

Free Knitting Pattern Lion Brand[®] Wool-Ease[®] Thick & Quick[®] Lady Violet's Shawl Pattern Number: L50005



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SKILL LEVEL - Easy

<u>SIZE</u>

About 22 x 50 in. (56 x 127 cm) at widest and longest

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand® Wool-Ease® Thick & Quick® (Art. #640)
 - 308 Starlight 3 balls
 - or color of your choice
- Lion Brand[®] circular knitting needle size 15 (10 mm), 29 in. (73.5 cm) long
- Lion Brand® stitch markers
- Lion Brand® large-eyed blunt needle

<u>GAUGE</u>

8 sts + 11 1/2 rows = about 4 in. (10 cm) over Rows 1-12. BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

STITCH EXPLANATIONS

kfb (knit into front and then back)

An increase worked as follows:

1. Knit the next st through the front loop, but do not remove the st from your left hand needle.

2. Knit the same st once more, this time inserting your needle through the back loop of the st. You will have created 2 loops (sts) on your right hand needle.

3. Drop the st from your left hand needle – you have increased 1 st.

yo (yarn over)

An increase that also creates a small decorative hole (eyelet) in the fabric, worked as follows:

1. Bring yarn to front, between the needles.

2. Take yarn to back, over the right needle. This creates the new st. You are now ready to proceed with the next st as instructed.

NOTES

- 1. Shawl begins at center back neck and is shaped by working yarn over (yo) increases.
- 2. A yarn over creates a new loop on your needle and is worked by wrapping the yarn around your right hand needle. Do not use an existing st to make a yarn over. The finished yarn over will leave an open space (like an eyelet) in your knitting—that is part of this design.
- 3. The first and last 2 sts of every row are always knit.



4. A circular needle is used to accommodate the large number of sts. Work back and forth on circular needle as if working on straight needles.

SHAWL

Cast on 5 sts. Rows 1 and 2: Knit. **Row 3:** K1, kfb, k1, kfb, k1 – you will have 7 sts at the end of Row 3. Row 4: Knit. **Row 5 (RS):** K2, yo, k1, yo, place marker (pm), k1, pm, yo, k1, yo, k2 – 11 sts. **Row 6:** K2, yo, k to last 2 sts slipping markers as you come to them, yo, $k^2 - 13$ sts. Row 7: K2, yo, k to marker, yo, slip marker (sm), k1, sm, yo, k to last 2 sts, yo, k2 – 17 sts. Rows 8-31: Rep Rows 6 and 7 twelve times – 89 sts at the end of Row 31. Row 32 (WS): Knit. Row 33: Rep Row 7 - 93 sts. **Rows 34 and 35:** Rep Rows 32 and 33 – 97 sts at the end of Row 35. Row 36: Knit. Row 37 (Eyelet Row – RS): K2, yo, k1, *yo, k2tog; rep from * to 1 st before marker, k1, yo, sm, k1, sm, yo, k1, **k2tog, yo; rep from ** to last 3 sts, k1, yo, k2 - 101 sts. Rows 38-43: Rep Rows 32 and 33 three times – 113 sts at the end of Row 43. Rows 44-59: Rep Rows 36-43 twice – 145 sts at the end of Row 59. Rows 60 and 61: Rep Rows 36 and 37 –149 sts at the end of Row 61. Row 62: Knit. Row 63: Rep Row 7 – 153 sts. Bind off. FINISHING

Weave in ends.

k = knit k2tog = knit 2 stitches together rep = repeat RS = right side st(s) = stitch(es) WS = wrong side
