MATERIALS

- 545-143 <u>Lion Brand Landscapes:</u> Bordeaux
 - 4 5, 5, 6, 6 Balls (A)
- 755-200 <u>Lion Brand Unique Yarn:</u> <u>Harvest</u>
 - 4 5, 5, 6, 6 Balls (B)
- <u>Lion Brand Knitting Needles- Size</u> 9 [5.5 mm]
- <u>Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt</u> <u>Needles (Set of 6)</u>



*<u>Unique</u> (Article #755). 100% Acrylic; package size: 3.50oz/100.00 gr. (109yds/100m) pull skeins



GAUGE:

 $15 \frac{1}{2} \text{ sts} + 28 \text{ rows} = \text{about 4 in. (10 cm) in Slip St pattern.}$

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

STITCH EXPLANATION:

kfb (knit in front and back) Knit next st without removing it from left needle, then k through back of same st – 1 st increased.

PATTERN STITCH

Slip St Pattern (worked over a multiple of 4 sts)

Row 1 (RS): With B, knit.

Row 2: With B, *k1, p1; rep from * to end.

Rows 3 and 4: With A, knit.

Row 5: With B, *sl 1 wyib, k3; rep from * to end.

Row 6: With B, *p3, sl 1 wyif; rep from * to end.

Row 7: With A, *k1, sl 3 wyib; rep from * to end. **Row 8:** With A, *sl 3 wyib, k1; rep from * to end.

Row 9: With B, *sl 1 wyib, k1; lift the strand of A that was stranded behind the 3 sl sts on Row 8 and place it onto

the left needle (as when working a M1), with right needle, knit this strand together with the next st on left needle; k1; rep from * to end.

Row 10: With B, *k3, sl 1 wyib; rep from * to end.

Row 11: With A, knit.

Row 12: With A, *k1, p1; rep from * to end.

Row 13: With B, *k1, sl 1 wyib; rep from * to end.

Row 14: With B, knit.

Rep Rows 1-14 for Slip St pattern.

NOTES:

- 1. Cardigan is made in 5 pieces: Back, 2 Fronts, and 2 Sleeves.
- 2. With yarn in front (wyif) refers to the side of the work facing you as you work the row; with yarn in back (wyib) refers to the side of the work that is away from you as you work the row. To move yarn from front to back or back to front, bring yarn between needles. Take care not to wrap yarn over a needle, this could create an additional st.
- 3. When you see 'as established' in the instructions, this means to continue in the current pattern st, ensuring that the sts line up as in previous rows.
- 4. When you see 'work even' in the instructions, this means to continue on in the pattern st you have established without changing the st count by increasing, decreasing, or binding off.

BACK

With B, cast on 74 (82, 90, 98, 106) sts.

Row 1 (RS): K1 (selvedge st), work Row 1 of Slip St pattern to last st, k1

Row 2: K1, work next row of Slip St pattern to last st, k1.

Keeping first and last st in Garter st (k every row), work in Slip St pattern as established until piece measures about 13 in. (33 cm) from beg, end with a WS row as the last row you work.

NOTE: When shaping armholes and shoulders, continue to keep the first and last sts in Garter st.

Shape Armholes

Row 1: Bind off 4 (5, 5, 6, 8) sts, work in Slip St pattern as established to last st, k1 – you will have 70 (77, 85, 92, 98) sts at the end of Row 1.

Row 2: Bind off 4 (5, 5, 6, 8) sts, work in Slip St pattern to end of row - 66 (72, 80, 86, 90) sts.

Rows 3 and 4: Bind off 3 (4, 4, 5, 6) sts, work in Slip St pattern to end of row - 60 (64, 72, 76, 78) sts at the end of Row 4.

Rows 5 and 6: Bind off 2 (2, 3, 4, 4) sts, work in Slip St pattern to end of row – 56 (60, 66, 68, 70) sts at the end of Row 6.

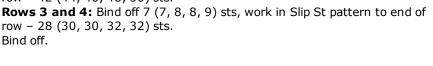
Rows 7 and 8: Bind off 1 (1, 2, 2, 2) st(s), work in Slip St pattern to end of row - 54 (58, 62, 64, 66) sts at the end of Row 8.

Work even in Slip St pattern until armholes measure about 8 (8 1/2, 9, 9 1/2, 10) in. (20.5 (21.5, 23, 24, 25.5) cm), end with a WS row as the last row you work.

Shape Shoulders

Rows 1 and 2: Bind off 6 (7, 8, 8, 8) sts, work in Slip St pattern to end of row - 42 (44, 46, 48, 50) sts.

row - 28 (30, 30, 32, 32) sts. Bind off.





