MATERIALS

 320-153 <u>Lion Brand Fun Fur</u> <u>Yarn: Black</u> 1 Ball (A) *<u>Fun Fur</u> (Article #320). 100% Polyester; package size: **Solids:** 1.75 oz/50g; 64 yd/58m balls **Prints:** 1.5 oz/40g; 57 yd/52m balls **Exotics:** 1.75 oz/50g; 55 yd/50m balls (**Note:** Exotics shades are lay flat to dry)

- 320-100 <u>Lion Brand Fun Fur</u> <u>Yarn: White</u> 1 Ball (B)
- Lion Brand Knitting Needles
 Size 11 [8 mm]



GAUGE:

13 stitches + 26 rows = 4" (10 cm) in Garter stitch (k every row). When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

SCARF

With A, cast on 22 stitches. Slip the first stitch as to knit at the beginning of each row. Work even in Garter Stitch until piece measures 30" or you run out of yarn.

Continue with B. Work even in Garter Stitch until piece measures 60" or you have $1\frac{1}{2}$ yds of yarn left. Bind off. Weave in loose ends.
