

Free Crochet Pattern **Lion Brand® Color Waves** Shoreline Striped Scarf Pattern Number: L60178



SKILL LEVEL - Easy+

SIZE

About 8 x 68 in. (20.5 x 172.5 cm)

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® Color Waves (Art. #595)
 - 206 Marble 1 ball (A)
 - 203 Deep Blue Sea 1 ball (B)
 - or colors of your choice
- Lion Brand® crochet hook size K-10.5 (6.5 mm)
- Lion Brand® stitch markers
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle



GAUGE

1 pattern rep = about 2 1/2 in. (6.5 cm).

Note: One pattern rep consists of 1 shell and the following ch-3 sp. BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

STITCH EXPLANATION

shell (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in indicated st or ch-sp.

NOTES

- 1. Scarf is worked in one piece.
- After Row 2, the yarn color is changed every row. When the yarn color is changed, the old color is not cut. Instead, the loop is removed from the hook and placed on a st marker so that it does not unravel. The next time a dropped color is needed, the loop is removed from the marker and returned to the hook.
- Read instructions carefully and turn only when instructed. After Row 2, 2 rows are worked with RS facing and then 2 rows are worked with WS facing.
- 4. Vertical stripes are formed by working into sts "2 rows below" instead of into sts 1 row below as usual. To work into a st or ch-sp "2 rows below", work into the st or ch-sp that is in the row numbered 2 less than the row you are currently making. For example, a st "2 rows below" when making Row 5 is in Row 5 2 = Row 3.
- 5. For those who find a visual helpful, we've included a stitch diagram.

SCARF

With A, ch 28.

Row 1 (RS): Work 2 dc in 4th ch from hook (3 skipped ch count as dc), *ch 3, sk next 7 ch, shell in next ch; rep from * once more, ch 3, sk next 7 ch, 3 dc in last ch – you will have 2 shells, 3 ch-3 sps and one 3-dc group at beg and end of this row.

Row 2 (WS): Ch 3 (counts as hdc, ch 1), turn; working over first ch-3 sp, shell in 4th ch of next skipped 7 ch of foundation ch (between shells), *ch 3, sk next shell; working over next ch-3 sp, shell in 4th ch of next skipped 7 ch of foundation ch; rep from * once more, ch 1, hdc in top of beg ch-3 of Row 1 – 3 shells, 2 ch-3 sps, 2 ch-1 sps, and 1 hdc at beg and end of row. Remove loop of A from hook and place on st marker so that it does not unravel. Do not cut A.

Row 3 (RS): From RS, draw up a loop of B in first st, ch 3 (counts as dc), 2 dc in top of beg ch-3 2 rows below, *ch 3, sk next shell, working over next ch-3 sp, shell in ch-1 sp of next shell 2 rows below; rep from * once more, ch 3, sk next shell, 3 dc in last dc 2 rows below – 2 shells, 3 ch-3 sps and one 3-dc group at beg and end of row. Remove loop of B from hook and place on st marker so that it does not unravel. Do not cut B.

Row 4 (RS): From RS, insert hook in top of beg ch-3 of previous row, return dropped loop of A to hook and draw loop through, ch 3 (counts as hdc, ch 1); working over first ch-3 sp, shell in ch-1 sp of next shell 2 rows below, *ch 3, sk next shell; working over next ch-3 sp, shell in ch-1 sp of next shell 2 rows below; rep from * once more, ch 1, hdc in last dc of previous row – 3 shells, 2 ch-3 sps, 2 ch-1 sps, and 1 hdc at beg and end of row. Remove loop of A from hook and place on st marker so that it does not unravel. Do not cut A.

Row 5 (WS): From WS, insert hook in top of first st of previous row, return dropped loop of B to hook and draw loop through, ch 3 (counts as dc), 2 dc in top of first dc 2 rows below, *ch 3, sk next shell; working over next ch-3 sp, shell in ch-1 sp of next shell 2 rows below; rep from * once more, ch 3, skip next shell, 3 dc in top of beg ch-3 2 rows below – 2 shells, 3 ch-3 sps and one 3-dc group at beg and end of row. Remove loop of B from hook and place on st marker so that it does not unravel. Do not cut B.

Row 6 (WS): From WS, insert hook in top of beg ch-3 of previous row, return dropped loop of A to hook and draw loop through, ch 3 (counts as hdc, ch 1); working over first ch-3 sp, shell in ch-1 sp of next shell 2 rows below, *ch 3, sk next shell; working over next ch-3 sp, shell in ch-1 sp of next shell 2 rows below; rep from * once more, ch 1, hdc in last dc of previous row – 3 shells, 2 ch-3 sps, 2 ch-1 sps, and 1 hdc at beg and end of row. Remove loop of A from hook and place on st marker so that it does not unravel. Do not cut A.

Rep Rows 3-6 until piece measures about 68 in. (172.5 cm) from beg, end with a Row 6 worked with A as the last row you work. Fasten off B at the end of the last Row 5. Do not remove loop of A from hook.

Last Row (RS): With A, ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, 2 dc in first st 2 rows below, ch 1, sc in ch-1 sp of first shell, *ch 1; working over next ch-3 sp, shell in ch-1 sp of next shell 2 rows below, ch 1, sc in ch-1 sp of next shell; rep from * once more, ch 1, 3 dc in last dc 2 rows below – 2 shells, 3 sc, and one 3-dc group at each end of row.

Fasten off.

FINISHING

Fringe

Cut 18 strands of A and 24 strands of B each about 18 in. (45.5 cm) long. For each fringe, hold 3 strands of the same color yarn together and fold in half. Use crochet hook to draw fold through edge of Scarf, forming a loop. Pull ends of fringe through this loop. Pull to tighten. Make 7 fringe along each short end of Scarf, 3 A-colored fringe and 4 B-colored fringe. Trim fringe evenly.

Weave in ends.