With B, cast on 38 (42, 46, 50, 54) sts.

Row 1 (RS): K1 (selvedge st), work Row 1 of Slip St pattern to last st, k1 (selvedge st).

Row 2: K1, work next row of Slip St pattern to last st, k1.

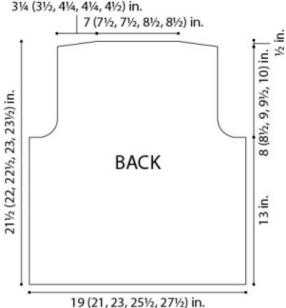
Keeping first and last st in Garter st, work in Slip St pattern as established until piece measures same as back to armholes, end with a WS row as the last row you work.

Shape Armhole

Row 1 (RS): Bind off 4 (5, 5, 6, 8) sts, work in Slip St pattern as established to last st, k1 – you will have 34 (37, 41, 44, 46) sts at the end of this row.

Rows 2, 4 and 6: K1, work in Slip St pattern to last st, k1.

Row 3: Bind off 3 (4, 4, 5, 6) sts, work in Slip St pattern to end of row - 31



(33, 37, 39, 40) sts.

Row 5: Bind off 2 (2, 3, 4, 4) sts, work in Slip St pattern to end of row – 29 (31, 34, 35, 36) sts.

Row 7: Bind off 1 (1, 2, 2, 2) st(s), work in Slip St pattern to end of row – 28 (30, 32, 33, 34) sts.

Work even in Slip St pattern until armhole measures about 5 1/2 (6, 6 1/2, 7, 7 1/2) in. (14 (15, 16.5, 18, 19) cm), end with a RS row as the last row you work.

Shape Neck

Row 1 (WS): Bind off 5 (6, 6, 6, 6) sts, work in Slip St pattern to end of row – 23 (24, 26, 27, 28) sts.

Rows 2, 4, 6 and 8: K1, work in Slip st pattern to last st, k1.

Row 3: Bind off 4 (4, 4, 5, 5) sts, work in Slip St pattern to end of row – 19 (20, 22, 22, 23) sts.

Row 5: Bind off 3 sts, work in Slip St pattern to end of row – 16 (17, 19, 19, 20 sts.

Row 7: Bind off 2 sts, work in Slip St pattern to end of row – 14 (15, 17, 17, 18) sts.

Row 9: Bind off 1 st, work in Slip St pattern to end of row – 13 (14, 16, 16, 17) sts.

Row 10: Rep Row 2.

Work even in Slip St pattern until piece measures same as Back to shoulders, end with a WS row as the last row you work.

Shape Shoulder

Row 1 (RS): Bind off 6 (7, 8, 8, 8) sts, work in Slip St pattern to end of row – 7 (7, 8, 8, 9) sts.

Row 2: Work even in Slip st pattern.

Bind off.

RIGHT FRONT

Work same as Left Front to Shape Armhole, end with a RS row as the last row you work.

Shape Armhole

Row 1 (WS): Bind off 4 (5, 5, 6, 8) sts, work in Slip St pattern as established to last st, k1 – you will have 34 (37, 41, 44, 46) sts at the end of this row.

Rows 2, 4 and 6: K1, work in Slip St pattern to last st, k1.

Row 3: Bind off 3 (4, 4, 5, 6) sts, work in Slip St pattern to end of row – 31 (33, 37, 39, 40) sts.

Row 5: Bind off 2 (2, 3, 4, 4) sts, work in Slip St pattern to end of row – 29 (31, 34, 35, 36) sts.

Row 7: Bind off 1 (1, 2, 2, 2) st(s), work in Slip St pattern to end of row – 28 (30, 32, 33, 34) sts.

Work even in Slip St pattern until armhole measures about 5 1/2 (6, 6 1/2, 7, 7 1/2) in. (14 (15, 16.5, 18, 19) cm), end with a WS row as the last row you work.

Shape Neck

Row 1 (RS): Bind off 5 (6, 6, 6, 6) sts, work in Slip St pattern to end of row – 23 (24, 26, 27, 28) sts.

Rows 2, 4, 6 and 8: K1, work in Slip st pattern to last st, k1.

Row 3: Bind off 4 (4, 4, 5, 5) sts, work in Slip St pattern to end of row – 19 (20, 22, 23, 23) sts.

Row 5: Bind off 3 sts, work in Slip St pattern to end of row – 16 (17, 19, 19, 20 sts.

