

Free Crochet Pattern Lion Brand® BonBons® Sneaker Booties

Pattern Number: L60235



SKILL LEVEL - Easy

SIZE

Newborn - about 6 months

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® BonBons® (Art. #601)
 - 620 Pastels 1 package
 - or color of your choice
- Lion Brand® crochet hook size H-8 (5 mm)
- Lion Brand® stitch markers
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle

GAUGE

18 sc = about 4 in. (10 cm).
BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.



STITCH EXPLANATIONS

dc2tog (double crochet 2 sts together) (Yarn over, insert hook in next st and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops) twice, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook – 1 st decreased.

hdc2tog (half double crochet 2 sts together) (Yarn over, insert hook in next st and draw up a loop) twice, yarn over and draw through all 5 loops on hook – 1 st decreased.

sc2tog (single crochet 2 sts together) (Insert hook in next st and draw up a loop) twice, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook – 1 st decreased.

NOTES

- 1. Sole of Bootie is worked in 2 pieces in continuous rnds (spiral). The 2 pieces are crocheted together to make the sole.
- 2. Body of Bootie is worked in joined rnds with RS always facing. Do not turn at beg of rnds.
- 3. Upper sides and tongue of Bootie are worked back and forth in rows.

BONBON YARN COLORS

White (A)

Yellow (B)

Peach (C)

BOOTIES (make 2)

Sole (make 2 – 1 with A and 1 with B)

Ch 7.

Rnd 1 (RS): Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 4 ch, 6 sc in last ch; working across opposite side of foundation ch, sc in next 5 ch; do not join, work in continuous rnds (spiral) – you will have 16 sts in this rnd.

Place a marker in last st made to indicate end of rnd. Move marker up as each rnd is completed.

Rnd 2: Work 2 sc in each of next 2 sts, sc in next 4 sts, 2 hdc in each of next 4 sts, sc in next 4 sts, 2 sc in each of last 2 sts – 24 sts.

Rnd 3: Sc in next st, 2 sc in each of next 2 sts, sc in next 5 sts, hdc in next st, 2 hdc in each of next 6 sts, hdc in next st, sc in next 5 sts, 2 sc in each of next 2 sts, sc in last st; join with sl st in first sc – 34 sts.

Fasten off.

Remove end of rnd marker.

Join Soles

Hold 1 sole of each color with WS tog and sts matching. Working through both thicknesses, join B with sl st in any st on outer edge, sl st in each st around. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Body

Note: Work now proceeds in joined rnds.

Hold one sole with B-colored side down. Find the center back heel st.

Rnd 4: From RS (outside) of bootie, working in back loops of A-colored layer of sole only, join C with sc in 8th st following center back heel st, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc of this rnd – 34 sc.

Rnd 5: Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc.

Rnd 6: Ch 1, working in back loops only, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc.

Rnd 7: Ch 1, sc in first 2 sts, (sc2tog) twice, hdc2tog, dc2tog, hdc2tog, (sc2tog) twice, sc in last 18 sts; join with sl st in first sc – 27 sts.

Rnd 8: Ch 1, (sc2tog) twice, hdc2tog, (sc2tog) twice, sc in next 6 sts, sc2tog, sc in next 2 sts, sc2tog, sc in next 5 sts; do not join – 20 sts. Do not fasten off.

Ankle

Note: Work now proceeds back and forth in rows.

Row 1: Ch 3, turn, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in next ch, sc in first 14 sc of Rnd 8; leave remaining 6 sts of Rnd 8 unworked for tongue – 16 sc.

Row 2: Ch 3, turn, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in next ch, sc in each st across – 18 sc.

Fasten off.

Tongue

Row 1: From RS, join C with sc in first unworked st of Rnd 8, sc in next 5 unworked sts – 6 sc.

Rows 2-4: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across.

Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

Thread blunt needle with a 7 in. (18 cm) length of yarn in color as desired. Draw yarn length through ends of rows on ankle, then tie into a bow. Repeat on second Bootie.
