

Free Knitting Pattern Lion Brand[®] Color Waves Cape Cod Baby Blanket Pattern Number: L60156



SKILL LEVEL - Easy

SIZE About 26 x 26 in. (66 x 66 cm)

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® Color Waves (Art. #595)
 - 211 Starboard 2 balls (A)
 - 215 Twilight 2 balls (B)
 - or colors of your choice
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle

ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

Circular knitting needle size 7 (4.25 mm), 29 in. (73.5 cm) long

<u>GAUGE</u>

18 sts = 4 in. (10 cm) in Garter st (k every row). BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

STITCH EXPLANATION

yo (yarn over)

An increase that also creates a small decorative hole (eyelet) in the fabric, worked as follows:

1. Bring yarn to the front, between the needles.

2. Take yarn to the back, over the right needle. This creates the new st. You are now ready to proceed with the next st as instructed.

<u>NOTES</u>

- 1. Blanket is worked diagonally in one piece, in Garter st (k every row) with an eyelet border.
- 2. For first half of Blanket, one stitch is increased on each row. For second half of Blanket, one stitch is decreased on each row.
- 3. Yarn overs are used to increase sts and create the eyelet border.
- Blanket is knit using 2 yarn colors for 2 rows each. Do not cut yarn between color changes, just carry the unused color along the side edge of the Blanket.
- 5. A circular needle is used to accommodate the large number of stitches. Work back and forth in rows as if working with straight needles.



BLANKET

With A, cast on 5 sts.
Row 1: Knit.
Row 2: K3, yo, k2 – 6 sts at the end of this row. Change to B.
Row 3: With B, k3, yo, k3 – 7 sts.
Row 4: K3, yo, k to end of row – 8 sts. Change to A.
Rep Row 4 until you have 164 sts, continuing to change colors every 2 rows.
Next (Decrease) Row: K2, k2tog, yo, k2tog, k to end of row – 163 sts.
Rep last row until you have only 5 sts. Bind off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

ABBREVIATIONS

k = knit k2tog = knit 2 together rep = repeat st(s) = stitch(es)