Row 7: Bind off 2 sts, work in Slip St pattern to end of row – 14 (15, 17, 17, 18) ets

Row 9: Bind off 1 st, work in Slip St pattern to end of row – 13 (14, 16, 16, 17) sts.

Row 10: Rep Row 2.

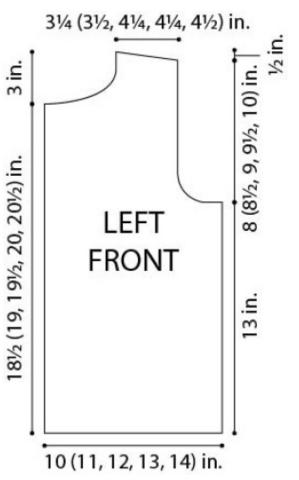
Work even in Slip St pattern until piece measures same as Back to shoulders, end with a RS row as the last row you work.

Shape Shoulder

Row 1 (WS): Bind off 6 (7, 8, 8, 8) sts, work in Slip St pattern to end of row – 7 (7, 8, 8, 9) sts.

Row 2: Work even in Slip st pattern.

Bind off.



SLEEVES (make 2)

With B, cast on 38 (38, 42, 42, 42) sts.

Row 1 (RS): K1 (selvedge st), work Row 1 of Slip St pattern to last st, k1 (selvedge st).

Row 2: K1, work next row of Slip St pattern to last st, k1.

Keeping first and last st in Garter st, work in Slip St pattern as established until piece measures about 6 in. (15 cm) from beg, end with a WS row as the last row you work.

Shape Sleeve

Increase Row: K1, kfb, work in Slip St pattern as established to last 2 sts, kfb, k1 - you will have 40 (40, 44, 44, 44) sts at the end of this row. Keeping first and last st in Garter st, work in Slip St pattern as established for 19 (13, 11, 7, 7) rows.

Rep last 20 (14, 12, 8, 8) rows 3 (5, 5, 7, 10) more times, working new sts into Slip St pattern – 46 (50, 54, 58, 64) sts.

Keeping first and last st in Garter st, work in Slip St pattern as established until piece measures about 18 (18, 18 1/2, 18 1/2, 19) in. (45.5 (45.5, 47, 47, 48.5) cm) from beg.

Shape Cap (top of Sleeve)

Row 1: Bind off 3 (4, 4, 5, 6) sts, work in Slip St pattern as established to last st, k1 - 43 (46, 50, 53, 58) sts.

Row 2: Bind off 3 (4, 4, 5, 6) sts, work in Slip St pattern to end of row – 40 (42, 46, 48, 52) sts.

Rows 3 and 4: Bind off 2 (2, 3, 4, 4) sts, work in Slip St pattern to end of row – 36 (38, 40, 40, 44) sts at the end of Row 4.

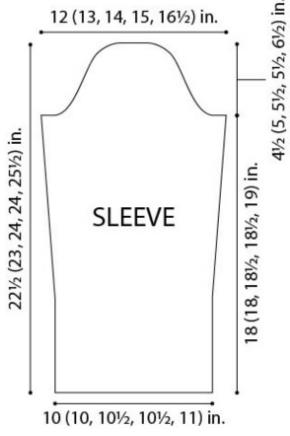
Rows 5 and 6: Bind off 1 (1, 1, 1, 2) st(s), work in Slip St pattern to end of row – 34 (36, 38, 38, 40) sts at the end of Row 6.

Row 7: K2tog, work in Slip St pattern to last 2 sts, k2tog – 32 (34, 36, 36, 38) sts.

Work in Slip St pattern for 3 rows.

Rep last 4 rows 4 (5, 6, 6, 7) more times – 24 sts.

Next 8 Rows: Bind off 2 sts, work in Slip St pattern to end of row - 8 sts.



FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams. Sew in Sleeves. Sew side and Sleeve seams.

Neckband

From RS with B, pick up and k74 (78, 78, 82, 82) sts evenly spaced around neck edge.

Row 1 (WS): K1 (selvedge st), beg with Row 2 of pattern, work in Slip St pattern to last st, k1 (selvedge st). Keeping first and last st in Garter st, work in Slip St pattern as established for 12 more rows. With B, bind off as if to knit.

Front Bands

From RS with B, pick up and k74 (78, 78, 82, 82) sts evenly spaced along right front edge including neckband.

Row 1 (WS): K1 (selvedge st), beg with Row 2 of pattern, work in Slip St pattern to last st, k1 (selvedge st). Keeping first and last st in Garter st, work in Slip St pattern as established for 2 more rows. With B, bind off as if to knit.

Rep to work Front Band on Left Front edge.

Weave in ends.
