, *k3, p3; rep from * to end of row.

Rows 3 and 4: Rep Row 1.

Row 5: Rep Row 2.

Row 6: Rep Row 1.

Rep Rows 1-6 until your piece is a square.

Bind off.

Weave in ends.

Tunisian Rib Shawl

Note: Tunisian Rib increases sts on Row 1, then decreases back to the original number of sts on Row 2.

Yarnover

An increase that also creates a small decorative hole (eyelet) in the knitting, worked as follows:

1. Bring yarn to front, between the needles.
2. Take yarn to back, over the right hand needle. This creates the new st. You are now ready to proceed with the next st as instructed.

Cast on 17 sts.

Row 1 (Wrong Side): K1, *yarn over, slip next st with yarn in back, k1; rep from * across the row.

Row 2: K1, *k the yarn over and slipped st of the previous row together through the back loops, k1; rep from * across the row.

Rep Rows 1 and 2 until your piece is a square, ending with a Row 2 as the last row you work.

Bind off.

Weave in ends.
